IV. WELCOMING OF GUESTS:

Mr. Richard Schlameuss said thank you and welcome to all of our guests for those online as well as those who are here. We are getting ready for another school year. There are many very exciting things happening so stay tuned.

V. ANNOUNCEMENT OF EXECUTIVE SESSION(S)

a. An Executive Session was held this evening at 5:30 p.m. before this meeting for the purpose of discussing personnel, litigation and negotiations.

VI. ADOPTION OF AGENDA

ACTION BY THE BOARD:

Motion was seconded by Jason Gullstrand and carried unanimously, 9-0.

Motion was made by Rebecca Bear to add to the agenda the addendum and to also add the appointment of Allison Galdieri, Grade 5 Teacher at Bushkill Elementary School. Motion was seconded by Jason Gullstrand and carried unanimously, 9-0.

The agenda with additions/changes was carried unanimously, 9-0.

VII. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

ACTION BY THE BOARD:

Motion was made by Dr. Damary Bonilla to approve the minutes of the July 18, 2022, Board meeting. Motion was seconded by Steven Lurry and carried unanimously, 9-0.

Mr. Rohner said he took the opportunity to read up on the Special Education Plan Report. It looks like we have data associated with every school building. I am not quite sure what the percentages were. Billy, any ideas how many Special Education student numbers we have in the North and the South. Where I am going with this is that since day one, I want to make aware to the Community that H.S. North continues to get shortchanged when it comes to resources. We have decided to hire a Reflective Coach only for the South. I want to know why those resources aren't available for my students up North. I understand that they want to use the term "Pilot". At the end of the day, my history tells me that High School North continues to be shortchanged with resources. I know that the staff at North is disappointed in that occurring year after year. What is the main reason for not having a Reflective Coach for North like we are providing for the South? Are we going to transport the North students to South for the opportunity to have this resource or we just going to shut them out? Dr. Bonilla said as Chair of the Education Committee, this was a discussion at the Education Committee last month. The information is available in the minutes and in the recording. Also, this was open for discussion before we voted on it last month. Mr. Schlameuss said we are not looking to change the minutes at all because the minutes were part of the official proceeding. Mr. Rohner said I am not looking to change the minutes. Mr. Schlameuss said the discussion as I hear you has really no relevance to the motion that we are discussing here. Here is what I would say. I would attend the next Education Programs & Resources Committee meeting to ask the questions that you have and ask the person sitting next to you about it. Mr. Rohner said I am going to volunteer for the Comprehensive Plan so that I can be part of that process.

VIII. REPORTS

a. Monroe Career & Technical Institute Update

Mrs. Lisa VanWhy said the JOC met on August 1st at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was a combination of the July and August meetings because we did not meet in July. We approved various Business and Financial items as well as Personnel items. We updated the Health and Safety Plan. We also approved the Affiliation Agreement with Lehigh Valley Network for 2022-2023 school year. In addition, there was a Special JOC Meeting that was held on August 9, 2022 to appoint Joel Bruch as the new Business Manager effective August 22 to replace Diane Serfass who, sadly, is retiring. Our next meeting is scheduled for September 12th at 7:00 p.m.

b. Colonial IU 20 Update

Dr. Damary Bonilla said the Colonial IU 20 will be held on August 24th at 7:30 p.m. The meeting is open to the public, following an Executive Session. Anyone who wants to access the CIU 20 Newsletter, can send me an email and I will share the link. Also, over the summer, I was reelected as Vice President.

c. Property/Facilities Committee Update

Mrs. Lisa VanWhy said the Property/Facilities Committee met on August 3rd. The following items were recommended to be placed on the agenda:

A Management Plan for mold remediation was shared with us, which, I believe, is on the district website. Most of our South projects are in their final stages of completion or have already been completed. Our next Property/Facilities Committee meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, September 7th at 5:30 p.m. in person and via Zoom.

Mrs. VanWhy asked if she missed anything. Mr. Schlameuss said he was asking Dr. Riker about the JTL Water Project. I believe they plan to start in September because they cannot complete it next week. Dr. Riker said they told us that they will not shut off the water but it will cause a traffic issue.

d. Education Programs & Resources Committee Update

Dr. Damary Bonilla said the Education Programs & Resources Committee meeting met on August 10th. We had a very informative meeting. Mrs. Angela Byrne joined us on the very first day of her international vacation because she was excited to share with us about the success of the grants that she has been able to secure for the programs. There was so much rich information shared that I would suggest to anyone who did not get to participate to watch the recording or read the minutes because the district is doing amazing things for our students and our community. She just gave us snippets and we invited her back to give a more detailed session just about the grants, which would be open to the Community. We also had an opportunity to learn about the YMCA programs. The Representative Nicole Miller came. She was very complimentary about the partnership with the district, administration and just the fact that we can provide this before and after-school care for our students, particularly in the remote areas towards the North High School Area, which is great for our elementary school. We were all grateful to hear about this partnership. We also had the opportunity to hear from our team on some Back to School Tips. Mrs. Bear and I as parents in the district were saying that we learned a lot. It is something that we are going to be sharing more broadly than just at the Education Programs & Resources Committee meeting. This team presented to us at the end of the school year with some tips for the summer. These are ways that we are leveraging this Committee to share resources and information to support our families. We had the opportunity to talk about the Movie and Book Program at our local community theater, which some of us participated in and over 150 people attended. It was just great for our families to watch a free movie and be able to access a snack box for \$5 every Tuesday in July. It was a great meeting. We didn't have anything to move forward in terms of considerations and the next meeting is on Wednesday, September 14th via Zoom at 7:00 p.m.

Nobody seemed to know if that was even available. My other item was about the Smithfield roof replacement. It has leaked from day one. It is still under a twenty-year warranty and yet they want us to pay a million plus dollars to repair it. I think our Solicitor should send them a letter and tell them that we have a twenty-year warranty so they can come and replace it for free. Why would we pay for a replacement since we already paid for it?
