a. Dr. John Toleno, Acting Superintendent, said the only thing I have to report this evening is that there are two individuals that have been recognized for 5 Years of Service from Pennsylvania School Boards, Keith Karkut and Rebecca Bear, who are not here in-person tonight. I have two certificates for them, and I'll make sure they get those certificates as soon as I get to see them. Mrs. Bear said how nice. Thank you. The Board members congratulated her. Dr. Toleno said other than that, we are just getting ready for the start of school, as you know, we're going to be opening tomorrow morning with our staff. I'm very excited to be able to address

the staff members and get everybody back. I believe we are going to start on a good note. I'm really very excited, like I said before, we are all set to get started with kids, which is what we do. It's been a great mission so far, people have been very receptive to where we're going, the direction that we're headed, and I can't thank the Board enough for the support that we've had in these times. With every ending, winds up being a new beginning. We are starting a new beginning for the East Stroudsburg Area School District and I'm excited to be a part of it. Thank you. Mr. Catrillo said thank you, John and I would agree. There's an excitement for a new year, a new beginning and it's going to be a great year for us.

- c. Property/Facilities Committee Update

Mr. Wayne Rohner said The Property and Facilities Committee met on August 7th. The items requiring action were:

1. High School, South Stadium fence - a motion was made to recommend The Service Team to remove and install 300 feet of black vinyl, coated chain link fencing, posts, and rails for the press box section of the football stadium.

- 1. High School North natatorium roof replacement a motion was made to recommend payment of application No. 8 for \$12,699.90 to Munn Roofing.
- 2. Middle Smithfield flooring a motion was made to recommend payment of Application, No. 4 for \$93,386.25 to Cope Commercial Flooring.
- 3. East Stroudsburg Elementary flooring a motion was made to recommend payment of Application No. 4 for \$96,048.90 to Cope Commercial Flooring.
- 4. Resica Elementary HVAC a motion was made to recommend payment of Application No. 4 for \$480,000, and Application No. 5 for \$310,000 to Trane.
- 5. North HVAC a motion was made to recommend payment of Application No. 4 for \$371,020 and Application No. 5 for \$239,617 to Trane.

- 1. We received a district-wide email from Lyman and Ash regarding a fully executed settlement agreement regarding the fire sprinkler system. The district has received payment of 1.2 million dollars.
- 2. Regarding Lyman and Ash, an email was received from Josh Grice to Lyman and Ash on July 31, 2024, to inform us that Rutledge Excavating will begin work on Monday, August 5th.

- 3. North Bus Garage addition, we are in design phase now with bidding around December of this year.
- 4. High School South elevator has been repaired and working well, with no additional cost to the District
- 5. Resica Elementary School A motion was made to recommend a walkway maintenance proposal to repair concrete sidewalks that have settled into the ground, causing a tripping hazard.
- 6. Middle Smithfield Elementary School with our recent weather patterns of excessive downpours, we have been informed that we still have multiple roof leaks. Our staff is working with the contractor to resolve that outstanding issue. Thank you.

d. Education Programs & Resources Committee Update - esasd.net/epr

Mrs. Ann Catrillo said that the Education Programs & Resources Committee met on August 1st. Mrs. Trenee Lurry gave us a BeAlliance Update, stating. She shared articles on books and diversity for summer reading, and she also gave us an update on all the cultural celebrations for the months of June and July.

Mr. Forsyth gave a communications update which included an update on the progress of the website design which would be launched later in August. Of course, we now know it has been launched. He also spoke on school bus technologies and the Sapphire community portal, which now includes an electronic sign off for all the student data forms.

Mrs. Lisa Vitulli then presented ESACA for us. She included some of the highlights from, the 2023-24 school year, including staff and student data, elementary students once a month fun days, live art lessons for our middle school students, CPR and First Aid training for our Junior and Seniors, monthly activities to build relationships and summer school enrollment which had 114 students in grade, 6 through 12. For the upcoming school year, she said there is a revised attendance policy, a two-day orientation with separate days for middle and high school students are being implemented this year. They are piloting synchronous lessons for English 10 and Algebra I, which are our Keystone classes. They will still be using ingenuity for those.

Then Miss Angell presented the use of the Vista products for our English learner students.

The EPR group recommendations for consideration this evening are:

- Approval of the Reading Eggs renewal for the elementary buildings in the amount of \$11,464 that is fully funded by Title I.
- Approval of the next portion of the High School Math curriculum distributed at our June EPR meeting, which we all received those as well.
- Approval of the elementary ELA and Math curriculum also distributed at the June EPR meeting.
- Purchase of the Vista Higher Learner English curriculum products for grade 6 through 12 as a one-year pilot in the amount of \$16,740.07, which is fully funded by the 2024-25 curriculum and instruction budget.

Our next meeting will not be held on Thursday, September 5th because that is the Athletic Hall of Fame Induction; therefore, we are moving our meeting to Monday, September 9th at 5:00 p.m. in the Board Room and via Zoom. e. Finance Committee Update

Mrs. Rebecca Bear said the Finance Committee met on August 12th. We discussed a bunch of items. We went over the new prices for school lunch for staff and students. Students are free through our grant money, but the staff prices went up. You'll see that on the agenda tonight.

We also had a quick presentation from Public Financial Management (PFM) in regard to the purchase or lease of new school buses for the upcoming school year.

We had a quote from Crimestar, U.S.A. and for two new police vehicles. One is a 2024 Chevy Tahoe, and one is a 2023 Ford Explorer.

We also had the renewal for Aimsweb and the purchase of new furniture for Special Education through Lakeshore.

We had a discussion with Chief Mill in regard to metal detectors. We're going to get some more information on that.

Mr. Bard gave us a brief presentation on the Governor's budget that just passed. He'll go over that to let us know exactly where the funds came from.

We have the recommendations that Mr. Rohner gave us from the Properties and Facilities Committee, as well as the recommendations that Mrs. Catrillo gave us from the Education Programs and Resources Committee meeting.

We are going to hear more information on the bus purchase/lease from PFM next month.
