VII. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

VIII. REPORTS

a. Bond Refinancing

Mr. Chris Bamber, of Public Finance Management (PFM), said he is here tonight on behalf of Jamie Doyle, who could not be here. Also here tonight is Jon Cox of Eckert Seamans, who is the district's Bond Counsel. Mr. Bamber said he is here to go over the results of the competitive sale of the district's debt refunding. PFM had the competitive auction around noon today. The refunding saved about \$646,000. When Jamie came in July, PFM thought the savings would be around \$168,000. The reason the refunding is higher is due to the

interest rate drop in the bond market. Page 1 of the handout has a visual presentation of the tax exempt interest rates, which hit their all-time low this week. Page 2 contains information about the Moody's Investors Report. The district's credit is Aa3, which is an extremely strong credit rating. On page 6 is the summary of the competitive auction from today. PFM received 27 bids from 5 different underwriters. The winning bid came from Janney Montgomery Scott at a true interest cost of 1.82%. This was used to award them the bond issue. Page 10 contains the new schedule of bonds from the results of the refunding today. Column 11 has the annual savings, which is about \$30,000-\$40,000 a year and a big lump in 2023 at a total savings of \$646,923.51. This amount will be available to the district if the Board approves the resolution. Page 11 contains the yield of the issue overall rate of which we borrowed for these bonds at a rate 1.508%. This rate will be locked in with Board approval tonight.

Mr. Jonathan Cox, Eckert Seamans, said, for the record, the resolution that is before the Board this evening has been advertised as required under the Local Government Unit Debt Act and appeared in the Pocono Record on August 14th, and was made available for public inspection and review by the district's solicitor. The resolution authorizes the issuance of the General Obligations Bonds Series of 2019 for the purpose of refinancing the district's Series A of 2014 bonds for debt service savings purposes and not for changing the amortization schedule. It accepts the proposal of the winning purchaser of Janney Montgomery Scott. It pledges the district's full faith credit and taxing power. Exhibit A is the final principle and interest schedule. Exhibit B is the form of the bonds. Otherwise, the resolution contains all of the requirements for the district to issue tax exempt municipal bonds under the State law, under Federal Tax Code and Federal Securities laws to offer the bonds in a public offering.

b. Monroe Career & Technical Institute (MCTI) Update

Mr. Larry Dymond said that MCTI is prepared for school opening. They are behind on heating and air conditioning renovations; therefore, they will be working nights and weekends to complete the project. All vacant positions were filled. Mrs. Lisa VanWhy said they found a new instructor for the Computer and Information Systems Program. Also, the remodeling for the Cosmetology Department was done. The Buildings and Grounds Committee received a tour and everything looks fantastic. MCTI is working on the unit ventilators. Safety lights were installed in different classes in case students cannot hear that there is an emergency, the lights will turn on to inform them.

c. Colonial IU 20 Update

Mr. Robert Huffman said there was no meeting this month. The next meeting is this Wednesday and he plans to attend.

d. Property/Facilities Committee Update

Mr. Wayne Rohner said the Property/Facilities Committee meet on August 1st. The Committee tabled the North Campus exterior parking lot lights, More information will follow at the next meeting, Discussion was held on the South batting cage. It was tabled until more information can be provided. The Committee did not accept the bids for the repairs on the North and South tennis courts. The maintenance crew did necessary repairs at the South tennis court. The proposal submitted was for approximately \$83,000 for minimal repairs on the North Tennis Court. They are looking into utilizing their engineer for a temporary solution for this upcoming season. They will then look to replace the whole tennis court. Several D'Huy Engineering invoices were recommend for approval as follows: invoice for H.S. North Roof Replacement for \$20,000.45, Resica Roof Replacement for \$1,372.24, Trane Controls Oversight for \$5,251.00, H.S. North/Lehman Water Replacement for \$840.00, and North Roof Forensic Investigation for \$795.00. The Property/Facilities Committee recommended the replacement of the J.M. Hill Compressor in the amount of \$14,272.00. There was a Conference with D'Huy Engineering, Prosser Labs and a member of the School Board to discuss the Resica well water restoration. They are looking for alternatives. The J. M. Hill Elementary Curb Replacement Project is completed. Northeast Site Contractors came back and fixed the concrete curbing. The South football bleachers were tabled. They will be going through lead testing. Discussion was held that the district is requesting from Labor and Industry an extension of time until October 31st for the Middle Smithfield Elementary roof leaks. The district paid \$348 for the extension. A Special Property/Facilities Committee meeting was held on August 13th to discuss and forward to the Board some payment of bills. They recommended the payment of the following bills: \$625,771.38 for H.S. North/Lehman ATC Upgrade from Trane, \$1,606,698.90 for H.S. North/Lehman Roof Replacement from Jottan, Inc., \$8,685.00, \$55,401.75 and \$207,513.90 for Resica Roof Replacement from C & D. Waterproofing Corp., \$3,938.25 for Trane Controls Oversight from D'Huy Engineering, \$463.88 for North Campus Surveillance Camera Project, \$5,638.76 for Resica Roof Replacement from D'Huy Engineering and \$20,000.45 for the H.S. North Roof Replacement from D'Huy Engineering. There may appear to be a duplicate due to two invoices having the same amount but the

invoice numbers are different. D'Huy Engineering submitted invoice #49778, and #49628 in the same amount. We may want to look into these two invoices.

e. Finance Committee Update

Mr. Richard Schlameuss said the Finance Committee met on August 8, 2019. The committee recommended a classroom assessment tool from Pearson, testing materials from Pro-Ed for district Psychologists and an additional IU person to be in the schools. The Committee also recommended the purchase of a vehicle for H.S. North Driver's Ed class because the current car will not pass inspection. The Committee received a Capital projects report that contained all expenditures by project and then the expenses appear in the payment schedule, too. The Committee also recommended the replacement of the J. T. Lambert Intermediate risers and the current risers will be repaired to use throughout the district. Discussion was held about items being recommended by the Property/Facilities Committee. The Finance Committee will no longer discuss nor recommend them to the Board. The information will remain on the agenda for informational purposes only.
