IX. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- A. Mr. Freeman said that at the Monroe Career & Technical Institute meeting they tweaked the Articles of Agreement and everyone should have received a copy. They are progressing greatly and looks like it will be going through. Mr. Freeman said that they were given information about the NOCTI scores and our students did great. Mrs. Laverdure said that the Board members received the students' scores at their places tonight. These students are not here tonight but we can honor them in the future.
- B. Ms. Eileen Featherman said that she handed out the Colonial IU 20 Newsletter. The Colonial IU 20 meeting is this coming Wednesday (5/22/13). They are still negotiating with teachers and support staff.
- C. Mr. Robert Gress said that their Property/Facilities Committee meeting was on Thursday night (5/16/13). They finalized the budget for the capital reserve fund, which is on the agenda. One item that is also on the agenda is the lowest bid for the refinishing of the H.S. North gymnasium. They also discussed various projects like the J. T. Lambert sidewalks. He thanked the parents who got the Middle Smithfield little league field dugouts and concession stand. Minor costs were incurred to the district thanks to Jim Shearouse and his staff. He said Kyle O'Connell will be presenting his Eagle Scout Project to the Board for their recommendation. The next meeting will not be until August 15, 2013 at 5:30 p.m. in the Administration Center. If anyone has questions, please let him know.

Mrs. Laverdure said that Kyle is working on his Eagle Scout Project and he came to see Mrs. Laverdure. He has an idea and they brainstormed and now he is here to explain his project. Kyle read the Eagle Scout requirement for rank #5 for his service project. He said he is here to give a proposal and hopes it will be passed. It will be a four-sided Kiosk for the Administration Center which will be located on the right side of the front door. It will be 5x5 in area and stand 8 feet tall. It will be able to tell the community all events and schedules for all schools in the district. He has drawings of how it will look. He will show leadership by planning out all details. The project will be done over the summer in a timely manner. He will fundraise to get materials that are needed. Plexi glass will be used to prevent vandalism and the keys will be left in the district's hands. Permits will be obtained by the Borough of East Stroudsburg. He was told there are no regulations for putting the Kiosk underground but he will place it under with two feet of lumber so it can withstand storms. It will be wood stained to prevent damage from the rain. He has project phases planned out. He will educate volunteers on how to use tools to prevent any unsafe conditions. He will map out the plans and bring them to Mrs. Laverdure. Mr. Gress said that his concerns are to make sure that the East Stroudsburg Borough approves the project and that we have a copy of the final designs to make sure it matches with the building. Mrs. Laverdure said once he has the plans he can bring them to her so she can forward them to the Board. Mr. Horton asked if he has enlisted the help of a shop teacher just for safety reasons. Kyle said that a former Scoutmaster who runs a business with tools will help him out. Mr. Freeman asked if the Boy Scouts have insurance to cover those who will be working with the tools. Kyle said they have insurance and it covers the use of tools. Mr. Freeman asked him to give a copy of the insurance to Mrs. Laverdure for our records. Mr. Searfoss said that he has a well-organized and thought out project. Mr. Gress said that they will need a motion on the agenda tonight to vote on this project. Mrs. Laverdure asked if he needs any paperwork approving his project. Kyle said that he has a paper for the Board President to sign if/when the project is approved.

- D. Mr. Michael Meachem said that as chairperson of the Budget Advisory Committee, he would like to extend a heartfelt thanks to the building principals, Department Directors, Superintendent, Mrs. Laverdure, Assistant Superintendent, Mrs. Duggins and Business Manager, Mr. Bader. On behalf of Mr. Bradley, Mr. Gress, Mrs. James and himself, they are pleased to announce this evening that they present a proposed final budget with no impact on educational standards, no loss of positions and a 0% tax increase to the taxpayers of the East Stroudsburg Area School District. Although it was an arduous process and they had many discussions, they are pleased with all the cooperation and they offer the budget to the full Board for consideration this evening.
- E. Mr. Tom Dirvonas said that the Porter Township Initiative hearing was held in the High School North library last Thursday and Friday (May 16 & 17). They spent a day and a half before the State Board of Education. The

- parties involved presented their information by way of testimony and written exhibits. He is expecting a final determination from the State Board of Education probably in September. He anticipates receiving a transcript in about two weeks. Once he has it, he will make it available to the public for those that were not able to attend.
- F. Mrs. Irene Duggins congratulated Mrs. Livingston and Mrs. Lopez, (4th grade teacher) for receiving the Colonial IU 20 Excellence in Education Award, Crystal Award, for their Wake Up ESE along with her students in the Broadcast Club. Mrs. Lopez thanked the parents for bringing their children early to be part of this club and congratulated her students. Mrs. Laverdure thanked the families for coming tonight.
- G. Mrs. Duggins congratulated Mr. Lazowski, Mr. Lowris, (Technology Education teachers at Lehman Intermediate) and their students for their participation in the Greater Philadelphia Sea Perch Challenge. This is part of the Robotics Curriculum that the Board recently approved. A few years ago there was also an MOU (Memorandum of Understanding) with Picatinny to work on STEM activities in Robotics. Mr. Lowris said that he and Mr. Lazowski are proud to announce that they are overall champions of the Greater Philadelphia Sea Perch Challenge. They would have liked to have their whole design team here tonight but they are in Washington D.C. They presented an award to Jessica Geiger, one of the team leaders. Mr. Lowris thanked Mr. Lazowski who started this program and brought him on board. He also thanked the School Board and especially Mrs. Duggins who has been working with Robotics for a couple of years. Mrs. Laverdure said that although they have previously been working on Robotics, this is their first time competing. They received an award for first place. A video on engineering was presented. The video explained that the Sea Perch is an innovative Robotic underwater program, where students (girls and boys) build a robotic underwater remotely-operated vehicle. Mr. Lowris said the video explained the program and to win a competition like that shows that East Stroudsburg Area School District is doing well. He thanked all teachers, students and parents for their participation and efforts. Mr. Horton said one great thing was that our district beat the Charter schools that competed.
- H. Mrs. Irene Duggins congratulated and presented a certificate to the Keystone Digital Book Report Regional winners. Arlene Kirkwood, Catherine Kutteroff and Laura Witcraft. Ms. Kirkwood said that a digital book report is a way to showcase students' learning. A digital book report is using a green screen and then putting pictures behind it. When production is finished it appears like the students are actually in that location. Fifth grade students from Smithfield Elementary were also present and acknowledged for winning third place in the 5th/6th grade category. First place winners were 6th grade J. T. Lambert students. Mrs. Witcraft spoke on behalf of Lehman Intermediate and J. T. Lambert Intermediate. She said the students started working with this project in 5th grade. She thanked the School Board for allowing them to have the technology needed for this competition. She thanked Mrs. Langan and Mr. Martin, Instructional Technology Coaches, for their help. The students did not use the green screening process but used still images and incorporated it into the students' understanding the tone of the book report. Two hundred students participated from all levels of learning. Students could not be present tonight but will be given their certificates at their schools. Mrs. James said this is so refreshing because she's heard comments that teachers just teach to test. She is proud to see the wonderful activities that the students are utilizing to learn reading, math and science. She said she is proud of their accomplishments. A video of the students' work was presented for viewing.
- I. Mrs. Laverdure said that the NOCTI tests are industry standard tests from Monroe Career & Technical Institute (MCTI). This is one alternate test that our State recognizes for high achieving high schools. Although none of the students are present tonight, we are seeing great success with MCTI students. At High School South, 45 seniors took the test and 30 scored advanced, 12 scored competent, 2 scored basic and 1 test still needs to be reviewed. At High School North, we had 13 seniors who took the test and 10 scored advanced and 3 scored competent. The advanced and competent students are industry ready when they graduate. She congratulated all of the students on their achievement.
- J. Mrs. Laverdure stated that at the December 2012 Reorganization Meeting the Reorganization meeting for December 2, 2013 was scheduled on a Holiday and the district is closed. She asked the Board members if they would like to have this date changed and can place this item on the June 17th Board agenda. Mr. Dirvonas clarified that the Reorganization meeting has to take place during the first week of December and not necessarily on a Monday. Mrs. Laverdure said she will place the new date of December 3, 2013 for consideration by the Board.
- K. Mrs. Laverdure said that this is the 3rd month in a row that there have not been any public participants at High School North, except for our valuable administrators. Mr. Horton said that this is costing our district money and we have no participation. Mr. Searfoss said that summer is also not worth it since the buildings are not fully occupied. Mrs. Laverdure said she was not sure if it would need to be readvertised. Mr. Dirvonas said that the

- meetings would need to be readvertised stating that there will be no North broadcasting since they were advertised as such. Mr. Searfoss said we can always revisit this issue in the future.
- L. Mrs. Laverdure said that High School South had quite an honor. Mr. Catrillo, Principal, said that about two weeks ago, High School South was selected by US News and World Report as the best American high school winner at the bronze level. There are about 45,000 schools considered. This is based on the analysis of our test scores. Unlike the State, they do a thorough analysis of the test scores to see growth and review the sub groups. Another category is college readiness as well as other areas. We are the only school in Monroe County to be selected. They will be getting a color banner and they will be able to use the emblem on their letterhead for one year. Mrs. James asked if this can be placed in the paper. Mr. Catrillo said he will be sending out a press release. Mrs. James said we, the Board members, are privileged to see all the accomplishments tonight. Mr. Catrillo said he will prepare and hopes to receive the gold soon.

- A. Mrs. Meachem said that on the agenda she noticed that the supplemental materials listed have current copyright dates except for Interactive Read Aloud Series I which is from 2007 and asked why the date is so much older than the others. Mrs. Duggins said that the Read Aloud materials are like any stories and stories don't change; therefore, the material is current. Mrs. Meachem asked if this copyright date follows our copyright policy that states that the material has to be a certain amount of years. Mrs. Duggins said this is supplemental material and not core so it does not violate our policy.
- B. Mr. Matthew Bird said he is here representing the graduating Class of 2013. He said that the Class of 2013 would prefer for the graduation to be held outside and has a petition of 227 signatures of graduating students that share the same sentiment. Every graduating class had a choice and this was taken away from them. The majority of his class voted to go outside but this was changed. He understands that weather determines where they graduate but they should be given the chance to be the first to graduate on the new turf.
- C. Ms. Alissa Poster said that she is part of the senior graduating class. They have been waiting many years for this moment; and as seniors, they have a voice that they are deciding to use. She spoke about reaching their goal to graduate and are using their voice to ask for graduation to be outside. Inside graduation may cause many issues, one may be that not all family members will be able to attend in the gym and it's not fair for them to have to choose; because, it is a day for their family members too. This is a moment that they cannot change, will always remember and they want to remember it outside.
- D. Mr. Justin Smith said to be the first class to have the opportunity to graduate on the new turf would be a great honor and as part of the class of 2013 they would be extremely grateful.
 - Mr. Horton asked how many signatures they obtained. They said 227. Mr. Horton asked how many students are in the graduating class? There are about 400. Mr. Horton said this is more than 50%. Alissa said that they had a meeting with the senior class and almost everyone had their hands up to have graduation outside. This should not be an issue and they should attempt to have it outside. Mrs. Laverdure asked how was the petition circulated. Alissa said two students went around and got as many signatures as they can get. (Alissa handed the petition to Mrs. Laverdure).
- E. Ms. Colette Gress said she did not sign the petition. She is a class officer and knows that the other officers agree that graduation should be held inside. They spoke to Mr. Silvoy, who does a wonderful job, and it would be easier to have it set up in just one place. Outside is hot and on the turf is even hotter. Other issues might be that the sound is not good. Mrs. Laverdure asked if all officers had an opportunity to sign the petition and they did not. Colette said they had the opportunity and they did not sign it. Mrs. Laverdure thanked the students who spoke for being courageous in bringing this issue to their attention. Mr. Horton said both sides bring good points but it does get hot outside and there are other issues to think about. Mrs. Laverdure said that the students may not realize that this is the first opportunity for them to graduate on the turf. Mr. Shearouse said they set up on the turf but it was rained out. Mrs. Laverdure said we have never experienced graduation on the turf and you need to understand that the heat index on turf field is different than on the grass field. Mr. Gress said that he went by this evening and put a thermometer on the field for 10 minutes and it read 97°. He said it is terrible when we have to rush inside. Also, the sound system is terrible outside, especially if it is windy. Parents will have to look at students' backs. It should be in the gym because we built it for this purpose. It should be one place or the other because it is not fair to rush it inside at the last minute.

- F. Ms. Alesandra Castellanos said last year she experienced an indoor graduation. It was very crammed inside of the gym and hot. You can't determine what the weather will be on June 14th compared to today. Last year, it was supposed to be outside but it was brought indoors. She said they should get the same chance, so her family can be altogether and not separated in the gym and auditorium.
- G. Mr. Bradley said that the students should be able to make the decision; therefore, if they have to do a recount then they should do that and let them make the decision
 - Mr. Catrillo said there are other things to consider and he will agree with the Board with whatever decision they make. He said that last month the Board voted to have graduation inside and the tickets were already printed. Matthew Haberle, who chairs the graduation committee along with 20 other students, came to speak about the issue last month. Mr. Catrillo said that none of the students who spoke tonight are on the committee to present their opinion or to help with the preparations. He said contracts have been signed and chairs have been ordered. A committee of students are already working on an inside graduation.
- H. Mr. Gress asked if we can open the agenda at this time for the consideration of the Eagle Scout Project. Mr. Dirvonas said we need 6 votes in order for it to pass.
