Definitions SC 1301 Title 22 Sec. 11.12	School age shall be defined as the period from the earliest admission age for the school district's kindergarten program until graduation from high school or the end of the school term in which a student reaches the age of twenty-one (21) years, whichever occurs first.[1][7]
	SC 1302 Title 22 Sec. 11.11	District of residence shall be defined as the school district in which a student's parent(s)/guardian(s) reside(s).[2][3]

	SC 1301, 1302, <u>1303a. 1304a</u> Title 22 Sec. 11.11 Pol. 203, 216.1	The school district shall not enroll a student until the parent/guardian has submitted proof of the student's age, residence, immunizations and a completed Parent <u>al</u> Registration Statement, as required by law and regulations <u>except as</u> <u>follows:-[1][2][3][10][11][12][13]</u>
		1. Students Experiencing Educational Instability -
	-SC 1331.1 - Pol. 251	The school district shall immediately enroll students experiencing homelessness foster care and other forms of educational instability, even if the student or parent/guardian is unable to produce the required documents, in accordance

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	with Board policy, laws and regulations.[5][14]
	<u>1. Children of Active Duty Military Families –</u>
	<u>The district shall facilitate the timely enrollment and permit advanced</u> <u>enrollment of children of active duty military families, in accordance with law</u> <u>and Board policy. To qualify for advanced enrollment, prior to establishing</u> <u>residency in the district, a copy of the official military orders shall be provided to</u> <u>the district along with proof of the parent's/guardian's intention to move into the</u> <u>district. The parent/guardian must provide proof of residence within forty-five</u> <u>(45) days after the arrival date stated in the military orders.[6][15][16]</u>
— Title 22 — Sec. 11.11	The school district shall not inquire about the immigration status of a student as part of the enrollment process.
<u>— Pol. 202</u>	Enrollment requirements and procedures shall apply to nonresident students approved to attend schools of the school district in accordance with Board policy.
<u>Title 22</u> <u>Sec. 11.11</u> <u>Pol. 138</u>	The school district shall administer a home language survey to all students enrolling in schools of the school district for the first time. [3][17]
	The school district shall normally enroll a school age, eligible student the next business day, but no later than five (5) business days after application.[3]
	The school district shall not inquire about the immigration status of a student as part of the enrollment process.[3]
	Residency Eligibility
Title 22 — Sec. 11.11	When the parents of a student reside in different school districts, the student may attend school in the school district of residence of the parent with whom the student lives for a majority of the time, unless a court order or court-approved custody agreement specifies otherwise.
	If the parents of a student share joint custody and time is evenly divided, the parents may choose which one (1) of the two (2) school districts the student will enroll in for the school year.
	If the student is an emancipated minor, the resident school district shall be the one in which the student is then living.
4. Delegation of Responsibility <u>Title 22</u>	The Superintendent or designee shall annually notify students, parents/guardians and staff about the district's enrollment policy by publishing such policy in parent newsletters, on the district website and other efficient methods.[4]

	The Superintendent or designee shall develop and disseminate administrative regulations for the enrollment of eligible students in district schools.
