## Types of Questions

The Writing PSSA has both multiple-choice items and open-ended prompts. The multiple-choice items, however, account for a small percentage of the overall writing test. The multiple-choice questions are worth one point and the open-ended prompts are worth 1 to 4 points for the composition score and 1 to 4 points for the conventions score. The writing test includes the following numbers and types of questions:
