IX. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

A. Mr. Douglas Freeman said that at the Monroe Career & Technical Institute (MCTI) meeting they reached an agreement with Dr. Rushton's contract and he will be with MCTI for another three years. They also reviewed the Articles of the Agreement, which will be rewritten as necessary and we will soon get some answers.

- B. Mrs. Eileen Featherman said that there was no Colonial IU 20 meeting this month. The next meeting will be at the end of this month.
- C. Mr. Robert Gress said that Mr. Williams made available to the Board and the public the notes of the Property/Facilities Committee meeting. There are two items on the agenda as a result of the discussions that were had at the Property/Facilities Committee meeting on August 9th. If anyone has a question on the items, they can be answered when they come up for discussion.
- D. Mr. Christopher Brown said that the State Board of Education has formed a committee to hear Porter Township Initiatives' petition. They learned the identities of three members of the State Board who will make up that committee. They also learned that there will be no additional intervening parties. Individuals or groups had the opportunity to make themselves parties to be heard by the State Board but no one took advantage of that. They learned unofficially, at this point, that Wallenpaupack is not taking a position against the East Stroudsburg Area School District (ESASD) meaning it will be Porter Township Initiative vs. ESASD. Wallenpaupack will be there to provide information and assist but will not be against us in Harrisburg.
- E. Mrs. Laverdure said that transportation letters went out for bus routes. Tomorrow morning the elementary teacher assignment letters will go out through the individual buildings. This is later than usual due to registering of students and moving students from building to building due to AYP results that were not received until the beginning of August. Our building principals have been super and she appreciates their support. Teachers have also been fabulous because they understand that shifts in buildings have occurred due to student enrollment numbers.
- F. Mrs. Laverdure asked how we feel about the broadcasting of Board Meetings at alternate locations. Mr. Baker said on average, they had about eight people attend Middle Smithfield Elementary. Mrs. James asked how much does it cost. Mr. Borosh said that the cost would be the salary for one of his ITEC personnel and security personnel. Mr. Borosh said it cost more when we have meetings up North. Mr. Horton said that is a good idea to try it out but with that kind of turnout is it worth it? Mrs. Laverdure said when we were up North, there was a better turnout at the Administration Center. Mrs. Hopkins said there were at least 30 people and probably 8-10 administrators. Mrs. James said it is important to include North and \$200 is not that much of an expense. Mrs. Laverdure said it's always important to include North. The compromise would be to have the site to be Middle Smithfield Elementary to cover the northern tier since it is more expensive to go to the North Campus. Mr. Bradley said he got positive feedback from having meetings up North and it is important to continue having them. Mr. Horton said he lives up North and he thinks it's fair to have the meetings at Middle Smithfield Elementary. Mrs. Laverdure asked if it would cost the same to set up at Middle Smithfield Elementary as it would cost to set up at the North Campus. Mr. Borosh said it would cost two hours less at Middle Smithfield Elementary. Mr. Horton said going up North you don't have that many people that are close to there because many kids in the Middle Smithfield Elementary area go up North. Mr. Cooke said we are not debating whether to hold it up North but whether to have a broadcasting alternate location. Mrs. Laverdure said the next meeting is at the North Campus so do we want to continue the alternate site here for the next meeting. Mr. Cooke said to continue it and then we will see after the fall how many people attended to see if it is worthwhile.

X. **PUBLIC PARTICIPATION** -- Federal Programs

Title I Title VI Other Concerns

- A. Mr. Ray White read his comments about a remark that was made at the July Board meeting from one Board member to and about a fellow Board member.
- B. Ms. Sharon Maly-Cramer brought her concerns about the lease agreement that was made between the East Stroudsburg Area School District and KidsPeace and asked for any updates. Mr. Dirvonas said that he has exchanged communication with KidsPeace. He expects to have final approval by this Friday. Ms. Maly-Cramer asked if security issues will be spelled out and discussed with the parents. Mrs. Laverdure said that we will add security to the contract and this may change the date of the contract to be finalized. Mrs. Laverdure said they have spoken to Mr. Burrus to make sure there is an administrator at Smithfield Elementary every day when the contract goes into effect. Ms. Sharon Maly-Cramer asked if the roof at J. M Hill is completed. Mr. Shearouse said it will be completed this week.

- C. Mr. Michael Perez said he spoke to Mrs. Laverdure about KidsPeace being at Smithfield Elementary. He has concerns about the type of children that will be serviced at KidsPeace at Smithfield Elementary. He asked what have we done to address the issues with these types of children other than this locked keypad. Mrs. Laverdure said it's a locked door and the adult to student ratio is different. There is a full time psychologist, full time Administrator and therapeutic staff. Mr. Perez said he has concerns with the adult children in an elementary setting. Mr. Horton asked if we have talked to KidsPeace as far as the children they are servicing. Mr. Dirvonas said he has not. Mr. Horton suggested talking to them about those types of offenses. Mr. Horton said he has had a positive experience with these children in helping them get clothes that they need. He has helped kids of this nature and sees them benefiting by getting the help that they need. Mr. Perez has valid concerns but when you see these kids you see that they have minimal needs. Mr. Perez said K-5th grade is the appropriate age but over that age it is not and we have no guaranty of the population they serve. Mr. Horton asked Mr. Dirvonas to start a dialog as to exactly what they will serve. Mrs. Laverdure said they told us there will be 12-15 students to start.
- D. Ms. Anne Power said that she does not begrudge the kids at KidsPeace in getting the help that they need but all it takes is one child to get out and get into trouble. How will the district protect the children that are playing outside? She said that this may be an insurance issue to house these kids in our school. She suggested that the district have security measures and she would like to see what they are. She does not think the \$48,000 is worth it; so if this is what it has come to then they should close the school.
- E. Ms. Yvette Keitt said Pat Mulroy, former H.S. North Principal, who was employed by the Bangor School District, is no longer employed by them so she is available to come and help the school district at a lower salary. Therefore, the district should employ her to help while Mrs. Krotowski is out serving her country.
