IV. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

ACTION BY THE BOARD:

Motion was made by Robert Cooke to approve the minutes for the meetings of April 6, 2016, (pages 1) and April 18, 2016, (pages 1-28), with a revision. Motion was seconded by Debbie Kulick and carried unanimously, 9-0.

V. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

ACTION BY THE BOARD:

Motion was made by Robert Huffman to approve this agenda for May 16, 2016, (pages 1-23), as submitted, with the Board of Education reserving the right to add to the agenda, and take further action on any items raised in executive session where immediate action on such items is considered to be in the best interest of the District. Motion was seconded by Lisa VanWhy and carried unanimously, 9-0.

VI. ANNOUNCEMENT OF EXECUTIVE SESSION -- An executive session was held this evening at 6:00 p.m. before this meeting for the purpose of discussing personnel, negotiations and litigation.

VII. ANNOUNCEMENTS BY THE BOARD

- A. Ms. VanWhy said she attended the Art Show and Talent Show at High School South and there are many talented students in this district.
- B. Mr. Bradley said that East Stroudsburg Elementary School had an affair last week that was attended by several Board members. It was a fantastic and rewarding event. Also, East Stroudsburg Elementary School received a reward from Achieve 3000 for having top honors over the States of New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania. East Stroudsburg Elementary School also received Tiers 1 and 2 for their School-wide Positive Behavior Support Program, which was the only school in the district to receive this recognition. He said they are doing well and wished them continued success. Mrs. Laverdure said she has this announcement as part of her report that she will address later on.
- C. Ms. Kulick said she also attended East Stroudsburg Elementary School's event last week and it was fantastic. In addition, she attended Resica Elementary's Celebration of the Arts which was also excellent.

VIII. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

A. Mr. Robert Huffman said that the Monroe Career & Technical Institute (MCTI) JOC meeting was held on May2nd. It was a short and quick meeting; therefore, not much to report.

Mrs. Laverdure said present at our meeting tonight, we have a student from Monroe Career & Technical Institute, Miss Alissa Morales-Diaz.

Alissa said she is finishing 9th grade at MCTI in the Criminal Justice Program, which she worked hard to get into this competitive program. Over the past year, she has been involved in the Governance Stem Competition, spoke at a MCTI JOC meeting, MCTI Art Show, Girls World Expo, Rotary Dinner through Interact Club, where she is one of the Officers, went to the Capitol on a field trip, and obtained her Hazmat Certification through the Law Enforcement Program. She has excelled academically as well as a person. MCTI helped her broaden her horizons. She does not know exactly what she plans to do yet, but MCTI helped her to get to where she is today. She thanked the Board and all who have helped her and supported her to get where she is today.

- B. Mr. Robert Huffman said that the Director of Colonial IU 20, Charlene Brennan, has been working about half a year without an assistant because the assistant has been out due to illness. Now, Dr. Brennan hired Chris Fisher, who worked with us previously, to assist her for a couple of months.
- C. Mr. Wayne Rohner said that the Property/Facilities Committee met on May 5th and discussed the following items:
 - 1. They are looking at a proposal from Miller flooring under the Keystone Purchasing Network for repairs/replacement of the H.S. South's Auxiliary gym floor.
 - 2. They received drawings and an operating manual from Strunk Albert Engineering for the J. T. Lambert HVAC Project.
 - 3. The recommendation for the items under the five-year plan was to accept the proposal from D'Huy Engineering to investigate the humidity issue in the High School North gym.
 - 4. The Committee accepted a proposal from D'Huy Engineering to investigate the atrium roof leaks at Resica Elementary and Bushkill Elementary.
 - 5. Also, working with D'Huy Engineering for the architectural drawings for the roofing design and warranty information for Resica Elementary.
 - 6. Seeking bids to continue mold remediation cleanup for Middle Smithfield Elementary. At this time, he said he is recommending that the Board members hire a special Solicitor to pursue a lawsuit to reimburse the School District for the money that was spent on the emergency roof repair and mold clean up. This investigation will determine, because he is alleging that the Middle Smithfield Township Supervisors, violated their oath of office in 2012 and should be held accountable for their poor decision and involvement in this school addition.
 - 7. Finally a recommendation was made to accept, at no cost, the proposal from Paul Davis Emergency Services for the mold remediation cleanup of the plenum area at Resica Elementary School.

- Mr. Bradley asked Mr. Bader if we received feedback on the asbestos situation. Mr. Bader asked if Mr. Bradley is referring to the auxiliary gym floor. Mr. Bradley said he is. Mr. Bader said he believes it was determined that there is asbestos so they are investigating the best way to handle the problem. This will be handled in June.
- D. Mr. Gary Summers said that the Finance Committee met on May 9th. Many items discussed are on the agenda tonight. They spent quite a bit of time with Mr. Borosh regarding the annual technology requirements. More discussion will be held at the June meeting. He said at Mr. Gress' request, the Committee asked Chief Mill for information to be provided on what the cost would be if the district were to add School Police Officers. Chief Mill presented several options. There is an item on the agenda for consideration. The Committee also had an update on next year's budget from Mr. Bader and all Property/Facilities Committee items that need to move forward are on the agenda tonight.
- E. Mrs. Judy Summers said that the Policy Review Committee met this evening and have recommended that Administration post the following policies for public review during the month of May and subsequent Board action in June:
 - 1. Repeal Policy 202.1 and incorporate language from 202.1 into Policy 202. Policy 202 will now be entitled "Attendance Eligibility" and will include eligibility guidelines for both resident and non-resident students.
 - 2. Policy 239 Foreign Exchange Policy.

Also, on the agenda for final Board approval this evening are:

- 1. Policy 115 Career & Technical Education
- 2. Policy 124 Tuition-Based Summer Cyber Academy
- F. Miss Nadia Hussein, Student Board Representative for H.S. South said they had two Casual for a Cause Days to raise funds for the ALS (Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis) Foundation and for Awesome (a pet shelter in town). H.S. South had their National Honor Society Induction for a group of juniors and seniors who are dedicated to service and giving back to the community. Graduating seniors were recognized for years of service and juniors were inducted. They also had a successful senior prom in Stokesay Castle located in Reading, PA. The Special Gala took place for the special needs students, which received great support. There was an Art Show to exhibit students' work. High School South hosted the Annual Special Olympics events with students from around the area who participated in full-day athletic events for our Special Olympians. The Aevidum Group, which in Latin means, I got your back, who promotes peer connectedness and acceptance went recently on a trip to Stoney Acres. Students received a PBS lesson on school safety. District Police Officers taught about school safety in different every day cases and in emergency situations. The Gender Study Class had a presentation at the Pocono Community Theater and discussed mental health awareness for teens in our community. The Annual block party which is hosted by the Sports Management Class will take place next Wednesday full of fun and games and good food. This has been a good year for High School South.

Mrs. Laverdure thanked Kenny Casals for being a Student Board Representative, since today will be his last presentation as a senior and he will be graduating soon. Mr. Kenny Casals, Student Board Representative for H.S. North said the Math Competition Team finished third in the State with Bejan Gonsalves finishing 2nd and Geoffrey Zhang finishing 23rd. Donald LeCompte successfully ran for the DECA International President. On May 10th Mr. Ware's English class attended the Holocaust Symposium at Marywood College. They worked in small groups and spoke with Holocaust survivors. It was a great experience for all. Seniors participated in a Reality Fair hosted by NEPA Credit Union in promotion for Financial Literacy. Students were given different careers and booths were set up in the gym that dealt with housing, utilities and how to budget your finances. Key and Leo Club conducted a fundraiser for Cancer Research where students paid \$1 to splash out Mr. Zall. They raised \$128. H.S. North had their prom at the Radisson Hotel in Scranton. Mrs. Laverdure said that Kenny will be recognized at the Senior Awards to thank him for the work he has done on the Board.

G. Donald LeCompte said he is here to talk about DECA. DECA is an Association of emerging leaders and entrepreneurs who are preparing for careers in the fields of marketing, finance, hospitality and management. With the use of extensive leadership training and competitive events, DECA has created a comprehensive learning program which integrates into classroom instruction, applies to learning, connects to business and promotes competition. Through opportunities that have been provided by North and South Administrators and advisors, Jenny Bogart and Karen Peters, students in East Stroudsburg Area School District have been able to take part in the program for the past seven years. He is here today not only as a Representative of the Chapter but also the previous Chapter President, former State President of Pennsylvania and now the newly elected International President for the organization. Thanks to the support of Mrs. Laverdure and others in the district, he was able to

run a successful campaign in Nashville, Tennessee. For the next year, he will be the Lead Student Representative for the 220,000 members of this worldwide organization. He will travel the country giving speeches and running workshops. He thanked everyone for their support.

Genevieve Martinelli said she is next year's Vice President of DECA. Here in the East Stroudsburg Area School District, there are 80 total DECA members from North and South. They learn skills which help them become actively prepared, community-oriented, professionally-responsible and experienced leaders. By attending multiple conferences throughout the year, they are able to gain many business skills and make connections that will help them in the future. At the State conference, they compete against over 2000 students across the State. DECA members also attended workshops where they learned new leadership skills. This year they had 12 students that placed at States. At the International Career Development Conference, they had the ability to network with nearly 18,000 members and business professionals from around the world. Six students attended the conference in Nashville, TN. Some competed, others attended the leadership academies.

Leah Jardel, High School South Freshman, said is she is the Chapter Vice President of Marketing for the upcoming year. Leah said she competes in the Sports Entertainment Marketing Series event which is for individual roll playing where you go before a judge and talk with him. DECA has various opportunities to compete. If you do not want to compete by yourself, you can prepare a case study, which is a team decision and in a group or you can write a paper and go before the judge to give your presentation. In DECA, it is evident that you gain a lot of skills that are going to help you have a bright and successful future, whether you compete in Retail Merchandising or in Travel and Tourism. You use Time Management Skills at the competitions but also in life. It helps you be leader, expand your network and improve your public speaking skills. Personally, DECA helped her place 1st in the District competition, 3rd in the State. Leah was the first freshmen from East Stroudsburg Area School District to earn a medal in Sport Entertainment Marketing Role Play at the International Career and Development Conference.

Gia Peck said she competed in the Business Services Operations Research, which required a 30-page research paper as well a presentation on a local company on the topic of Employee Engagement within the workplace. She competed with other individuals like herself at the National Level and gained a copious amount of life skills, developed herself as an individual independent leader and obtained an overall valuable experience that will help her the rest of her life. She is truly grateful for this program.

Angela Boasiako said she competed in the Public Speaking event at the State Level. She placed first on her speech that she wrote entitled, "Be Epic", which was this year's topic. At Nationals, Angela got to be part of the leadership conferences. She was also a Social Media Correspondent for the National Life Social Media Team. She was responsible for taking pictures and sharing their experience at Nationals.

Ms. Jenny Bogart said she is an Instructional Aide at H.S. South and one of the DECA Advisors along with Karen Peters. Although she did not compete, but traveled with them. She thanked the Board and Administrators for their support this year and in the past. DECA is a great club, as you heard the student's accomplishments and hopes it can continue.

Ms. Karen Peters said she was asked to take over the DECA Club about 5 years with 20 students. The Club is now in the South and North schools. This Club is something important for the School District to have. They feel that they are making a name for the students and the district, especially with Donald LeCompte's accomplishment. They hope the numbers will go over the 110 students that they currently have. Ms. Peters thanked the Board and Administrators for allowing them to have the DECA Club and hope they can increase numbers in the North school and continue to grow at South to make East Stroudsburg Area School District proud. Mrs. Laverdure thanked them for their work.

Mrs. Laverdure, on behalf of the district, presented Donald LeCompte with a certificate for his accomplishment on becoming the DECA International President. She said Donald is putting college life on hold for a year to pursue a dream come true. Mrs. Laverdure wished him much success.

H. Mr. Jeffrey Bader said that under Act 1, the Board must approve a 2016/17 Proposed Final Budget by the end of May and that information is on the agenda for consideration tonight. On the revenue side, there is a slight reduction of (\$1,156) that we anticipated getting from the State for State Property Tax Reduction which for Homestead/Farmstead exclusion that is seen on the tax bill. There was also a real estate tax collection reduction of (\$2,863). Since there is a reduction in wages in salary, the district estimates that they will get less from the State in Social Security and Retirement reimbursement of about (\$84,970) for total of (\$88,989) on the revenue

side. On the expense side, there is about \$119,000-\$120,000 savings in salaries which reflects three retirees. We don't anticipate having to fill these positions. The district is adjusting stipends for cyber schools. Some course offerings were included in teachers' regular daily schedules. The big change is the 3.5 million dollars adjustments on fringe benefits due to a big change on health insurance. We are underfunding the anticipated cost to the trust. Although there is some risk, we have a substantial amount of reserve in the trust so we can absorb a reduction without putting the district in jeopardy. We will continue to maintain a sizable reserve in the trust. Under Cyber Academy, the proposal that was approved last month, for a new learning management system, did not include one Drivers Education and the district also needs to purchase more computers for Cyber Academy students. Under Administrative Services, there will be a software transition while the new system takes place. In the transition process, the district will need to maintain the current system at a cost of about \$87,000. Under ITEC leases and the budget, the district was able to lower the cost for an approximate savings of \$300,000. Based on bid results, Transportation had fuel savings of \$50,000. There is a total expense adjustments of about a 3.8 million dollars and an overall change in the budget of 3.7 million dollars. The last presentation had a 4.4 million dollar deficit now the deficit is about \$665,000. We are budgeting next year's subsidy at this year's numbers. Once the legislators have a budget and it is approved by the governor, we might see some more money. These figures include a tax rate decrease of 1.50 mils in Monroe County and a tax rate decrease of 2.15 mils in Pike County. This is where we are and will continue to look at it to try to get numbers down until the final budget. The Proposed Final Budget will be posted for public review under the requirements of Act 1.

Mr. Gress asked if Mr. Bader plugged these numbers into the five-year plan that he previously presented. Mr. Bader said he has not updated the five-year plan. Mr. Gress said that we previously took a funding holiday from the reserve and it hurt us. Mr. Bader said he is not sure what happened in the past but he looked at it for this year and so far the reserve is holding steady to get us through this coming year. Mr. Gress asked if the five-year plan will be updated for the next meeting. Mr. Bader said he hopes to have it for the next Finance Committee meeting.

Mrs. Laverdure said that we have an opportunity to be part of a pilot that is going to possibly change the way high schools communicate. Mr. Robert Ferraro, Fusfoo Media (Fusfoo), said the children that spoke at the Board meeting tonight are very talented and put together. He is impressed with how they spoke. He said their network, Fusfoo, will provide an opportunity to talk about extreme talents within their schools. He brought a presentation that included what Fusfoo's National page would look like. They are providing a technology that schools will be able to utilize. It is intended to have video and editorial content. The two types of content on their site include written stories and video content all produced by the students. The high schools will have 100% discretion on what is broadcasted on their channels. The digital network has a unique channel for each high school for interviews and digital short creative student production such as cooking or fashion. The National channel will be producing information as well. The digital channel needs to stay fresh so schools will produce and pull from other schools to share with community. You can all share National stories to keep community members interested. Fusfoo, is a showcase to demonstrate what is occurring in the schools, what students are doing in the schools and outside the four walls. This gives an outlet for the community and alumni to be in touch with what is happening. We have PSBA (Pennsylvania School Boards Association) partnering with Fusfoo to help find 20 schools within the State to be part of this pilot. The East Stroudsburg Area School District has a local person, Don Doll, who brought Mr. Ferraro here tonight. Mr. Ferraro and Mr. Doll have met with seven Superintendents and have follow-up meetings scheduled. This is a Beta program so they bring nominal funds to the district to offset the cost. There is no cost associated to the schools in year one, two, three and four. In each channel, they will have opportunities to raise funds through local dollars. DECA is a great group to potentially raise revenues. Schools are implementing this through either an activity club or incorporating into their curriculum. The district will have opportunities to opt-in to receive advertising dollars from sponsors of our choice. Fusfoo has partnerships from the National level such as Sony Digital and Temple University where they provide content that is exclusive to their network. We hope there will be newsworthy happenings. Students working on it can use this program as part of their portfolio for college or any job seeking. There is zero bullying opportunity on this site to keep it safe for the students. Fusfoo wants content that is positive in order to be distributed on the National level. A lot more items are in the works. Mr. Ferraro said that the Board members received a copy of his presentation. If they have any questions, they can contact him at any time. Fusfoo does not have any schools in the program yet. Mr. Ferraro displayed a video on how the student's information will be displayed. In summary, this program is a platform to showcase every student such as a student that might make YouTube video. The difference is that they will not be able to bully or comment on Fusfoo.

Ms. Kulick said that the program for the pilot is next year. How many schools, locally, are you planning to sign up? Mr. Ferraro said they have met with 7 that we are looking to sign on. They are from New Jersey, New York and Virginia and the limit would be about 30 in total. Ms. Kulick asked when is Fusfoo's deadline. Mr. Ferraro said that they would like to have an answer by sometime in June. Ms. Kulick said she would like to think we

support things that are growth oriented for our students and believes this would be something more cutting edge for them. Ms. Kulick said she would like to hear the DECA students' opinion. Mr. LeCompte, DECA President, said that this would be beneficial to them and any club because other than coming to a Board meeting there is no way to inform the Board and the community on what is going on with DECA or any other club/activity.

Mr. Gress said he believes this is a great program but it should be reviewed with the building Principals and with the curriculum individuals. Mrs. Laverdure said they have met. Mr. Gress said this is good but we should not be voting on it until it goes through the full process. Mrs. Laverdure said she met with Dr. Lesniewski and the leadership at Fusfoo and before that meeting they met with Principals and teachers who are interested. Mr. Gress said it should be placed on the agenda for approval. Mrs. Laverdure said it is on the agenda tonight pending counsel's review of the contract.

Mrs. Summers asked if Fusfoo is headquartered in New York. Mr. Ferraro said they are, although he is from Pennsylvania but they are partnering with a company in New York. Mrs. Summers asked what is the cost to the district. Mr. Ferraro said it does not cost the district any money during year one, two, etc. This year the district will receive \$5,000 to offset the cost.

Mr. Summers asked what specific schools in our district do they plan to work with. Mr. Ferraro said it is for the high schools. Mr. Summers asked if both high schools will be involved. Mr. Summers asked since this year is the pilot year so in June 2017, how will the district determine if it was a success. Mr. Ferraro said it is up to the district to determine if they want to continue. They will see how much can be discovered through this program. If it is unproductive to the district and community, then they can stop. He believes they have many items to report. The morning show that the district currently has may not be interesting to the community but interviews with students that participate in plays, or sport accomplishments or other items that they can highlight would be. Mr. Summers asked how comfortable is the district that the first pilot trial year will not be in conflict with curriculum and efforts going on in the district. Mr. Ferraro this will be to showcase accomplishments and schools have talked about working the program into their curriculum. The backend will provide the district a lot of analytics on how successful videos are. If you do not have expertise in the classrooms, they will provide help to read the analysis. In Temple University, professors will conduct five-minute webinars to showcase their teachings for other schools to be able to view.

Mr. Don Doll said he is from East Stroudsburg and he is recommending this program for our School District and for the Pocono Area such as Delaware Valley, Pocono Mountain and Stroudsburg and they are currently working with Pleasant Valley. I believe the Poconos has something unique to showcase because we have a lot of smart and talented students that are involved with music, sports, etc. and we need to share. We have something to gain in being in the pilot program and we are able to change things at any time. A year from now others will be signing up for the program. This is the opportunity to be part of something new. It will be going out to 26,000 high schools. We provide leadership and support. We are trying to get the ESASD to get on board to building this program which is unique to the country. Mr. Ferraro said that we have one document and also a parental consent to be reviewed. These agreements are suggested for the district to adopt. Mrs. Laverdure said we are in the process of reviewing the agreement with our Special Counsel for Technology.

J. Mrs. Laverdure said that East Stroudsburg Elementary School received an award for Tier 1 and Tier 2 for their School-wide Positive Behavior with Fidelity (received a new banner). She hopes next year they can get Tier 3. Also, Bushkill Elementary School, J.M. Hill Elementary School and Smithfield Elementary School received Tier 1 awards for School-wide Positive Behavior (received banner attachments). All awards were for the 2015-16 school year. Mrs. Laverdure congratulated them on their accomplishments.

- B. Mr. Summers said as a result of his previous discussion on the possibility of starting a foundation so local community businesses may contribute money to receive a tax break, he became aware of the East Stroudsburg Education Foundation (Foundation). It started several years ago. He and Sharon Laverdure met with the trustee,

John Schoonover about a month ago. The Foundation has money in the bank but have not been active because it is just John and his wife who are managing it. They have given several scholarships over the years. Mr. Schoonover was encouraged to hear that there might be an opportunity to get some more focus on the Foundation. The Foundation needs additional trustees to provide additional support, specifically an attorney or someone that knows accounting or is from the financial profession. Mr. Summers said he had someone look it over and they have identified to him two ESASD graduates that are attorneys. Mr. Summers said he plans to approach them and asked if the Board members or Administrators can come up with more names. He spoke to Bob Phillips, at the Pocono Chamber of Commerce and he is familiar with the Educational Improvement Tax Credit program that works through the Department of Economic Development. The YMCA used the program and businesses can make contribution to the East Stroudsburg Education Foundation to support programs that will be developed and in return they get a tax credit. Bob Phillips seemed to be encouraged that businesses would be willing to support this effort. Mr. Summers said we still have a lot of work to do and find people to attend meetings once every quarter. He said that we are also aware that there are other people seeking money such as the Halls and Walls of Fame Steering Committee. He will speak to the Chairman, Douglas Arnold, to make sure there are no conflicts. We might be able to do something that will be a win, win for the ESASD and the local businesses.

C. Mr. Summers said he received a request on the possibility that the Board close the school district on Election Day. The Board already approved the calendar for the coming year but we have elections going on in several of our schools so it might not be a bad idea to close. Right now the last student day for 2017 is May 30; therefore, we can move the last day to May 31. Mr. Summers asked for suggestions from the Board members. Mr. Gress said that Lehman Township is requesting to use High School North as a voting place. We can probably have an in-service day for the teachers instead of shutting down the buildings. We also have elections down at the High School South. Mrs. Laverdure said they have a voting site in the Administration Center. Mr. Gress said he has suggested for years that schools be closed on Election Day. Mrs. Laverdure asked closed or a non-student day. Mr. Gress said it can be either way. Mr. Summers said it can be a non-student day. Mrs. Laverdure said she is meeting with the Teacher Association tomorrow to discuss what would be the best solution.
