Utilization of substitute or short-term employees prior to approval by the Board is authorized when necessary to maintain continuity of services in the district. Retroactive employment shall be recommended to the Board at the next meeting.

Orderly operation of the school district requires maintaining a file for the retention of all records relative to an individual's duties and responsibilities as a district employee.

The Board requires that sufficient records be maintained to ensure an employee's qualifications for the job held, compliance with federal and state requirements and local benefit programs, conformance with district policies and rules, and evidence of completed evaluations.

3. Delegation of Responsibility

The Board delegates the establishment and maintenance of official personnel records to the Superintendent or designee, who shall prepare guidelines defining the material to be incorporated into personnel files.

4. Guidelines

A central file shall be maintained; supplemental records may be maintained only for ease in data gathering.

Medical records shall be kept in a file separate from the employee's personnel file.

Only information that pertains to the professional role of the employee and is submitted by duly authorized administrative personnel and the Board may be entered in the official personnel file.

#### **Employee Access**

#### 806. CHILD/STUDENT ABUSE

1. Authority 18 Pa. C.S.A Sec. 4304 23 Pa. C.S.A. Sec. 6301 et seq.

2. Definitions

23 Pa. C.S.A. Sec. 6351

23 Pa. C.S.A. Sec 6303

The Board adopts this policy to affirm school district employees' obligation to assist in identifying possible child abuse as well as victimization of students by other school employees, and to establish procedures for reporting with the same law.

The following definitions are for purposes of this policy.

Administrator - the person responsible for the administration of a district school. The term includes a person responsible for employment decisions in a school and an independent contractor. The principal of the school where a student is believed to be abused is enrolled is considered an administrator under this policy.

**Applicant** - an individual who applies for a position as a school employee. The term includes an individual who transfers from one position to another position as a school employee.

**Child Abuse** - shall mean any of the following:

- 1. Any recent act or failure to act by a perpetrator which causes non-accidental serious physical injury to a child under eighteen (18) years of age.
- 2. Any act or failure to act by a perpetrator which causes non-accidental serious mental injury to or sexual abuse or sexual exploitation of a child under eighteen (18) years of age.
- 3. Any recent act, failure to act, or series of such acts or failures to act by a perpetrator which creates an imminent risk of serious physical injury to or sexual abuse or sexual exploitation of a child under eighteen (18) years of age.
- 4. Serious physical neglect by a perpetrator constituting prolonged or repeated lack of supervision or the failure to provide essentials of life, including adequate medical care, which endangers a child's life or development or impairs the child's functioning.

No child shall be deemed to be physically or mentally abused based on injuries that result solely from environmental factors that are beyond the control of the parent or person responsible for the child's welfare, such as inadequate housing, furnishings, income, clothing, and medical care.

#### 806. CHILD/STUDENT ABUSE - Pg. 2

**Perpetrator** - a person who has committed child abuse and is a parent/guardian of a child, a person responsible for the welfare of a child, an individual residing in the same home as a child, or a paramour of a child's parent/guardian. The term does not include a person who is employed by or provides services or programs in the schools of the school district.

**School Employee** - an individual employed in a school district. The term includes an independent contractor and employees. The term excludes an individual who has no direct contact with students.

**Serious Bodily Injury** - bodily injury which creates a substantial risk of death or which causes serious permanent disfigurement or protracted loss or impairment of function of any bodily member or organ.

**Serious Mental Injury** - a psychological condition, as diagnosed by a physician or licensed psychologist, including the refusal of appropriate treatment, that:

- 1. Renders a child chronically and severely anxious, agitated, depressed, socially withdrawn, psychotic or in reasonable fear that the child's life or safety is threatened.
- 2. Seriously interferes with a child's ability to accomplish age-appropriate developmental and social tasks.

**Serious Physical Injury** - an injury that causes a child severe pain, or significantly impairs a child's physical functioning, either temporarily or permanently.

Sexual Abuse or Exploitation includes any of the following: (1) the employment, use, persuasion, inducement, enticement, or coercion of any child to engage in or assist another individual to engage in any sexually explicit conduct; (2) the employment, use, persuasion, inducement, enticement, or coercion of any child to engage in or assist another individual to engage in any simulation of any sexually explicit conduct, for the purpose of producing any visual depiction; including photographing, videotaping, computer depicting or filming of any sexually explicit conduct; or (3) any of the following offenses committed against a child: rape, sexual assault, involuntary deviate sexual intercourse, aggravated indecent assault, molestation, incest, indecent exposure, prostitution, statutory sexual assault, sexual abuse or sexual exploitation.

#### No 814 COPYRIGHT

#### 1. Purpose

U.S. Constitution, Article I, Sec. 8, Clause 8; 17 U.S.C. Sec. 101 et seq. The East Stroudsburg Area School District recognizes that the Federal Constitution grants authors and creators certain rights to protect their property as a means of promoting and advancing knowledge, and that Congress enforces these rights through U.S. Copyright Law. In addition, Congress has enacted The Digital Millennium Copyright Act (DMCA) providing for limitations on infringement liability for educational institutions that are "service providers", for preventing the circumvention of technological protection measures, for promoting distance learning through digital technologies, and for maintenance and development of digital libraries to accommodate digital technologies and evolving preservation practices.

At the same time, the School District recognizes that Congress and the courts have provided that sometimes reproducing, publishing, displaying, distributing, or performing someone else's work is not harmful to that person and that using the work is an important part of public discourse. Therefore, special exceptions from liability are permitted when:

- (1) Prior permission is granted from the Copyright Owner,
- (2) A license agreement has been executed,
- (3) The conditions for statutory limitations on exclusive rights of copyrighted works are met, such as principles related to:
  - (a) Fair use
  - (b) Reproductions by librarians
  - (c) Performances and/or displays
  - (d) The TEACH Act
  - (e) Computer programs, and
- (4) The conditions for exceptions from violations of the DMCA are met.

#### 2. Definitions

Copyright protection applies to original works of authorship fixed in a tangible medium of expression that can be perceived, reproduced, or communicated, either directly or with the aid of a machine or device. The works include the following categories: (1) literary works, (2) musical works, including any accompanying words, (3) dramatic works, including any accompanying music, (4) pantomimes and choreographic works, (5) pictorial, graphic and sculptural works, (6) motion pictures

and other audiovideo works, (7) sound recordings and (8) architectural works. Copyright protection extends to most computer software, which is typically protected as a literary work. The author of a work of "visual art" may have the rights of attribution and integrity.

<u>Copyright does not protect</u> ideas, procedures, process, systems, methods of operation, concepts, principles, or discoveries, regardless of the form in which it is described, explained, illustrated, or embodied in the work.

**<u>Rights</u>** granted solely to the Copyright owner include the right to:

- (a) reproduce the copyrighted work in copies or phonorecords;
- (b) prepare derivative works based upon the copyrighted work;
- (c) distribute copies or phonorecords of the copyrighted work to the public by sale or other transfer of ownership, or by rental, lease, or lending;
- (d) in the case of a literary, musical, dramatic, and choreographic works, pantomime, and motion pictures, or other audiovisual works, to perform the copyrighted work publicly;
- (e) in the case of a literary, musical, dramatic, and choreographic work, pantomime, and pictorial, graphic, sculptural work, including the individual images of a motion picture or other audio visual work, to display the copyrighted work publicly; and
- (f) in the case sound recordings to perform the work publicly by means of digital audio transmissions.

### 3. Delegation of Responsibility

The Superintendent shall provide an East Stroudsburg Area School District Copyright Guidelines Handbook for employees, students, guests, visitors and independent contractors to guide them in compliance with copyright statutes, regulations, laws and this Policy. In addition, the Superintendent, or designee(s), shall provide training for employees and instructional sessions for students to assist them in complying with the copyright requirements. The Copyright Guidelines Handbook shall included, but not be limited to, legal requirements of The Copyright Act, including The TEACH ACT, and the DMCA.

It shall be the responsibility of the Superintendent or designee and Director of Instructional Technology to provide leadership for proper training and for enforcement of the Copyright Act, DMCA, this Policy and the requirements provided in the Copyright Guidelines Handbook.

#### 4. Guidelines

Federal laws, cases, and guidelines pertaining to copyright will govern the use of material accessed through the School District resources. Users will make a standard practice of requesting permission from the holder of the work, or their agent and complying with license agreements pursuant to the School District procedures. Employees will instruct students to respect copyrights, request permission when appropriate, and comply with license agreements and employees will respect and comply as well.

Violations of copyright law can be a felony and the law allows a court to hold individuals personally responsible for infringing the law. The School District does not permit illegal acts pertaining to the copyright law. Therefore, any user violating the copyright law does so at their own risk and assumes all liability.

Violations of copyright law include, but are not limited to, the making of unauthorized copies of any copyrighted material (such as commercial software, text, graphic images, audio and video recording), distributing copyrighted materials over computer networks, unauthorized downloading of music and movies, and deep-linking and framing into the content of others' web sites. Finally, employees and students may not circumvent technological protection measures, unless permitted by law.

### 815. ACCEPTABLE USE OF THE COMPUTERS, NETWORK, INTERNET, ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION SYSTEMS

#### 1. Purpose

The East Stroudsburg Area School District ("School District") provides employees, students, and Guests ("users") with access to the School District's electronic communication systems and network, which includes Internet access, whether wired or wireless, or by any other means. Guests include, but are not limited to, visitors, workshop attendees, volunteers, independent contractors, adult education staff, students, and board members.

Computers, network, Internet, electronic communications and information systems (collectively "CIS systems") provide vast, diverse and unique resources. The Board of School Directors will provide access to the School District's CIS systems for users if there is a specific School District-related purpose to access information and research; to collaborate to facilitate learning and teaching; and to foster the educational purpose and mission of the School District.

For users, the School District's CIS systems must be used for education-related purposes and performance of School District job duties. At the same time, personal technology devices brought onto the School District's property, or at School District events, or connected to the School District's network, that the School District reasonably believes contain School District information or contain information that violates a School District Policy, or contain information/data that the School District reasonably believes involves a criminal activity may be legally accessed to insure compliance with this Policy, other School District Policies, and to comply with the law. Users may not use their personal computers connected to the School District's intranet, Internet or any other CIS System unless approved by the Director of Instructional Technology and Director of Administrative Services and/or designee and/or authorized as part of the School District's services for users.

The School District intends to strictly protect its CIS systems against numerous outside and internal risks and vulnerabilities. Users are important and critical players in protecting these School District assets and in lessening the risks that can destroy these important and critical assets. Consequently, users are required to fully comply with this policy, and to immediately report any violations or suspicious activities to \_\_\_\_\_\_. Conduct otherwise will result in actions further described in Section 13 - Consequences for

Inappropriate, Unauthorized and Illegal Use, found in the last Section of this Policy, and provided in relevant School District policies.

- 2. <u>Definitions</u> 18 U.S.C. § 2256(8)
- 1. <u>Child Pornography</u> Under Federal law, any visual depiction, including any photograph, film, video, picture, or computer or computer-generated image or picture, whether made or produced by electronic, mechanical, or other means, of sexually explicit conduct, where:
  - a. The production of such visual depiction involves the use of a minor engaging in sexually explicit conduct;
  - b. Such visual depiction is a digital image, computer image, or computer-generated image that is, or is indistinguishable from, that of a minor engaging in sexually explicit conduct; or
  - c. Such visual depiction has been created, adapted, or modified to appear that an identifiable minor is engaging in sexually explicit conduct.

18 Pa.C.S.A. § 6312

Under Pennsylvania law, any book, magazine, pamphlet, slide, photograph, film, videotape, computer depiction or other material depicting a child under the age of 18 years engaging in a prohibited sexual act or in the simulation of such act.

- 2. <u>Computer</u> Includes any School District owned, leased or licensed or user owned personal hardware, software, or other technology used on School District premises or at School District events, or connected to the School District network, containing School District programs or School District or student data (including images, files, and other information) attached or connected to, installed in, or otherwise used in connection with a computer. Computer includes, but is not limited to, the School District and users: desktop, notebook, powerbook, tablet PC or laptop computers, printers, facsimile machine, cables, modems, and other peripherals; specialized electronic equipment used for students' special educational purposes; Global Positioning System (GPS) equipment; personal digital assistants (PDAs); iPods, MP3 players; cellphones, with or without Internet access and/or recording and/or camera/video and other capabilities and configurations, telephones, mobile phones, or wireless devices, two-way radios/telephones; beepers; paging devices, laser pointers and attachments, and any other such technology developed.
- 3. <u>Electronic Communications Systems</u> Any messaging, collaboration, publishing, broadcast, or distribution system that depends on electronic communications resources to create, send, forward, reply to, transmit, store, hold, copy, download, display, view, read, or print electronic records for purposes of communication across electronic communications network systems between or among individuals or groups, that is either explicitly denoted as a system for electronic communications or is implicitly used for such purposes. Further, an electronic communications system means any wire, radio, electromagnetic, photooptical or photoelectronic facilities for the transmission of wire or electronic communications, and any computer facilities or related electronic equipment for the electronic storage of such communications. Examples include, without limitation, the Internet, intranet, electronic

mail services, voicemail services, GPS, PDAs, facsimile machines, cellphones with or without Internet access and/or electronic mail and/or recording devices, cameras/video, and other capabilities.

- 4. <u>Educational Purpose</u> Includes use of the CIS systems for classroom activities, professional or career development, and to support the School District's curriculum, policy and mission statement.
- 5. <u>Harmful to Minors</u> Under Federal law, any picture, image, graphic image file or other visual depictions that:
  - a. taken as a whole, with respect to minors, appeals to the prurient interest in nudity, sex, or excretion;
  - b. depicts, describes, or represents in a patently offensive way with respect to what is suitable for minors, an actual or simulated sexual act or sexual content, actual or simulated normal or perverted sexual acts, or lewd exhibition of the genitals, and
  - c. taken as a whole lacks serious literary, artistic, political, educational or scientific value as to minors.

Under Pennsylvania law, any depiction or representation in whatever form, of nudity, sexual conduct, sexual excitement, or sadomasochistic abuse, when it:

- a. predominantly appeals to the prurient, shameful, or morbid interest of minors; and
- b. is patently offensive to prevailing standards in the adult community as a whole with respect to what is suitable for minors; and
- c. taken as a whole, lacks serious literary, artistic, political, educational or scientific value for minors.
- 6. Minor For purposes of compliance with the Children's Internet Protection Act ("CIPA"), an individual who has not yet attained the age of seventeen. For other purposes, minor shall mean the age of minority as defined in the relevant law.
- 7. <u>Obscene</u> Under Federal law, analysis of the material meets the following elements:
- a. whether the average person, applying contemporary community standards, would find that the material, taken as a whole, appeals to the prurient interest;
- b. whether the work depicts or describes, in a patently offensive way, sexual conduct specifically designed by the applicable state or federal law to be obscene; and
- c. whether the work taken as a whole lacks serious literary, artistic, political, educational, or scientific value.

Under Pennsylvania law, analysis of the material meets the following elements:

- a. the average person, applying contemporary community standards, would find that the material, taken as a whole, appeals to the prurient interest;
- b. the subject matter depicts or describes in a patently offensive way, sexual conduct described in the law to be obscene; and
- c. the subject matter, taken as a whole lacks serious literary, artistic, political, educational or scientific value.
- 8. <u>Sexual Act and Sexual Contact</u> As defined at 18 U.S.C. § 2246(2), and at 18 U.S.C. § 2246(3), 18 Pa.C.S.A. § 5903.
- 9. <u>Technology Protection Measure(s)</u> A specific technology that blocks or filters Internet access to visual depictions that are obscene, child pornography or harmful to minors.
- 10. <u>Visual Depictions</u> Undeveloped film and videotape and data stored on computer disk or by electronic means which is capable of conversion into a visual image but does not include mere words.

#### 3. Authority

- 1. Access to the School District's CIS systems through school resources is a privilege, not a right. These, as well as the user accounts and information, are the property of the School District, which reserves the right to deny access to prevent further unauthorized, inappropriate or illegal activity, and may revoke those privileges and/or administer appropriate disciplinary action. The School District will cooperate to the extent legally required with ISP, local, state and federal officials in any investigation concerning or related to the misuse of the CIS systems.
- 2. It is often necessary to access user accounts in order to perform routine maintenance and security tasks; system administrators have the right to access by interception, and the stored communication of user accounts for any reason in order to uphold this policy and to maintain the system. Users have no privacy expectation in the contents of their personal files or any of their use of the School District's CIS systems. The School District reserves the right to monitor, track, log and access CIS systems use and to monitor and allocate fileserver space.
- 3. The School District reserves the right to restrict access to any Internet sites or functions it may deem inappropriate through general policy, software blocking or online server blocking. Specifically, the School District operates and enforces technology protection measure(s) that block or filter online activities of minors on its computers used and accessible to adults and students so as to filter or block inappropriate matter on the Internet. *Inappropriate matter* includes, but is not limited to, visual, graphic, text and any other form of obscene, sexually explicit, child pornographic, or other material that is harmful to minors, hateful, illegal, defamatory, lewd, vulgar, profane, rude, inflammatory, threatening, harassing, discriminatory (as it pertains to race, color, religion, national origin, gender,

marital status, age, sexual orientation, political beliefs, receipt of financial aid, or disability), violent, bullying, terroristic, and advocates the destruction of property. Measures designed to restrict adults' and minors' access to material harmful to minors may be disabled to enable an adult or student to access *bona fide* research, not within the prohibitions of this policy, or for another lawful purpose. No person may have access to material that is illegal under federal or state law. Expedited review and resolution of a claim that the policy is denying a student or adult to access material will be enforced by an administrator, supervisor, or their designee upon the receipt of written consent from a parent or guardian of a student, and upon the written request from an adult.

- 4. The School District has the right, but not the duty, to monitor, track, log, access and /or report all aspects of its computer information, technology and related systems of all users and of any user's personal computers, network, Internet, electronic communication systems, and media that they bring onto School District property, or to School District events, that were connected to the School District network, which contained School District programs or School District or student data (including images, files, and other information), all pursuant to the law, in order to insure compliance with this policy and other School District policies, to protect the School District's resources, and to comply with the law.
- 5. The School District reserves the right to restrict or limit usage of lower priority CIS systems and computer uses when network and computing requirements exceed available capacity according to the following priorities:
  - a. <u>Highest</u> uses that directly supports the education of the students.
  - b. Medium uses that indirectly benefit the education of the students.
  - c. <u>Lowest</u> uses that include reasonable and limited educationally-related interpersonal communications.
  - d. <u>Forbidden</u> all activities in violation of this policy.
- 6. The School District additionally reserves the right to:
  - a. Determine which CIS systems' services will be provided through School District resources.
  - b. Determine the types of files that may be stored on School District file servers and computers.
  - c. View and monitor network traffic, file server space, processor, and system utilization, and all applications provided through the network and communications systems, including e-mail and other electronic communications.
  - d. Remove excess e-mail or files taking up an inordinate amount of fileserver disk space after a reasonable time.

e. Revoke user privileges, remove user accounts, or refer to legal authorities when violation of this and any other applicable School District policies occur or state or federal law is violated, including, but not limited to, those governing network use, copyright, security, privacy, employment, data breaches, and destruction of School District resources and equipment.

### 4. Responsibility

- 1. Due to the nature of the Internet as a global network connecting thousands of computers around the world, inappropriate materials, including those which may be defamatory, discriminatory (as it pertains to race, color, religion, national origin, gender, marital status, age, sexual orientation, political beliefs, receipt of financial aid, or disability), inaccurate, obscene, sexually explicit, lewd, vulgar, rude, harassing, violent, inflammatory, threatening, terroristic, hateful, bullying, profane, pornographic, offensive, or illegal, can be accessed through the network and electronic communications systems. Because of the nature of the technology that allows the Internet to operate, the School District cannot completely block access to these resources. Accessing these and similar types of resources may be considered an unacceptable use of school resources and will result in actions explained further in Section 13 Consequences for Inappropriate, Unauthorized and Illegal Use, found in the last Section of this policy and as provided in relevant School District policies.
- 2. Users must be capable and able to use the School District's CIS systems, and software relevant to their responsibilities. In addition, users must practice proper etiquette, School District ethics, and agree to the requirements of this policy.

# 5. Delegation of Responsibility

- 1. The Director of Instructional Technology and Director of Administrative Services d/or designee will serve as the coordinator to oversee the School District's CIS systems and ll work with other regional or state organizations as necessary, to educate users, approve tivities, provide leadership for proper training for all users in the use of the CIS systems and e requirements of this policy, establish a system to insure adequate supervision of the CIS stems, maintain executed user agreements, and interpret and enforce this policy.
- 2. The Director of Instructional Technology and Director of Administrative Services and/or designee will establish a process for setting-up individual and class accounts, set quotas for disk usage on the system, establish a document retention and destruction policy and schedule to include electronically stored information (see School District Policy #801), and establish the School District virus protection process.
- 3. Unless otherwise denied for cause, student access to the CIS systems resources shall be through supervision by the professional staff. Administrators, teachers and staff have the responsibility to work together to help students develop the skills and judgment required to make effective and appropriate use of the resources. All users have the responsibility to respect the rights of all other users within the School District and School District CIS systems, and to abide by the rules established by the School District, its ISP, local, state and federal laws.

#### 6. Guidelines

### 815. ACCEPTABLE USE OF THE COMPUTERS, NETWORK, INTERNET, ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION SYSTEMS – Pg. 7

### 1. Access to the CIS Systems

- a. CIS systems user accounts will be used only by authorized owners of the accounts for authorized purposes.
- b. An account will be made available according to a procedure developed by appropriate School District authorities.
- c. <u>CIS System</u>. The School District's Acceptable Use of the Computers, Network, Internet, Electronic Communications and Information Systems Policy, as well as other relevant School District policies, will govern use of the School District's CIS systems for users.
  - d. Types of Services include, but are not limited to:
- (1) <u>World Wide Web</u>. School District employees, students, and Guests will have access to the Web through the School District's CIS systems as needed.
- (2) <u>E-Mail</u>. School District employees may be assigned individual e-mail accounts for work related use, as needed. Students may be assigned individual e-mail accounts, as necessary, by the Director of Instructional Technology and Director of Administrative Services and/or designee, and at the recommendation of the teacher who will also supervise the students' use of the e-mail service.
- (3) Guest Accounts. Guests may receive an individual web account with the approval of the Director of Instructional Technology and Director of Administrative Services and/or designee if there is a specific School District-related purpose requiring such access. Use of the CIS systems by a guest must be specifically limited to the School District-related purpose and comply with this Policy and all other School District policies, procedures and rules, as well as Internet Service Provider ("ISP") terms, local, state and federal laws and may not damage the School District's CIS systems. An agreement between the School District and a Guest, and a parental signature will be required if the Guest is a minor.
- (4) <u>Blogs</u>. Employees may be permitted to have School District-sponsored blogs, after they receive training, and the approval of the School District. All Bloggers must follow the rules provided in this policy and other applicable policies, regulations and rules of the School District.
- (5) Web 2.0 Second Generation Web-based Services. Certain School District authorized Second Generation Web-based services, such as social networking sites, wikis, podcasts, RSS feeds, social software, folksonomies and collaboration tools that emphasize online educational collaboration and sharing among users may be permitted by the School District, however, such use must be approved by the Director of Instructional Technology and Director of Administrative Services, or designee, followed by training authorized by the School District. Users must comply with this Policy as well as any other relevant policy, regulations, and rules during such use.

### 815. ACCEPTABLE USE OF THE COMPUTERS, NETWORK, INTERNET, ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION SYSTEMS – Pg. 8

e. Access to all data on, taken from, or compiled using School District computers is subject to inspection and discipline. Users have no right to expect that School District information placed on users' personal computers, networks, Internet, and electronic communications systems is beyond the access of the School District. The School District reserves the right to legally access users' personal technology devices brought onto the School District's property, or to School District events, or connected to the School District's network, when the School District reasonably believes they contain School District information or contain information that violates a School District Policy, or contain information/data that the School District reasonably believes involves a criminal activity.

#### 2. Parental Notification and Responsibility

The School District will notify the parents about the School District CIS systems and the policies governing their use. This policy contains restrictions on accessing inappropriate material. There is a wide range of material available on the Internet, some of which may not be fitting with the particular values of the families of the students. It is not practically possible for the School District to monitor and enforce a wide range of social values in student use of the Internet. Further, the School District recognizes that parents bear primary responsibility for transmitting their particular set of family values to their children. The School District will encourage parents to specify to their child(ren) what material is and is not acceptable for their child(ren) to access through the School's District's CIS system. Parents are responsible for monitoring their children's use of the School District's CIS systems when they are accessing the systems.

#### 3. School District Limitation of Liability

The School District makes no warranties of any kind, either expressed or implied, that the functions or the services provided by or through the School Districts CIS systems will be error-free or without defect. The School District does not warrant the effectiveness of Internet filtering. The electronic information available to users does not imply endorsement of the content by the School District, nor is the School District responsible for the accuracy or quality of the information obtained through or stored on the CIS systems. The School District shall not be responsible for any damage users may suffer, including but not limited to, information that may be lost, damaged, delayed, misdelivered, or unavailable when using the computers, network and electronic communications systems. The School District shall not be responsible for material that is retrieved through the Internet or the consequences that may result from them. The School District shall not be responsible for any unauthorized financial obligations, charges or fees resulting from access to the School District's CIS systems. In no event shall the School District be liable to the user for any damages whether direct, indirect, special or consequential, arising out the use of the CIS systems.

#### 4. Prohibitions

The use of the School District's CIS systems for illegal, inappropriate, unacceptable, or unethical purposes by users is prohibited. Such activities engaged in by users are strictly

prohibited and illustrated below. The School District reserves the right to determine if any activity not appearing in the list below constitutes an acceptable or unacceptable use of the CIS systems.

These prohibitions are in effect any time School District resources are accessed whether on School District property, when using mobile commuting equipment, telecommunication facilities in unprotected areas or environments, directly from home, or indirectly through another ISP, and if relevant, when an employee or student uses their own equipment.

Students are prohibited from visually possessing and using their personal computers, as defined in this policy, on School District premises and property (including but not limited to, buses and other vehicles), at School District events, or through connection to the School District CIS systems, unless expressed permission has been granted by a teacher or administrator, who will then assume the responsibility to supervise the student in its use, or, unless an IEP team determines otherwise, in which case, an employee will supervise the student in its use. Thus, users are prohibited from using cellphones with or without Internet access and/or recording, and/or camera/video, and other capabilities and configurations. Cameras, and the like may not be used to take images of others, transfer them, or place them on web sites without the consent of the building administrator. Students who are performing volunteer fire company, ambulance or rescue squad functions, or need such a computer due to their medical condition, or the medical condition of a member of their family, with notice and the approval of the school administrator may qualify for an exemption of this prohibition.

#### a. General Prohibitions

Users are prohibited from using School District CIS systems to:

- (1) Communicate about non-work or non-school related communications.
- (2) Send, receive, view, download, access or transmit material that is harmful to minors, indecent, obscene, pornographic, child pornographic, terroristic, or advocates the destruction of property.
- (3) Send, receive, view, download, access or transmit inappropriate matter and material likely to be offensive or objectionable to recipients including, but not limited to, that which may be defamatory, inaccurate, obscene, sexually explicit, lewd, hateful, harassing, discriminatory (as it pertains to race, color, religion, national origin, gender, marital status, age, sexual orientation, political beliefs, receipt of financial aid, or disability), violent, vulgar, rude, inflammatory, threatening, profane, pornographic, offensive, terroristic and/or illegal.
  - (4) Cyberbully another individual or entity.
  - (5) Access or transmit gambling, pools for money, including but not limited to,

basketball and football, or any other betting or games of chance.

- (6) Participate in discussion or news groups that cover inappropriate and/or objectionable topics or materials, including those that conform to the definition of inappropriate matter in this policy.
- (7) Send terroristic threats, hateful mail, harassing communications, discriminatory remarks, and offensive or inflammatory communications.
- (8) Participate in unauthorized Internet Relay Chats, instant messaging communications and Internet voice communications (on-line; real-time conversations) that are not for school-related purposes or required for employees to perform their job duties. Students must obtain consent from their teacher to use IRCs, however, they may not use instant messaging or text messaging. Employees may only use instant messaging if consent was obtained from the Director of Instructional Technology.
  - (9) Facilitate any illegal activity.
- (10) Communicate through e-mail for non-educational purposes or activities. The use of e-mail to mass mail non-educational or non-work related information is expressly prohibited (for example, the use of the "everyone distribution list, building level distribution lists, or other e-mail distributions lists to offer personal items for sale is prohibited).
- (11) Engage in commercial, for-profit, or any business purposes (except where such activities are otherwise permitted or authorized under applicable School District policies); conduct unauthorized fund raising or advertising on behalf of the School District and non-school School District organizations; resale of School District computer resources to individuals or organizations; or use the School District's name in any unauthorized manner that would reflect negatively on the School District, its employees, or students. *Commercial purposes* is defined as offering or providing goods or services or purchasing goods or services for personal use. School District acquisition policies will be followed for School District purchase of goods or supplies through the School District system.
  - (12) Engage in political lobbying.
- (13) Install, distribute, reproduce or use copyrighted software on School District computers, or copy School District software to unauthorized computer systems, intentionally infringing upon the intellectual property rights of others or violating a copyright. See Section 8 Copyright Infringement in this Policy and the School District's Copyright Policy #\_\_\_\_ and Copyright Guidelines Handbook for additional information.
- (14) Install computer hardware, peripheral devices, network hardware or system hardware. The authority to install hardware or devices on School District computers is restricted to the Director of Instructional Technology and Director of Administrative Services or designee.
  - (15) Encrypt messages using encryption software that is not authorized by the

School District from any access point on School District equipment or School District

- property. Users must use School District approved encryption to protect the confidentiality of sensitive or critical information in the School District's approved manner.
- (16) Access, interfere, possess, or distribute confidential or private information without permission of the School District's administration. An example includes accessing other students' accounts to obtain their grades.
  - (17) Violate the privacy or security of electronic information.
- (18) Send any School District information to another party, except in the ordinary course of business as necessary or appropriate for the advancement of the School District's business, or educational interest.
  - (19) Send unsolicited commercial electronic mail messages, also known as spam.
  - (20) Post personal or professional web pages without administrative approval.
  - (21) Post anonymous messages.
- (22) Use the name of the "East Stroudsburg Area School District" in any form in web blogs ("blogs"), on School District Internet pages or websites not owned or related to the School District, or in forums/discussion boards to express or imply the position of the School District without the expressed, written permission of the Superintendent. When such permission is granted, the posting must state that the statement does not represent the position of the School District.
- (23) Bypass or attempt to bypass Internet filtering software by any method including, but not limited to, the use of anonymizers/proxies or any websites that mask the content the user is accessing or attempting to access.
- (24) Advocate illegal drug use, whether expressed or through a latent pro-drug message. This does not include a restriction of political or social commentary on issues, such as the wisdom of the war on drugs or medicinal use.
- (25) Attempt to and/or obtain personal information under false pretenses with the intent to defraud another person.

#### b. Access and Security Prohibitions

Users must immediately notify the Director of Instructional Technology and Director of Administrative Services and/or designee if they have identified a possible security problem. Users must read, understand, provide a signed acknowledgement form(s), and comply with this policy that includes network, Internet usage, electronic communications, telecommunications, non-disclosure and physical and information security policies. The following activities related to access to the School District's CIS systems, and

information are prohibited:

- (1) Misrepresentation (including forgery) of the identity of a sender or source of communication.
- (2) Acquiring or attempting to acquire passwords of another. Users will be held responsible for the result of any misuse of users' names or passwords while the users' systems access were left unattended and accessible to others, whether intentional or through negligence.
- (3) Using or attempting to use computer accounts of others, these actions are illegal, even with consent, or if only for the purpose of "browsing".
- (4) Altering a communication originally received from another person or computer with the intent to deceive.
- (5) Using School District resources to engage in any illegal act, which may threaten the health, safety or welfare of any person or persons, such as arranging for a drug sale or the purchase of alcohol, engaging in criminal activity, or being involved in a terroristic threat against any person or property.
- (6) Disabling or circumventing any School District security, program or device, for example, but not limited to, anti-spyware, anti-spam software, and virus protection software or procedures.
- (7) Transmitting electronic communications anonymously or under an alias unless authorized by the School District.
- (8) Users must protect and secure all electronic resources and information, data and records of the School District from theft and inadvertent disclosure to unauthorized individuals or entities when they are under the supervision and control of the School District, and when they are not under the supervision and control of the School District, for example, but not limited to, working at home, on vacation or elsewhere. If any user becomes aware of the release of School District information, data or records, the release must be reported to the Superintendent immediately. See the School District's Data Breach Policy #830.1 for further information.

#### c. Operational Prohibitions

The following operational activities and behaviors are prohibited:

(1) Interference with or disruption of the CIS systems, network accounts, services or equipment of others, including, but not limited to, the propagation of computer "worms" and "viruses", Trojan Horse and trapdoor program code, the sending of electronic chain mail, distasteful jokes, and the inappropriate sending of "broadcast" messages to large numbers of individuals or hosts. The user may not hack or crack the network or others' computers, whether by parasiteware or spyware designed to steal information, or viruses and worms or other hardware or software designed to damage the CIS systems, or any

component of the network, or strip or harvest information, or completely take over a

person's computer, or to "look around".

- (2) Altering or attempting to alter files, system security software or the systems without authorization.
  - (3) Unauthorized scanning of the CIS systems for security vulnerabilities.
- (4) Attempting to alter any School District computing or networking components (including, but not limited to fileservers, bridges, routers, or hubs) without authorization or beyond one's level of authorization.
- (5) Unauthorized wiring, including attempts to create unauthorized network connections, or any unauthorized extension or re-transmission of any computer, electronic communications systems, or network services, whether wired, wireless, cable, or by other means.
  - (6) Connecting unauthorized hardware and devices to the CIS systems.
- (7) Loading, downloading, or use of unauthorized games, programs, files, or other electronic media, including, but not limited to, downloading music files.
- (8) Intentionally damaging or destroying the integrity of the School District's electronic information.
  - (9) Intentionally destroying the School District's computer hardware or software.
  - (10) Intentionally disrupting the use of the CIS systems.
- (11) Damaging the School District's CIS systems, networking equipment through the users' negligence or deliberate act.
- (12) Failing to comply with requests from appropriate teachers or School District administrators to discontinue activities that threaten the operation or integrity of the CIS systems.

#### 5. Content Guidelines

Information electronically published on the School District's CIS systems shall be subject to the following guidelines:

- a. Published documents including but not limited to audio and video clips or conferences, may not include a student's date of birth, Social Security number, driver's license number, financial information, credit card number, health information, phone number(s), street address, or box number, name (other than first name) or the names of other family members without parental consent.
  - b. Documents, web pages, electronic communications, or videoconferences may

not include personally identifiable information that indicates the physical location of a

student at a given time without parental consent.

- c. Documents, web pages, electronic communications, or videoconferences may not contain objectionable materials or point directly or indirectly to objectionable materials.
- d. Documents, web pages and electronic communications, must conform to all School District policies and guidelines, including the School District's Copyright Policy, #814.
- e. Documents to be published on the Internet must be edited and approved according to School District procedures before publication.

#### 6. Due Process

- a. The School District will cooperate with the School District's ISP rules, local, state, and federal officials to the extent legally required in investigations concerning or relating to any illegal activities conducted through the School District's CIS systems.
- b. If students or employees possess due process rights for discipline resulting from the violation of this policy, they will be provided such rights.
- c. The School District may terminate the account privileges by providing notice to the user.

#### 7. Search and Seizure

- a. Users' violations of this Policy, any other School District policy, or the law may be discovered by routine maintenance and monitoring of the School District system, or any method stated in this policy, or pursuant to any legal means.
- b. The School District reserves the right to monitor, track, log and access any electronic communications, including but not limited to, Internet access and e-mails at any time for any reason. Users should not have the expectation of privacy in their use of the School District's CIS systems, and other School District technology, even if they use the CIS system for personal reasons. Further, the School District reserves the right, but not the obligation, to legally access any personal technology device of students and employees brought onto the School District's property or to School District events, or connected to the School District network, containing School District programs or School District or student data (including images, files, and other information) to insure compliance with this policy and other School District policies, to protect the School District's resources, to obtain information/data that the School District reasonably believes involves criminal activity.
  - c. Everything that users place in their personal files should be written as if a

#### 8. Copyright Infringement and Plagiarism

- a. Federal laws, cases, and guidelines pertaining to copyright will govern the use of material accessed through the School District resources. Users will make a standard practice of requesting permission from the holder of the work and complying with license agreements. Employees will instruct users to respect copyrights, request permission when appropriate, and comply with license agreements. Employees will respect and comply as well.
- b. Violations of copyright law can be a felony and the law allows a court to hold individuals personally responsible for infringing the law. The School District does not permit illegal acts pertaining to the copyright law. Therefore, any user violating the copyright law does so at their own risk and assumes all liability.
- c. Violations of copyright law include, but are not limited to, the making of unauthorized copies of any copyrighted material (such as commercial software, text, graphic images, audio and video recording), distributing copyrighted materials over computer networks, and deep-linking and framing into the content of others' web sites. Further, the illegal installation of copyrighted software or files for use on the School District's computers is expressly prohibited. This includes all forms of licensed software shrink-wrap, clickwrap, browsewrap, and electronic software downloaded from the Internet.
- d. School District guidelines on plagiarism will govern use of material accessed through the School District's CIS systems. Users will not plagiarize works that they find. Teachers will instruct students in appropriate research and citation practices.

#### 9. Selection of Material

- a. School District policies on the selection of materials will govern use of the School District's CIS systems.
- b. When using the Internet for class activities, teachers will select material that is appropriate in light of the age of the students and that is relevant to the course objectives. Teachers will preview the materials and web sites they require or recommend students access to determine the appropriateness of the material contained on or accessed through the web site. Teachers will provide guidelines and lists of resources to assist their students in channeling their research activities effectively and properly. Teachers will assist their students in developing the critical thinking skills necessary to ascertain the truthfulness of information, distinguish fact from opinion, and engage in discussions about controversial issues while demonstrating tolerance and respect for those who hold divergent views.

#### 10. School District Web Site

The School District will establish and maintain a Web Site and will develop and modify its Web pages that will present information about the School District under the direction of the Director of Instructional Technology and Director of Administrative Services and/or designee. Publishers must comply with this policy, and other School District policies, for example, the School District's Web Site Development Policy, #815.1.

#### 11. Blogging

- a. If an employee, student or Guest creates a blog with their own resources, the employee, student, or Guest may not violate the privacy rights of employees and students, may not use School District personal and private information/data, images and copyrighted material in their blog, and may not disrupt the School District.
- b. Conduct otherwise will result in actions further described in Section 13 of this Policy and provided in relevant School District policies.

#### 12. Safety and Privacy

- a. To the extent legally required, users of the School District's CIS systems will be protected from harassment or commercially unsolicited electronic communication. Any user who receives threatening or unwelcome communications must immediately sent or take them to the Director of Instructional Technology and Director of Administrative Services and/or designee.
- b. Users will not post personal contact information about themselves or other people on the CIS systems. The user may not steal another's identity in any way, may not use spyware, cookies, or use School District or personnel technology or resources in any way to invade one's privacy. Additionally, the user may not disclose, use or disseminate confidential and personal information about students or employees (examples include, but are not limited to, using a PDA, iPod, MP3; cellphone with camera/video and Internet access to take pictures of anything, including but not limited to, persons, places, and documents relevant to the School District, saving, storing and sending the image with or without text or disclosing them by any means, including but not limited to, print and electronic matter; revealing student grades, Social Security numbers, dates of birth, home addresses, telephone numbers, school addresses, work addresses, credit card numbers, health and financial information, evaluations, psychological reports, educational records, reports, and resumes or other information relevant to seeking employment at the School District unless legitimately authorized to do so).
- c. Student users will agree not to meet with someone they have met online unless they have parental consent.

## Consequences for Inappropriate, Unauthorized and Illegal Use

- General rules for behavior, ethics, and communications apply when using the a. CIS systems and information, in addition to the stipulations of this policy. Users must be aware that violations of this policy or other policies, or for unlawful use of the CIS systems may result in loss of CIS access and a variety of other disciplinary actions, including but not limited to, warnings, usage restrictions, loss of privileges, position reassignment, oral or written reprimands, suspensions (with or without pay for employees), dismissals, expulsions, and/or legal proceedings on a case-by-case basis. This policy incorporates all other relevant School District policies, such as, but not limited to, the student and professional employee discipline policies, copyright policy, property policy, curriculum policies, terroristic threat policy, and harassment policies.
- The user is responsible for damages to the network, equipment, electronic communications systems, and software resulting from negligent, deliberate and willful acts. The user will also be responsible for incidental or unintended damage resulting from negligent, willful or deliberate violations of this policy. For example, users will be responsible for payments related to lost or stolen computers and/or School District equipment and recovery and/or breach of data contained on them.
- Violations as described in this policy may be reported to the School District, c. appropriate legal authorities, whether the ISP, local, state, or federal law enforcement. The School District will cooperate to the extent legally required with authorities in all such investigations.
- d. Vandalism will result in cancellation of access to the School District's CIS systems and resources and is subject to discipline.

#### 815.1 WEB SITE DEVELOPMENT

## 1. Purpose

The availability of Internet access in the East Stroudsburg Area School District ("School District") provides an opportunity for students and staff to contribute to the School District's presence in the World Wide Web. The School District's web site provides information to the world about school curriculum, instruction, school-authorized activities, and other general information related to our schools and School District's mission.

The web pages also serve as links to educational resources on the Intranet and Internet for students and staff to access. Internet access for the creation of web pages is provided by the Superintendent and designee(s). Creators of web pages need to familiarize themselves with and adhere to the following policies and responsibilities. Failure to follow these policies or responsibilities may result in the loss of authoring privileges and a variety of other discipline actions, including but not limited to oral or written reprimands, suspensions with or without pay, and dismissal, on a case-by-case basis. In addition, the School District will cooperate to the extent legally required with the Internet service providers, as well as local, state and federal law enforcement officials.

#### 2. Authority

The web site, including its content, is the property of the School District. The School District reserves the right to deny access and to track, log and search in order to prevent unauthorized, inappropriate or illegal activity. The School District will cooperate to the extent legally required with the Internet service providers, as well as local, state and federal law enforcement officials in any investigation concerning or related to the misuse of the web site.

# 3. Delegation of Responsibility

The Superintendent / or designee will serve as the coordinator to oversee the use of the School District's web site, network and systems, and will work with other regional or state organizations, as necessary.

The Superintendent / or designee, will serve as the coordinator for the School District's system, will approve activities, insure teachers and students receive proper training in the use of the web site and the requirements of this policy, maintain executed agreements, and be responsible for interpreting the School District's acceptable use policy, web site policy, copyright policy, document retention and destruction policy, data breach policy, web site privacy policy and web site terms of use.

Students and teachers may request that specific content, including but not limited to, curriculum information, educational articles, School District data, school-related activities, and School District events, be placed on the School District's web site. Such requests must be submitted to the Director of Instructional Technology, who will review and approve or deny the request. If approved, the Director of Instructional Technology will send this request to the webmaster for approval, and the Superintendent / or designee for approval. The Superintendent of the School District will be the final decision maker, if necessary. Access codes to upload pages will be assigned to designated personnel by the Superintendent. No personal pages for employees and students are permitted on the School District's web site.

No other agency or organization or educational institution may maintain a presence on the School District web site without the knowledge and approval of the Superintendent. The web site is for School District use only.

#### 4. Guidelines

#### 1. Operation and Management

The Superintendent / or designee is ultimately responsible for the operation and management of the design, function, maintenance, use, technical, regulatory, content and compliance aspects of the web site. All personnel and students are responsible for following the below web site guidelines.

Network traffic is monitored to insure that the service remains available and complies with the law and policies. Attempts to upload or change information, or otherwise cause damage to the School District services is strictly prohibited and punishable under applicable laws and policies.

#### 2. Content Standards

#### a. Access and Publication

- 1) The Superintendent / or designee shall have the authority and responsibility, but not the obligation, to review, approve, post, add, delete, and modify pages to the site, and with other administrators, develop administrative guidelines for this policy. The Superintendent / or designee shall determine personnel and means for accomplishing these tasks. These personnel shall be trained in the School District web page policies and guidelines.
- 2) Publishers who have content publication requests denied or who have content removed from a web page first may appeal to the Director of Instructional Technology, then to the Superintendent of the School District to have the content placed or reinstated on the web site. The content in question shall remain unpublished until the review process is completed.
- 3) Publishing web pages on the School District server(s) is a privilege not a right.

#### b. Content Accuracy

- 1) The Superintendent / or designee will make every effort to insure that the online information is accurate, true, and up-to-date to the best of the ability of the School District. There is no absolute guarantee that the web site content is the most updated version given the rapid changes of today, and the numerous sources contributing content to the web site.
- While every effort has been made to insure that the content, information, and material on the School District's web site are accurate, true and up-to-date, users are advised to check with the School District's technology department on the most updated information regarding communications and services before relying on them or making a decision.

#### c. Limitation of Liability

The material and information contained on or obtained from the School District's web site are distributed "as is" and "as available" without warranties of any kind, either expressed or implied, including without limitation, warranties of title or implied warranties of merchantability of fitness for a particular purpose. Information contained on the School District's web site, including information obtained from external links thereon, is provided without any representation of any kind as to accuracy or content and should be verified by the user. The School District is not responsible for any special, indirect, incidental or consequential damages that may arise from the use of, or the inability to use, the web site and/or the materials contained on the site whether the materials contained on the web site are provided by the School District, or by a third party. Data contained on the web site are subject to change without notice.

# d. Subject Matter

- 1) All subject matter on the School District's web pages must relate to the School District and be approved by the School District.
- 2) The Superintendent / or designee is responsible for coordinating the School District's web pages and will determine the structure. Staff members approved for access will be given access passwords by the Superintendent / or designee.
- a) Material by individuals and student organizations on web pages must relate to educational thoughts, interests, and activities, must be educational, and is subject to the principal's review. Such web pages do not implicitly or explicitly represent the School District's position, or policy, nor are they endorsed or sanctioned by the School District. By posting information on the School District web site, individuals assume responsibility and liability for the content of their pages.
  - b) Individuals are solely responsible for obtaining appropriate



permission to include copyrighted materials or images on their pages; the School District assumes no responsibility for individual's failure to fulfill this responsibility. Any comments or feedback should be addressed to the individual responsible. Concern about the content of any page(s) created by students or staff should be directed to the Superintendent.

#### e. Links to Content

- 1) Any links must relate to professional, non-profit, educational organizations that are appropriate, or they must relate to the School District. No other links may be included on the School District's web site.
- 2) Web page links may not include entities whose primary purpose is commercial or political advertising, nor may they contain endorsements or preferential treatment on products or on political advertising.
  - 3) The web site must state:

"The links in this area will let you leave the School District web site. The linked sites are not under the control of the School District, and the School District is not responsible for the content or accuracy of any linked site or any link contained in a linked site, or any changes or updates to such sites. The School District is providing these links to you only as a convenience, and the inclusion of any link does not imply endorsement of the site by the School District."

- 4) Students, staff, and individuals may not use the School District's web pages to provide access to their personal pages on other servers or online services. Neither the School District nor technical services personnel will provide technical support for personal web pages.
- 5) No link may be made to inappropriate material as defined in the School District's Acceptable Use Policy.
- 6) No link may be made to advertising, commercial, and political lobbying web sites or pages.

#### f. Quality

- 1) All web pages must be timely, accurate, accessible and well presented, this includes being free of spelling and grammatical errors. All content published on the web site must meet standards of spelling, grammar, adequate research, or other qualitative measures.
  - 2) Documents may not contain any obvious or hidden objectionable

material or link to such objectionable material. *Objectionable material* is defined as material that does not meet the standards for instructional resources specified in any and all School District policies.

3) The judgment of the Superintendent / or designee, or School District administration will prevail when questions of quality or propriety of web page material, appearance or content are asked.

#### g. Ownership and Retention of Content

#### Content Created by School District Students and Employees

- 1) The web site, its content and all web pages created by students and employees located on the School District's server(s), are the property of the School District, shall remain the property of the School District and may not be sold, transferred, licensed, leased, or otherwise distributed outside of the School District without the Superintendent's approval.
- 2) Students and employees must warrant to the School District that they secured the necessary consents, releases and licenses for the use of content, including without limitation, text, pictures, audio, video, logos and copy distribution, display, performance over the World Wide Web and to create derivative works.
- 3) A copyright notice must be placed on all copyrightable, intellectual and artistic publications placed on the web site.

#### Content Created by Third Parties

- 1) The School District is in no way responsible for the accuracy, truth, completeness and timeliness of the information whose intellectual property belongs to or is supplied by third parties.
- 2) The School District is not directly or indirectly liable for any damage or injury (financial or non-financial) caused to anyone due to his/her reliance on third party information. If such information is supplied by someone else (such as name, address, phone number and other information), it will be subject to privacy law and regulations and will not be disclosed to any unauthorized party without the consent of the individual concerned.

#### 3. Software

a. Students and employees are prohibited from downloading, duplicating and/or distributing the software and custom code (source code and object code) including any derivations or modifications or from using it for any purpose without the consent of the Superintendent.

- b. Web pages may be deleted when a student graduates or employee moves unless prior arrangements have been made with the Superintendent / or designee.
- c. The School District shall maintain a backup copy of the web site that includes both the object code and source code versions, and at least one copy of all specifications and documentations of the web site.

## 4. <u>Student Safeguards</u>

- a. Web page documents may include only the first name or first name and the initial of the student's last name if consent is provided by the parent(s).
- b. Documents may not include a student's phone numbers, home address, name or other family members, or names of friends.
- c. Web page documents may not include any information that indicates the physical location of a student at a given time, other than participation in School District activities.
- d. Photographic images and the voices of students in any form, including video and audio clips, may not be published on any server accessible beyond the firewall border of the School District without parental consent. Internal web servers are excluded from this proviso.
- e. Submissions of student work, including but not limited to, quotes, written material, graphics and artwork for publication on any non-School District server shall require permission of the parent or guardian. If replies to published student work are appropriate, the sponsoring teacher's address must be the e-mail address displayed, not the student's.
- f. No administrator's, supervisor's, or employee's information may be posted on the web site for students whose parents have not provided written consent.
- g. Published e-mail addresses shall be restricted to those of staff members. Staff members may choose not to have their e-mail address "hot linked" on web publications. Images of a staff member may be published only with the consent of the staff member. Caution should be exhibited in identifying a teacher with specific students.
- h. Posted student work must relate to class projects, course or other school-related information activity and any posting is subject to copyright and student records legal requirements.
- i. Group photographs (without any individually identifiable identity) may be used to share School District activities.



## 5. School Board Policies

All information on the School District's server(s) must comply with School Board Policies and Regulations, as well as established school guidelines. Copies of Board Policies are available in the Central Administration Office. Persons under the control of the School District who develop or maintain web documents are responsible for complying with the policies, and the applicable laws. Some of the relevant issues and related Board Policies include the following:

- a. Electronic transmission of materials is a form of copying. As specified in the School District's Copyright Policy, no unlawful copies of copyrighted materials may be knowingly produced or transmitted via the School District's equipment, including its web server(s). In all aspects of the use of the web site, copyright laws must be followed.
- b. Documents created for the web site and linked to School District web pages must meet the criteria for use as an instructional resource within the School District's curriculum.
- c. Persons under the control of the School District who link to School District web pages that are <u>not</u> specifically curriculum-related must meet the criteria established in this policy and in the School District's Acceptable Use Policy.
- d. All communications throughout the School District web pages must comply with the School District Acceptable Use Policy, the School District Code of Conduct Policy, and all other School District policies. If the Superintendent / or designee has any doubt about compliance with the laws, (s)he should contact the Superintendent of the School District and, if appropriate, the solicitor for information, advice and guidance.
- e. Student information communicated through the School District web pages must comply with School District policies on data privacy and the Collection, Maintenance and Dissemination of Student Records.
- f. Any deliberate tampering with or misuse of School District web site services or equipment will be considered vandalism and will be handled in accordance with the School District's Acceptable Use Policy, the School District Code of Conduct Policy, and other relevant policies, and applicable law.
- g. Linking from the School District web site, including but not limited to, hyperlinking, framing, and deeplinking, may violate the law and may be offensive to the School District's quality of its web site. Any consideration of the use of "frame" technology to connect to external sites must be reviewed considering its legality before establishing such links. Developers may not violate the copyrights, trademarks and the patents of others, and must comply with the School District's Copyright Policy.

#### 6. <u>Technical Standards</u>

In the interest of using information technology to communicate clear, efficient, and effective messages, the web site must be maintained with a consistent identity, professional appearance, and for ease of use and maintenance. The following technical standards are established for all School District web pages. Each web page added to the School District web site must contain certain common elements.

- a. If the web site collects any information about usage or other log files, visitors shall be notified of what information is collected, why it is collected, and how it is used. If information is collected, the School District may not sell or give any of the information to any other person or entity, unless permitted by law or with the consent of the parent(s). The School District may choose to not collect any information from visitors.
- b. The basic School District home page will have a common architecture as outlined below:
  - 1) the mission statement
  - 2) a Webmaster e-mail link
  - 3) a calendar of events
  - 4) pertinent information for contacting staff
  - 5) a link to return to the School District's page
- 6) at the bottom of the home page there must be links to the web site Terms of Use and Privacy Policy
- c. At the bottom of the page, there must be a link that returns the user to appropriate points in the School District web pages. This would normally be through a return to the School District home page or use of a back button on the browser.
- d. The School District home page must included a copyright statement for all succeeding pages within the entire School District site.

e. The School District may develop additional consistency standards as the need arises.

- f. Standard formatting will be used and browser friendly HTML editors or word processor programs that save files as HTML files may be used.
- g. The authorized designee who is publishing a final web page(s) for herself or himself, or for a student, will edit and test the page(s) for accuracy of links, and check for conformance with standards outlined in this policy. In addition, the contributor will assume responsibility for updating the links as needed.
- h. All web pages must be given names that clearly identify them. The names of all documents shall coincide with current School District naming practices and structures.
- i. Pages may not contain links to other pages that are not yet completed. If further pages are anticipated but not yet developed, the text that will provide the link should be included but may not be made "hot" until the further page is actually in place.
- j. All graphics should be in GIF or JPEG format. Other formats, including sound or video, may be used only and after consultation with the Superintendent / or designee.
- k. Web pages may not contain any student e-mail address links, any survey-response links, or any other type of direct-response links.
- l. All School District web site publications will reside solely on the School District's network server. All web pages shall be linked to other School District pages in relation to their current location on the server(s). All web pages for the School District will be located on one web server.
- m. Final decisions regarding access to active web pages for editing content or organization will rest with the Superintendent of the School District and the Superintendent / or designee, with input from Administrative staff.
- n. External links from the School District web site must be approved by the Superintendent / or designee.
- o. Metatags and metadata may be used on key pages to help the pages to be found with search engines and to also be correctly annotated in the search summary.
- p. Web pages should be designed with everyone in mind, including people with no or low vision, deafness, learning disabilities or color blindness. Be considerate of all users, including those using assistive technologies, such screen readers or Braille readers.
- q. Given the rapid change in technology, some of the technical standards outlined in this policy may require change throughout the year. The Superintendent / or designee will make changes with the approval of the Superintendent of the School District, as

needed. This Web Site Development Policy will be updated on an as need basis.

The Superintendent / or designee will annually conduct a web site audit to check the system and processes, facilities, security measures, operation implementation, access, resources utilized, and whether the web site complies with and does not breach any relevant laws.

DATA BREACH

ADOPTED: December 17, 2007

#### 830.1 DATA BREACH

#### 1. Policy

It is the policy of the East Stroudsburg Area School District ("School District") that employees comply with the Pennsylvania mandated identity theft prevention laws and School District data breach procedures. Employees are required to protect the sensitive personally identifiable information about students, employees and others from inadvertent, negligent and willful disclosure or breach of such information, data or records. Violation of this Policy may result in corrective action up to and including termination.

#### 2. Procedures

<u>Data Breach Notification</u>. All employees must protect and secure all electronic resources and information, data and records of the School District from theft, and inadvertent disclosure when they are under the supervision and control of the School District, and when they not under the supervision or control of the School District, for example, but not limited to, working at home, on vacation, or elsewhere.

If any employee becomes aware of the release of School District information, data or records the release must be reported to the Superintendent or designee immediately.

# 3. Supervisory Guidelines

If there is a breach of security of the information, data, or records of the School District, the School District must disclose any breach of security of computerized records after discovery or notification of the breach to any Pennsylvania resident whose personal information was, or is reasonably believed to have been accessed by an unauthorized person.

Personal information includes the first name or first initial and last name in combination with and linked to any one or more of the following: (1) social security number; (2) driver's license number or State identification card number; and (3) financial account number or credit or debit card number, in combination with any required security code, access code, or password that would permit access to an individual's financial account. Personal information does not include publicly available information that is lawfully made available to the general public from federal, state or local government records.

Before disclosing a breach of security the School District must report the breach of security and any information pertaining to the breach to the local or state law enforcement agency for investigation or handling in advance of the disclosure to the customer, or others. The School District may be required to delay notification if a law enforcement agency determines that the notification will impede a criminal or civil investigation.

#### 830.1 DATA BREACH - Pg. 2

The School District administration must then determine whether a data breach notification will be issued. Notifications may be made through a written notice, telephone notice, electronic notice, or a substitute notice (only if the requirements of the *Pennsylvania Breach of Personal Information Notification Act* are met).

A notice of the security breach must be provided to residents whose unencrypted and unredacted computerized personal information was or is reasonably believed to have been accessed and acquired by an unauthorized person and that the School District believes has or could cause loss or injury.

All records of the School District must be destroyed pursuant to the School District document retention and destruction policy, schedule and procedures. Destruction means shredding, erasing, or modifying the personal information in the records to make them unreadable, undecipherable or non-reconstructionable through generally available means.

### Social Security Number Requirement.

Unless otherwise permitted by law, School District employees must protect the privacy of Social Security numbers.

#### 1. The School District may **not** do any of the following:

- a. Publicly post or publicly display in any manner an individual's Social Security number. "Publicly post" or "publicly display" means to intentionally communicate or otherwise make available the Social Security number to the general public.
- b. Print an individual's Social Security number on any card required for the individual to access products or services provided by School District.
- c. Require an individual to transmit his or her Social Security number over the Internet unless the connection is secure or the Social Security number is encrypted.
- d. Require an individual to use his or her Social Security number to access an Internet website unless a password or unique personal identification number or other authentication device is also required to access the website.
- e. Print an individual's Social Security number on any materials that are mailed to the individual unless Federal or State law requires the Social Security number to be on the document to be mailed. However, Social Security numbers may be included in applications and forms sent by mail, including documents sent as part of an application or enrollment process or to establish, amend or terminate an account, contract or policy or to confirm the accuracy of the Social Security number. A Social Security number that is permitted to be mailed under this section may not be printed, in whole or in part, on a postcard or other mailer not requiring an envelope, or visible on the envelope or without the envelope

having been opened.

- f. Disclose in any manner the Social Security number of an individual who applies for a recreational license (i.e., a fish or game license).
- 2. The School District may continue using an individual's Social Security number in the manner that it used that individual's social security numbers prior to December 26, 2006 if the following conditions are met:
  - a. The use of the Social Security number is continuous. If the use is stopped for any reason Section 1 above applies.
  - b. The individual is provided an annual disclosure that informs the individual that he or she has the right to stop the use of his or her Social Security number in a manner prohibited by Section 1 above.
    - An individual who receives an annual disclosure has the right to stop the use of his or her Social Security number in a manner prohibited by Section 1 above and must exercise that right by submitting a written request to the School District. Employees must discontinue use of the individual's social security number within 30 days of the receipt of the request. There will be no fee or charge for complying with the request. The School District will not deny services to an individual because the individual makes a written request.
- 3. The School District may collect, use, or release a Social Security number as required by federal or state law, or may use the social security number for internal verification, administrative purposes or for law enforcement investigations.

In accordance with the General Conditions, paragraph 4.3.7, the following is our request for an extension of time for the delays associated with the RFP No. 28 revisions to the roof screen steel. RFP No. 28 had a direct impact on the project schedule activity N1X00540 (Phase N1A steel erection). Per the baseline schedule the steel was required to begin on January 2, 2007. This activity is a critical path activity with zero days of float.

We provide the following time line of information and documentation identifying the delays incurred:

- On November 17, 2006, we received TAS email with attached revised drawings S211, S212, RS41 changing the structural steel for the Area "B" roof screen.
- Powell letter dated December 4, 2006, identifies the fact that the steel changes affected sequence 4 and 2. Powell cannot proceed with re-detailing or re-submittal until a change is received.
- December 8, 2006, TAS forwards an email directing us to proceed with additional work.
- On December 27, 2006, the revised shop drawings are re-submitted via email.
- On January 8, 2007, the revised shop drawings are returned to Powell Steel via email.
- As stated in Powell's letter dated December 4, 2006, approximately 6 weeks of fabrication time is needed. As stated in Boro's email dated January 12, 2007, the erection start date is scheduled for February 19, 2007.
- On February 18, 2007, steel was delivered and erection started on February 19, 2007.
