### V. APPROVAL OF MINUTES AND AGENDA

#### VII. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

PFM presented information on options for Bond Issues to the Board. Following opportunity for public comment (none) General Obligation Bonds and January 2004 agenda items (later in these minutes) were acted upon and approved by School Board.

Mr. Lawrence Gasda, Mr. Kevin Nace and Mr. Gregory Naudascher did a presentation of the need for a fourth year of social studies to meet the Pennsylvania Standards and the need for the graduation credits to increase from 24.9 to 25.9. A policy was presented for first reading. All School Board members will be invited to an upcoming meeting requiring an additional credit for high school.

Dr. Koberlein asked the School Board for volunteers to serve on the Ad Hoc Committee For Funds Distribution.

A Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting for the June 30, 2002 Fiscal Year presented to Marie Guidry

Dr. Koberlein asked the School Board for approval of the Condition Orange Draft Letter in regards to over night field trips and field trips with a distance of more than 60 miles.

Dr. Koberlein asked the School Board for a resolution to asked for bids for the East Stroudsburg Elementary Exercise Room. Following public comment opportunity a motion was made by Robert Huffman seconded by Bet Hays and passed to authorize school officials to seek bids for the specified relocatable classroom(s).

Dr. Koberlein addressed the need for a new elementary school at the North Campus. Enrollment figures and other information were presented to the School Board.

Dr. Koberlein gave a presentation on asbestos, federal and state laws and the conditions of High School South. He read a letter from the Pennsylvania Department of Health, which stated, in part "Our review of the information, including the test data on the dust, reveals that no public health threat exists. The asbestos air results are well below standards set by the Environmental Protection Agency. Wayne Thomas of Environmental Abatement Associates, Inc. presented the role of his firm and their work with EPA, Management Plan development, notification, and posting of notifications and staff notifications.

Charles Valunas stated he could not find a copy of the annual notification of EPA's 40 CFR from the Environmental Abatement Associates, Inc. in the District project documentation book.

Rita Stephan asked about the day the heat was not on in the High School South. She stated that she was misinformed about the heat problem.

Kim Dreighton inquired about students attending our schools who do not belong in the district.

Rosemary Shortino questioned the weighting of AP classes at the High School North.

Sherri Safin stated that her daughter is ill everyday, inadequate access to locker/must carry book bag, which is causing her daughter back problems, lavatory problems, and insufficient time to change classes.

Christina Fabijanczuk asked the School Board to have a committee for attendance area discussions and she asked the public to stop "putting down" the North.
