a. Monroe Career & Technical Institute Update

Mrs. Lisa VanWhy said the MCTI JOC met on July 12th at 7:00 p.m. At the meeting, they approved the Superintendent of Records for two years, Elizabeth Robison, who is from the Pocono Mountain School District. It should have been the Pleasant Valley School District Superintendent but they do not have a Superintendent right now. At the meeting, they approved the updated Safety Plan and an Articulation agreement for the Cosmetology Department between MCTI and Lehigh Carbon Community College. The roof project may be slightly delayed due to the fact that they cannot get building materials delivered on time. The next meeting will be held on August 2, 2021 at 7:00 p.m.

b. Colonial IU 20 Update

Dr. Damary Bonilla said the IU 20 Board met on June 23rd. No meeting is scheduled during the month of July.

They discussed the following updates:

The PDE Conference Committee inquired from the IU 20, the family support team and IU 20 staff to speak at the PDE Conference in 2022. They will be presenting at the conference the work that they have done on Family Engagement.

On June 24th, The IU 20 Summer Administrative workshop was conducted virtually through C-Event, the new platform that was used. 142 Administrators across the IU 20 Region attended this event.

The Data Center began construction on July 5th. The work will be done Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The contractor for this project is Wind Gap Electric.

The 2021-22 Special Education Plan for the CIU 20 was approved by the Bureau of Special Education. The orientation for staff was held for summer programming.

The next Board of Directors' meeting will be held on August 25th at 7:30 p.m. It is opened to the public. Everyone is invited to attend.

The CIU 20 Orientation for the 2021-22 SY will take place on August 20, 2021 at 8:00 a.m. virtually.

c. Property/Facilities Committee Update

Mrs. Lisa VanWhy said the Property/Facilities Committee met on July 6, 2021. A. Mr. John Petrizzo said that he noticed on the agenda two items that are a concern to him. One item is the motion to deny the request of DEPG Mosier Associates for abatement and/or modification of statutory requirement. The other item is regarding the Executive Session held this evening for the purpose of discussing personnel, litigation and negotiations. The litigation should be important to all community members due to the fraud on the construction that has occurred on the district. He asked if the construction fraud was discussed in executive session. If so, he would like more than three minutes to make his comments. Mrs. VanWhy said his request is denied and to continue with his three minutes. Mr. Petrizzo said he was cut off before when he wanted to discuss that the district was lied to when they made the tax abatement vote. Shoprite never had any intentions going where they are. The Board made a decision without the truth. He said he spoke to two realtors and one for Shoprite and one for the family of Shoprite and both of them were told that they had no intention of moving there. He said you were lied to and you passed the vote 9-0. Mr. Petrizzo asked if the Board discussed the construction during Executive Session. Mrs. Bear said they are not allowed to inform him what was discussed during Executive Session. Mr. Brown said construction litigation was discussed during Executive Session. Mr. Petrizzo said he sees extensive bills being paid on several items and leaky roofs. He said he would like to bring to the Board's attention before more decisions are done that Mr. Schlameuss' father in-law was taken to court by Lyman and Ash and fried like an egg twice once for \$38,000 and the second time for \$300,000. He said Ms. Kulick's partner in crime, Fred May, was also sued by Lyman and Ash for \$125,000.00. There are a lot of people in the community who would like the Board to make right on the construction fraud. The public is watching everything the Board votes on.
