- I. President Horace Cole called the meeting to order at 7:43 p.m. and led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance. Secretary, Patricia Rosado called the roll.

## V. APPROVAL OF MINUTES AND AGENDA

### ACTION BY THE BOARD:

Motion was made by Douglas Freeman to approve the minutes for the meeting of July 19, 2010, (pages 1-29), and this agenda for August 16, 2010 (pages 1-48), as submitted, with the Board of Education reserving the right to add to the agenda, and take further action on any items raised in executive session where immediate action on such items is considered to be in the best interest of the District. Motion was seconded by William Searfoss and passed 6-2-0. Robert Gress and Audrey Hocker abstained.

VI. **ANNOUNCEMENT OF EXECUTIVE SESSION** -- An executive session was held this evening before this meeting at 6:00 p.m. for the purpose of discussing personnel, litigation, and negotiations.

#### VII. ANNOUNCEMENTS BY THE BOARD

A. Mr. Freeman announced that today is Mr. Brunkard's birthday and everyone wished him a "Happy Birthday."

## VIII. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- A. Mr. Freeman stated that the Monroe Career & Technical Institute meeting was very short and not much was discussed.
- B. Ms. Hocker stated that there was no Colonial IU 20 meeting in July because they are given one month off.

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C. Mrs. Bader stated that the East Stroudsburg Area School District was fortunate enough to be awarded Qualified School Construction Bond (QSCB) funds and Jamie Doyle is here to discuss the QSCB Program and the financing. She stated that Ms. Doyle will also describe the agenda item for approval.

Ms. Jamie Doyle, Public Financial Management, stated that the QSCB program is substantially identical to how she has described it in prior meetings. She stated that, most importantly, it is a big accomplishment to be allocated the \$1,220,000.00 for the J. T. Lambert roof replacement that PDE has allocated to the school district. Ms. Doyle stated that the mechanics of this program are such that the district will pay a taxable rate of interest which will be determined at the time of pricing (some time in September). She stated that, in return, we will receive a direct subsidy from the Federal Government shortly after we make that payment. Ms. Doyle stated that the subsidy is expected to cover 85%-100% of the taxable interest rate that we will pay; therefore, they are calling these virtually interest free. Ms. Doyle stated that the State Public School Building Authority will be the conduit issuer of these Qualifying School Construction Bonds. She stated that to qualify to participate in this first round of issuance, we need to have 10% on the contract within six months and 100% spent within three years. Ms. Doyle stated that the maximum length of the payback schedule would be determined at the time of pricing. She stated that the Treasury sets the maximum maturity each month and, currently, it is 17 years. Ms. Doyle stated that it will reset again in September. She stated that it has fluctuated between 14-17 years. Ms. Doyle stated that this is another component that we will be able to carve in stone once we have the actual pricing. She stated that another variable is that we will be making principal sinking fund deposits with Wells Fargo, Trustee. Ms. Doyle stated that this is a little bit different than other bond issues because the end investor will be paid back all at one time as a bullet maturity in the final maturity. She stated that we will be making sinking fund payments along the way in order to satisfy the requirements of the Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED). Ms. Doyle stated that one small deviation from what she told the Board the last time was that the sinking fund will be invested. She stated that she originally was told by the program that we will know this investment rate by the time of pricing but they announced, on a call last Tuesday, that the rate will be locked in some time between closing and September 1, 2011 because no one is going to make a sinking fund deposit until September 1, 2011. Ms. Doyle stated that it is not a big change but she wanted to mention it to the Board. She stated that, just as a point of information, the 46 different school districts that qualified for the QSCB, roughly 30 of them intend to participate in the first tranche which could be as big as \$320,000,000; therefore, there is a lot of interest in participating in this first round of borrowing. Ms. Doyle stated that they are here tonight asking the Board to consider what is called a Parameters Resolution on the borrowing as are the other 29 school districts that are participating in tranche 1. She stated that this Parameters Resolution will be filed with DCED and Mr. Wood will speak on it tonight. Ms. Doyle stated that this will be the last step that is required before they can start the process with the credit rating agencies and prepare the preliminary official statement that will encompass all 30 districts that are participating. She stated that the timeline is much like she previously described to the Board. Ms. Doyle stated that they expect to actually price the QSCB's in late September and close around October 1. She stated that the district will receive their money thereabouts October 1<sup>st</sup>. She stated that there is a schedule on page 3 of her handout that Citibank, lead underwriter, put together which looks similar to hers. Ms. Doyle stated that their assumptions are a little bit different than what she had shown the Board previously; but, you can see the actual mechanics on how it works. She stated that column two has the \$1,220,000 that the district has been allocated. Ms. Doyle stated that the end investor, we are assuming, gets this back all at one time in year 17 in this example. She stated that column 3 is the taxable rate which is 6.5%. Ms. Doyle stated that column 5 is the federal subsidy which the district gets back and Citibank is assuming is 5.5%. She stated that the district would pay net 1 percent interest in this example. Ms. Doyle stated that column 7 has the sinking funds deposits she described. She stated that ultimately in the year 17, you have deposited the equivalent of \$1,220,000. Ms. Doyle stated that in column 8 is the investment of those sinking fund deposits which will not be locked in until sometime next year, so that we can earn interest on that sinking fund. Ms. Doyle stated that ultimately at the end of the day if you look at column 14, it is what we will pay back in principal. She stated that if there is an interest component, it will be less than the face value than what we are borrowing. Ms. Doyle stated that this is one of the few times that we are going to be able to borrow money and pay less than what we borrow. She stated that it is because of the federal subsidy and the earnings we will accumulate in the sinking funds that will be used to offset the principal payments. Ms. Doyle stated that the last page is the parameter schedule which is in the amount of the \$1,500, 384.56. She stated that we will never, under any circumstances, issue more than the \$1,220,000 that the district was allocated but everyone needs to pass a parameter schedule so that they can resize once they know the rate, final maturity and answers to all the variables to resize this to keep the district in compliance with DCED and the State law. Ms. Doyle stated that she appreciates all the assistance she received from administration, the solicitor and bond counsel in allowing us to reach this point on a relatively short timeline.

Mr. Dick Wood stated that the Board has a resolution that is required to be adopted pursuant to the Local Government Unit Debt Act. He stated that even though it is a federal borrowing program, your borrowing is still

governed by the provisions of State law. Mr. Wood stated, as Ms. Doyle indicated, this is a Parameters Resolution. He stated that the district will be authorized to incur the indebtedness in the amount of \$1,500,384.56. Mr. Wood stated that, prior to settlement, it will be adjusted downward and, in no event, will it be more than \$1,220,000.00, which we have allocated to the district. Mr. Wood stated that the State law does require that we set forth a maximum interest rate, which has been set forth as 8%, as indicated in the resolution. He stated that the resolution has included, as exhibits, a copy of the note purchase agreement which is on file with the secretary of the Board that has been executed by the State Public School Building Authority and will be executed by the Board should we decide to proceed this evening. Mr. Wood stated that it also contained a draft copy of the loan agreement that will memorialize the loan from the State Public School Building Authority to the school district. He stated that the notice of your intent to adopt this resolution was available for inspection in the office of the secretary of the Board as required by State law. He stated that all documents that are presented to the Board this evening for approval, including all exhibits, have been reviewed by our solicitor as well as their firm.

D. Mr. James Shearouse stated that the Middle Smithfield Elementary project continues to be on track and they anticipate having all children in all newly renovated classrooms at the start of school. He stated that there will be exterior activities still going on but the classroom area will be utilized by the students, which a very good thing because they were running "nip and tuck".

Mr. Shearouse stated that they had a meeting this morning regarding High School South to go over the final punch list. He stated that all the interior work should be done this week and all exterior work should be done within the next three weeks.

Mr. Searfoss asked if they have looked around the sidewalks. He stated that he has seen various cracks in the stadium and other areas. Mr. Shearouse stated that they have replaced numerous sidewalks and there are still some curbs and sidewalks that they need to do now that they are back with their outside punch list.

Mr. Gress asked for the list of items on the punch list. He stated there are guardrails missing in numerous places, wooden stuff is cracked and there is a big chunk of cement in the driveway. Mr. Shearouse stated that the guardrails are not in the punch list because they are all in place. Mr. Gress asked if even the new ones are in place. Mr. Shearouse stated that they were.

Mr. Gress stated that he had emailed Mrs. Laverdure about the signs that were ordered for new directional things. Mrs. Laverdure stated that she has information for him on that. She stated that Mr. Brown took care of that based on the fact that, once the signage was done by the scope of the project, there were still a lot of questions from some who did not know where to go. Mrs. Laverdure stated that Mr. Brown matched up the signs, like they have up North, and created purple and white ones and put signage in particular places where there was confusion. She stated that he tried to take information he received and put the signs in those locations. Mrs. Laverdure stated that, regarding the other question, Mr. Brown felt that using the word pool was more in tune with what people were used to than the other word. Mr. Gress stated that he personally thinks the signs look terrible as well as other people he has talked to. He stated that he thinks they look terrible and are confusing because now you are looking at two sets of different signs. Mr. Gress stated that the word pool is not used in other schools but natatorium. He stated that he never knew what a natatorium was until he went to swimming events at other schools. Mr. Gress stated that everyone else has natatorium and we have pool. He stated that he knows its simple, but meanwhile we put gymnasium not gym and when you pull in, you see fields, not Walker, soccer or baseball, just fields. Mrs. Laverdure stated that the name for each of the fields maybe a topic of discussion down the road. Mr. Gress stated that the walminized thing will not last because in two years they will be twisted and gnarly like any walmanized wood when you put it up. He asked Mr. Shearouse for a copy of the punch list for him to see when he goes around the different places. Mr. Shearouse said there is no problem in getting a copy of the punch list to the Board.

Mr. Freeman asked if there is an update on the solar energy for this building that we discussed a year ago. Mr. Shearouse stated that we did not make the grant. He stated that the grant was not accepted. Mr. Shearouse stated that we are still working with Smart Energy for other alternatives and if a new grant program comes up, we will be on the list.

Mr. Brunkard stated that he has heard comments from several people regarding the grounds. He said that they are asking if the plantings are complete. Mr. Brunkard stated that he does not know what they want because people ask for different things. Mr. Brunkard suggested adding an updated status of the grounds on the punch list. Mr. Shearouse stated that all trees and shrubs were planted. He stated that the lawn has not been accepted by the district anywhere around the building because there is still work to be done. Mr. Shearouse stated that they will be dressing up and adding topsoil and reseeding the entire site.

Mr. Gress asked if paving has been done like on Route 209. Mr. Shearouse stated that Route 209 is complete. Mr. Gress asked if it all has been accepted. Mr. Shearouse stated that it has all been accepted by the Borough and the State.

Mr. Gress asked about the concession stand up North. Mr. Shearouse stated that the concession stand up North is about four weeks behind schedule due to the general contractor's tardiness in ordering the siding and the roof. Mr. Gress said therefore it will not be ready. Mr. Shearouse said it will not be ready for the first football game but it will be ready for the second one.

E. Mrs. Laverdure stated that Mr. Tim Herd, Stroud Region Open Space & Recreation Commission, is here tonight to discuss the item on the agenda. She stated that Mr. Burrus is also here as the Liaison from the district to Stroud Region Open Space in order to answer any questions. Mr. Herd stated that he does not have anything in particular to say other than what he already submitted to the Board. He asked if the Board had any questions.

Mr. Gress said he had questions to the solicitor and had some concerns long term due to the policing and the maintenance of it. Mr. Gress stated that having public access is a concern because when kids are there, police do not patrol it. He stated that he has seen some joggers almost get run over by motorcycles and ATV's and it has happened during soccer games, too. Mr. Gress stated that something needs to be addressed with that. He stated that he is on the East Stroudsburg Recreation Board and, for years, they said they are going to do something. Mr. Gress stated that for 15 years nothing has been done to secure the dike there. He stated that, again, we will have public access so he is more for giving it five years to see if the terms and conditions are met because once we turn it over it is permanent. Mr. Gress stated that the cooperation agreement is a good thing but he has a concern with it being long term; because, historically nothing has been done properly there. He stated that SARP (Stroud Area Regional Police) has cut back; therefore, there is less police patrol and it will be used more and more when kids are in school and after school.

F. Mrs. Laverdure stated that today was the first day of fall sports and everyone was out and about doing what they had to do. She stated that on Saturday, August 21<sup>st</sup> there will be a Summer Festival from 12 noon to 6:00 p.m. on the front lawn of the High School South to benefit the High School South Cavalier band. Mrs. Laverdure stated that on August 23<sup>rd</sup> teacher induction starts and on August 26<sup>th</sup> is the opening day for teachers. She stated that August 31<sup>st</sup> is the first day for students. Mrs. Laverdure stated that there are a lot of events occurring before our next Board meeting and finds it amazing how the summer flew by.

A. Mrs. Meachem stated that, last month, there was a conversation about the concession stand that didn't go well. She stated that she was confused about what was being discussed. Mrs. Meachem asked how many seats are in the south stadium. Mrs. Laverdure said that Mr. Brown is not here tonight to answer that question because he is working on opening day for sports. Mr. Cole stated that we may not have that answer for her tonight but we can get it for her. Mrs. Meachem stated that she was confused when she looked online because, before the meeting, this was not available on the site. She stated that the information shows all kinds of numbers and revenues and she has a lot of questions. Mrs. Meachem stated that one of her questions is that it states that we are going to have 42 events in the stadium but yet 8 events are subtracted. She said she would like to know why these are going to be subtracted. Mrs. Meachem stated that the band, girls' basketball, boys' basketball, wrestling and cheerleading are not part of the overall plan and asked why. Mrs. Laverdure stated that they are going to be part

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of the winter sports concession stand that is held at the gym. Mrs. Meachem stated that the plan states that there are 42 events in the winter but they are subtracting 8 events. She asked why are they being subtracted. Mrs. Laverdure stated that she would need to speak to Ms. Polmounter to see why this happened. Mrs. Laverdure stated that they had meetings to show and balance out when different organizations may be able to work. Mrs. Laverdure asked if they have particular dates on the information. Mrs. Meachem said it does not state any dates but just says 42 events and 8 are being subtracted. Mrs. Meachem stated that the plan states 4 band, 1 girls' basketball, 1 boys' basketball, 1 wrestling and 1 cheerleading events are being subtracted. Mrs. Laverdure stated that she would have to find the answer to her question. Mrs. Meachem stated that the other problem is that the document states that only three sports are going to participate in the sharing of the funds, but at the last meeting, they said all sports will share in it. Mrs. Laverdure stated that more than 3 sports will participate. Mrs. Meachem said that the document does not state that.

Mr. Gress stated that the document is very confusing and he has received numerous emails. He stated that it is totally confusing when looking at what Mrs. Meachem is saying that they are having the 8 events take a cut in concession stand work in the fall. Mr. Gress stated that they have to come up with how many people will be involved in the activities at the stadium. Mrs. Meachem said that it is divided that each athlete incurs a certain amount of money per event so if they are not counted in, how will they be counted. Mr. Gress said that he agrees with Mrs. Meachem because it is totally confusing and he spoke to parents and coaches about it. Mrs. Laverdure asked if what they are looking at is the proposal and the procedures for the concession stand. Mr. Gress stated they are looking at what was given out at last month's meeting. He stated that field hockey used to work 2 football games but now they have to work 17. Mr. Gress stated that they would be lucky if they get the amount of people to work at it. He stated that they may not get the same amount of money they used to. Mrs. Laverdure stated that they can also use students and not just parents to work the concession stand. Mr. Gress stated that they will have to do more work for less money, which he was always told was not a good thing. He stated that they should be making more. Mrs. Laverdure stated that she can have Mrs. Polmounter get back to Mrs. Meachem. Mrs. Meachem stated that she is asking her questions in a public setting because it was discussed in a public setting. Mrs. Meachem stated that when she saw this, she saw why the parents were angry because clearly something is wrong with this; meanwhile, everyone on the Board voted for it. Mr. Brunkard stated that the plan passed by a 3-2 vote. Mr. Gress stated that the North would have to do this too and questioned when; because, this should be done right now. Mrs. Meachem said that what it states is that at no time will all sports be involved in the pie. Mrs. Laverdure stated that she is correct. She stated that the sports that utilize the facilities will be involved but there will be opportunities for those who do not utilize the facilities like the golf team. Mrs. Laverdure stated that when a sport that utilizes the facilities do not want to show up and work the concession stand then we can give opportunities to other clubs. She stated that they will try to spread it out as equally as possible. Mrs. Layerdure stated that on the document that was proposed it says draft on it because it is a work in progress. She stated that we have to work through it the first year and it does not mean that this is something that is etched in stone. Mrs. Laverdure stated that the FBLA kids did a nice job in developing the plan and on how it will work. Mrs. Laverdure stated that an update will be given at a public meeting on how it is going and make adjustments where necessary. Mrs. Meachem asked if parents whose kids do not participate in the stadium will get nothing. She asked if this is what Mrs. Laverdure is telling her. Mrs. Laverdure stated that it may be a possibility. She stated that there are parents of groups of kids that used the stadium up to this year and got nothing but now they are spreading it out with the parents of the organizations that use the stadium. Mrs. Meachem asked how will this show as being equitable since Mr. Brown said that he has to show that everything is equitable. Mrs. Laverdure said we can show that everything is equitable this year based on the organizations that want to participate because not all want to.

B. Mr. Brunkard stated he would like to comment further on what Mrs. Meachem said. He said that the Board had a vote and voted the plan 3-2. He stated that he would like to reinsert his insistence that despite the laudable efforts by the administrators and despite everything, the good intentions that people had in making this changeover, the amount of work was not equal to the task in front of us in making such a drastic change in everything. Mr. Brunkard stated that we did not reach the point where any form of consensus took place prior to the adoption of the standards that we are going forward with. He stated that this should be a watchword for the future, that we need meetings and public input enough and with wide ranging thoughts prior to changing a policy so that it carries forward with success and a wave rather than with a trickle.
