B. Change Order by Wind Gap Electric, Inc.

D. Amy S. Greene Environmental Consultants, Inc. Contract

VI. PRESENTATION -

Mr. Jesse Leib, Northeast Director K-12 of Connect Ed presented a demonstration to the Board on how to keep parents informed instantaneously using electronic media.

- > Message can be weather or safety related.
- > All parents will receive calls within 15 to 20 minutes
- > Program can accommodate 50 70,000 phones and four emails.
- > Calls can be broken up into certain categories, such as sending to only 4th grade PSSA parents or wake up calls to all high school students.
- > The program can run all year long or for specific times.
- > System generates a receipt with date and time of all calls that were accepted, disconnected or busy.
- > Secured system, with user name and passwords allotted to all administrators and principals with secretaries. As of yet no one has hacked into the system; passwords must be secured.
- > System files all messages that can be used again at a later time.
- > You can also contact emergency centers and police.
- > Total cost would be about \$24,000 (plus set up fee) which is \$3 per student; result is cost of less than a penny per day.
