103. NONDISCRIMINATION IN SCHOOL AND CLASSROOM PRACTICES

The Board declares it to be the policy of this district to provide an equal opportunity for all students to achieve their maximum potential through the programs offered in the schools regardless of race, color, age, creed, religion, gender, sexual orientation, ancestry, national origin, marital status, pregnancy or handicap/disability.

The school district shall provide to all students, without discrimination, course offerings, counseling, assistance, employment, athletics and extracurricular activities. The equitable distribution of district resources is one means the district shall use to ensure all students receive a quality education. The district shall make reasonable accommodations for identified physical and mental impairments that constitute handicaps and/or disabilities, consistent with the requirements of federal and state laws and regulations.

The Board encourages students and third parties who have been subject to discrimination to promptly report such incidents to designated employees.

The Board directs that complaints of discrimination shall be investigated promptly, and corrective action be taken when allegations are substantiated. Confidentiality of all parties shall be maintained, consistent with the school district's legal and investigative obligations.

No reprisals nor retaliation shall occur as a result of good faith charges of discrimination.

In order to maintain a program of nondiscrimination practices that is in compliance with applicable laws and regulations, the Board designates the Assistant Superintendent for <u>Personnel Curriculum and Instruction</u> as the district's Compliance Officer.

The Compliance Officer shall publish and disseminate this policy and complaint procedure at least annually to students, parents/guardians, employees and the public. Nondiscrimination statements shall include the position, office address and telephone number of the Compliance Officer.

The Compliance Officer is responsible to monitor the implementation of nondiscrimination

Responsibility

2. Delegation of

procedures in the following areas:

- 1. Curriculum and Materials Review of curriculum guides, textbooks and supplemental materials for discriminatory bias.
- 2. Training Provision of training for students and staff to identify and alleviate problems of discrimination.
- 3. Student Access Review of programs, activities and practices to ensure that all students have equal access and are not segregated except when permissible by law or regulation.
- 4. District Support Assurance that like aspects of the school program receive like support as to staffing and compensation, facilities, equipment, and related matters.
- 5. Student Evaluation Review of tests, procedures and guidance and counseling materials for stereotyping and discrimination.

The building principal or designee shall be responsible to complete the following duties when receiving a complaint of discrimination:

- 1. Inform the student or third party of the right to file a complaint and the complaint procedure.
- 2. Inform the complainant that s/he may be accompanied by a parent/guardian during all steps of the complaint procedure.
- 3. Notify the complainant and the accused of the progress at appropriate stages of the procedure.
- 4. Refer the complainant to the Compliance Officer if the building principal is the subject of the complaint.

3. Guidelines

Complaint Procedure - Student/Third Party

Step 1 – Reporting

A student or third party who believes s/he has been subject to conduct that constitutes a violation of this policy is encouraged to immediately report the incident to the building principal.

A school employee who suspects or is notified that a student has been subject to conduct that constitutes a violation of this policy shall immediately report the incident to the building principal.

If the building principal is the subject of a complaint, the student, third party or employee

The complainant or reporting employee is encouraged to use the report form available from the building principal, but oral complaints shall be acceptable.

Step 2 – Investigation

Upon receiving a complaint of discrimination, the building principal shall immediately notify the Compliance Officer. The Compliance Officer shall authorize the building principal to investigate the complaint, unless the building principal is the subject of the complaint or is unable to conduct the investigation.

The investigation may consist of individual interviews with the complainant, the accused, and others with knowledge relative to the incident. The investigator may also evaluate any other information and materials relevant to the investigation.

The obligation to conduct this investigation shall not be negated by the fact that a criminal investigation of the incident is pending or has been concluded.

Step 3 – Investigative Report

The building principal shall prepare a written report within fifteen (15) days, unless additional time to complete the investigation is required. The report shall include a summary of the investigation, a determination of whether the complaint has been substantiated as factual and whether it is a violation of this policy, and a recommended disposition of the complaint.

The findings of the investigation shall be provided to the complainant, the accused, and the Compliance Officer.

Step 4 – District Action

If the investigation results in a finding that the complaint is factual and constitutes a violation of this policy, the district shall take prompt, corrective action to ensure that such conduct ceases and will not recur.

Disciplinary actions shall be consistent with the Student Code of Conduct, Board policies and district procedures, applicable collective bargaining agreements, and state and federal laws.

Appeal Procedure

- 1. If the complainant is not satisfied with a finding of no violation of the policy or with the corrective action recommended in the investigative report, s/he may submit a written appeal to the Compliance Officer within fifteen (15) days.
- 2. The Compliance Officer shall review the investigation and the investigative report and

may also conduct a reasonable investigation.

3. The Compliance Officer shall prepare a written response to the appeal within fifteen (15) days. Copies of the response shall be provided to the complainant, the accused and the school principal who conducted the initial investigation.

Equivalence Between Schools

20 U.S.C. Sec. 6321

The Board directs that services in Title I schools and programs, when taken as a whole, shall be substantially comparable to services in schools and programs that do not receive Title I funds.

Curriculum materials, instructional supplies and percentages of highly qualified personnel shall be equivalent between all district schools when compared on a grade-span by grade-span basis or a school-by-school basis.

The Board understands that equivalence between programs and schools shall not be measured by:

- 1. Changes in enrollment after the start of the school year.
- 2. Varying costs associated with providing services to students with disabilities.
- 3. Unexpected changes in personnel assignments occurring after the beginning of the school year.
- 4. Expenditures on language instruction education programs.
- 5. Other expenditures from supplemental state or local funds consistent with the intent of Title I.

The district shall develop administrative regulations to implement this policy and shall maintain record documenting compliance that are updated biannually.

200. ENROLLMENT IN DISTRICT

1. Authority SC 1301, 1302 Title 22 Sec. 11.11, 11.41, 12.1 The Board shall enroll school age students eligible to attend the schools of the school district in accordance with Board policy as well as applicable laws and regulations.

2. Definitions SC 1301 Title 22 Sec. 11.12 **School age** shall be defined as the period from the earliest admission age for the school district's kindergarten program until graduation from high school or the end of the school term in which a student reaches the age of twenty-one (21) years, whichever occurs first.

District of residence shall be defined as the school district in which a student's parent(s)/guardian(s) reside(s).

3. Guidelines

504. EMPLOYMENT OF CLASSIFIED SUPPORT EMPLOYEES

1. <u>Authority</u> SC 406. 508 Pol. 528 <u>Purpose</u> The Board recognizes the role that qualified and competent classified support employees contribute to the effective operation of the programs of the school district.

3. Definition

The Board shall, by a majority vote of all members, approve the employment; set the compensation; and establish the term of employment for each classified employee employed by the school district.

For purposes of the 500 Section of Board policy, classified support employees shall be deemed to include the following positions:

Bus Drivers

Business Office Personnel I, II, III

Cafeteria Aides

Cafeteria Workers

Custodians

Health Room Assistant Nurses

Instructional Aides

Maintenance Workers I, II

Mechanics

Media Technicians I, II, III

Secretaries

Student Helpers

Student Hall Monitors and Study Hall Monitors

4. Guidelines

Approval shall normally be given to the candidates for employment recommended by the Superintendent. When any recommended candidate has been rejected by the Board, the Superintendent shall make an alternate recommendation.

No person shall be employed who is related to any member of the Board, as defined in statute, unless such person receives the affirmative vote of a majority of all members of the Board other than the member related to the applicant, who shall not vote.

An employee's knowing misstatement of fact material to qualifications for employment or determination of salary may constitute grounds for dismissal by the Board.

Utilization of The Board authorizes the use of classified support employees prior to employment Board approval by the Board is authorized when necessary to maintain continuity of the educational program and services in the school district.

No candidate shall be employed until such candidate has complied with the mandatory background check requirements for criminal history, child abuse, FBI Criminal History Record and the school district has evaluated the results of that screening process.

Title I Instructional Aide and Student Helper Requirements

707. USE OF FACILITIES

1. Purpose SC 775

The Board recognizes that, although the primary purpose of the school buildings, facilities and property of the school district is to provide students with an appropriate learning environment, the Board may make school facilities available to individuals and community groups for purposes that benefit the community, provided that such use does not interfere with the educational program of the schools.

General Statement

2. Authority SC 511 Title 22 Sec. 12.9

The following shall be the policy of the Board, cognizant of the special needs and interests of the school program and community groups. The Board directs that the use of facilities may be granted to individuals and community groups subject to policies and regulations as adopted by the Board and the school laws of Pennsylvania for the following types of activities:

1. Instruction in any branch of education, learning and the arts that is consistent with the school district's mission.

10 P.S. 311 et seq

- 2. Social, civic and recreational meetings and entertainment, and other uses pertaining to the welfare of the community; but such use shall be non-exclusive and open to the public.
- 3. Polling places for holding primaries, elections and special elections as permitted or required by state law.
- 4. Recreation, physical training and athletics, including competitive athletic contests for children and adults.

SC 775

The Board shall establish a schedule of fees for the use of school facilities by approved groups.

3. Delegation of Responsibility

The Superintendent shall implement procedures for requesting and granting permission for use of school facilities and shall distribute the policy and procedures to individuals affected by them.

4. Guidelines

Use of school facilities for activities directly related to the educational program and school district operations shall be without cost to users, except that the user shall be responsible for extra custodial and security fees.

The Board may waive fees for the use of school facilities for school district group sponsored cultural or educational projects. Other organizations/agencies are subject to all applicable guidelines promulgated herein. In all cases, the school district reserves the right to limit the number of occasions on which its facilities are used by any one organization.

Unauthorized Use

The Board prohibits the use of school facilities for the following activities:

- 1. Use for the staging of and/or concerning demonstrations or other activities, which are, or may be, in the opinion of the Board, contrary to the general public welfare and/or mission of the school district.
- 2. Use of facilities for any purpose that is prohibited by law.

Conflict With Regular School Program

The Board permits the use of school properties by community organizations and groups subject to such restrictions as are necessary to expedite efficient utilization and to avoid conflicting schedules.

Any scheduled school activity, whether taking place during the school day or otherwise, shall have precedence over any other activity for the use of such facility. In the event a school activity is postponed due to inclement weather, etc., and the make-up day conflicts with a planned community or other activity, the school program would take precedence and force the rescheduling of the community activity and/or other activity.

All areas of a building requested must be kept in such condition that there will be no interference with normal school operations.

Any equipment, scenery, decorations, furniture, etc., to be used by the requesting organization shall not be delivered to the facility involved prior to the event unless permission is granted. It must then be removed at a time determined by the school principal, Superintendent or his/her designee; but not later than the day following the activity or program.

Special requirements must be complied with and may depend upon the facility and conditions at the time permission is granted.

Process for Approval of Usage of Facilities

- 1. Non-School Related Groups
 - a. An individual or community group requesting permission to use school district buildings, facilities or property must submit a written request on the prescribed application form in advance of the proposed date to the school principal.
 - b. Applications for such usage may be obtained in any school office.
 - c. The application must specify the portion of the school facilities requested for use; proposed activities; number of individuals participating; and the date, time and duration of the proposed event.
 - Completed applications should be returned to the school principal for processing (determination of fees, need for security, confirmation of availability of the requested facility, etc.). The applicant shall agree to exercise proper care in the use of the property and facilities, to indemnify and hold harmless the school district for any and all damages to school or other property by any person or persons attending the affair and to indemnify and hold harmless the school district against liability for any and all damage to any person or persons for injuries, including death. A certificate of insurance shall be attached to the application. The minimum limits of liability are: a minimum of \$100,000 for all damages arising out of bodily injury/person/accident; and \$300,000 aggregate for all damages sustained by two (2) or more persons/accident. Non-school related applicants must secure liability and property insurance in the amount of not less than \$500,000 Bodily Injury Liability and \$500,000 Property Damage Liability, listing the school district as an additional insured. In such event, the applicant shall furnish the Business Manager with a certificate showing that such insurance has been obtained. The Certificate of Insurance MUST list East Stroudsburg Area School District as a certificate holder and as an additional insured.
 - e. Documentation must evidence that the school district shall be held harmless by the user for any liability that arises from use of school facilities by the individual or group.
 - f. Completed applications must be received by the school principal at least forty-five (45) calendar days prior to the date for which a facility is requested.
 - g. The school principal will forward the application to the Business Office for review and for recommendation to the Board for approval.

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- 2. School and School-Related Organizations (Parent Organizations, Classes, Clubs, etc.)
 - a. Requests to use buildings/facilities by school-related organizations are approved or disapproved by the school principal and reported to the Superintendent.
 - b. No formal Board action is needed for this type of request, unless the use of school facilities by such group(s) entails the need for school district personnel (e.g. security, custodial, etc.) to be present outside of the scope of their normal work hours and/or such use involves the use of school district equipment and/or accommodations that is/are considered both extraordinary and/or potentially costly. In such cases, an *Application for Use of School Facilities* request form must be submitted for approval.
 - c. In cases whereby events hosted by such groups are anticipated to draw public participants and/or spectators, groups shall arrange to have security present.
 - d. In cases whereby no formal Board action is required, at least a seven (7) day notification must be given prior to the date for which a facility is requested. In all other cases, appropriate timelines must be adhered to.

Processing of Requests

Requests shall be approved with the following order of priority:

- 1. Requests for school organizations and groups.
- 2. Requests by school-related organizations.
- 3. Requests for nonschool-related community and/or nonprofit organizations.
- 4. Requests for private interest organizations.

Requests not covered by this policy will be considered on an individual basis by the Board.

No application to use school facilities shall be approved if the proposed activity would result in any of the following:

- 1. Conflict with any school-sponsored activity.
- 2. Access to school facilities closed due to renovations, maintenance, cleaning, the school calendar or Board action.

- 3. Access to school facilities containing equipment or furnishings which, if damaged or operated by an unqualified operator, would be detrimental to the operation of a school district program.
- 4. Prevention or encumbrance of school district personnel from preparing school facilities for their primary purpose, because of the nature or duration of the activity.
- 5. An individual or community group using school facilities in excess of five (5) times during any calendar year for the same purpose. This limitation shall not apply to individual athletic practices and/or contests for children or adults that are part of an overall athletic season schedule and such use is approved by the Board.

Fees

All fees due to the school district for the use of a facility are due within thirty (30) days after the activity. A deposit in the amount of twenty-five percent (25%) of the projected fees is required and should be made to the Business Office at least ten (10) days prior to the scheduled event.

Regulations for Use

- 1. All activities must terminate and all individuals and community group members must vacate school premises at a designated time; but school premises must always be vacated by 10:30 p.m. unless otherwise authorized by the Superintendent or the Board. Exceptions in this regard could include scheduled events that go over the scheduled time. Equipment and materials provided by the organization must be removed at a time determined by the school principal, Superintendent and/or his/her designee; but at least within twenty-four (24) hours after the meeting or performance. Exceptions or additions to this requirement will be evaluated on an individual basis and must be set forth in the request form.
- 2. Facilities may not be filled beyond rated capacity. The total number of participants and spectators in that activity must be supplied with the application.
- 3. Individuals and community groups shall refrain from any conduct or activities not specifically identified in the approved written request/application.
- 4. When advertising or promoting activities held at school facilities, individuals and community groups shall clearly communicate that the activities are not being sponsored by the school district.

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- 5. Sponsors or supervisors of an activity must remain on the premises until all participants have left the facility.
- 6. Accidents involving persons and/or property should be promptly reported to school officials.
- 7. Approved and assigned school district employee(s) must be available during use of auditoriums and gymnasiums. A fee may be charged to facilitate the presence of such employee(s).
- 8. Any use of school facilities other than those listed shall be by Board action only and subject to such additional restrictions or conditions as the Board shall determine.
- 9. Requests for use of stage facilities, lighting and installation of scenery shall be clearly indicated on the application. Only school district staff may operate the stage lighting and sound systems. A fee will be charged for such a service.
- 10. Any use of swimming pool facilities by non-school groups shall be by Board action only. Any school group using a swimming pool must have the approval of the school principal. Certified lifeguard(s) must be provided by the requesting group with the number of lifeguards dependent upon the number of participants.
- 11. The school principal and administrators responsible for approving applications may impose such additional reasonable restrictions or regulations as s/he shall determine according to the nature of the proposed use as set forth on the application and the nature of the group or organization requesting the use.
- 12. The use of athletic fields is limited to use of such fields for their designated purpose. All groups using such fields shall be prohibited from physically altering the fields.
- 13. The use of school facilities is subject to cancellation by the school district based upon emergency situations, including inclement weather, and when the use under such conditions may damage such facilities or pose a safety concern.
- 14. After the application has been approved, the applicant may **not** assign, sublet, or transfer its rights or privileges to any other individual, group, or organization.
- 15. Upon determination of requested facility availability, the school principal

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shall determine the required extent and nature of responsible supervision, custodial and cafeteria services, and security protection. Fees for the use of school district personnel will be billed directly, along with the rental fee, to the sponsoring individual or organization.

- 16. A custodian and/or other school district personnel must be on duty at all times when a facility is in use. Any additional custodial costs will be charged to all facility renters, whether the facility used is for profit or a nonprofit activity, unless waived by the Board.
- 17. Requested kitchen facilities, equipment and utensils will remain under the direction and control of authorized cafeteria personnel. A fee will be charged for such services.
- 18. The applicant will be responsible for all thefts of school property, damage thereto or destruction thereof, and shall make restitution to the school district for such thefts, damage, or destruction. Restitution will be based on new replacement cost.
- 19. No special arrangements to the facility (decorations, scenery, furniture, and similar items) may occur prior to the time contracted for use.
- 20. The Superintendent or school principal may require additional security staff, ambulance and/or medical service, and/or other requirements for some activities. Satisfying these requirements is the responsibility of the applicant.
- 21. The Superintendent or school principal has the power to revoke permission if, in his/her judgment, the school facility is not being properly used.
- 22. For scheduling purposes, <u>school activities take precedence</u> over any other event.
- 23. Use of school facilities is not permitted when school is not in session due to holiday(s). Also, the use of school facilities may not be permitted when schools are closed due to inclement weather or the closing of school due to early dismissal.
- 24. The Board reserves the right to review pertinent documents and/or financial records with regard to nonprofit organizations.

Violations

The school district reserves the right to remove from school district premises any individual or community group who fails to comply with the terms and conditions of this policy and established procedures.

In the event an individual or community group violates this policy or terms under which permission was granted to use school facilities, that individual or community group forfeits the right to submit future written requests to use school district property, unless otherwise decided by the Board.

Adult Supervision

Responsible adult supervision in adequate numbers must be provided by the sponsoring organization.

Use of Cafeteria

When school kitchens or dishwashing areas are to be used, at least two (2) cafeteria employees must be on duty in the kitchen and/or dishwashing areas. Those assignments are to be made by the Director of Food Services. Payment of the cafeteria employees will be the responsibility of the organization using the facilities.

Certificate of Insurance

All organizations or groups (except school groups which may be exempt from this requirement) using the facilities of the school district shall provide a *Certificate of Insurance* with school officials prior to actual use of the facility. (Please see 1, d on page three (3) of this policy for further details).

Classifications

Class 1 -

The use of classrooms and other facilities is available to school-related organizations in the school district for meetings after school hours on a regular school day without payment of any fee provided that regular custodial personnel are on duty during the normal shift hours, the room and building are vacated by 10:30 p.m., and the room and/or other area used is left clean and in proper order at the end of the meeting.

The facilities of the schools may be used for certain activities without payment of any fees provided a school district employee is on duty or in attendance and the individual, group, or organization has acquired the school principal's approval. A fee for use of school security may be charged, if necessary. The following is a list of activities that qualify under this provision:

- 1. Scheduled and faculty chaperoned student activities of the school.
- 2. School district sponsored events or activities.



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- 3. Events or activities provided by any organization related to the school district.
- 4. Regularly scheduled meetings of PTO, Varsity Club, athletic or band parents booster clubs, and other similar parent or adult groups sponsoring school district student activities.
- 5. Parent-teacher activities directly related to school activities or child welfare.

Class 2 -

The facilities of the school district may be used by groups and for the purposes listed below to which the general public is invited during the established custodial working hours without payment of personnel costs and rental fees for events. However, a fee will be assessed for custodial and/or other personnel hours worked over and above established hours, unless waived by the board. A fee for use of school security may also be charged, if applicable.

- 1. School district group sponsored cultural or educational projects.
- 2. Local nonprofit service clubs, community agencies and civic organizations located within the school district and/or serving the citizens of the school ditrict.
- 3. Public meetings sponsored by township, county, state or federal governmental entities.
- 4. Events held by nonprofit organizations whereby the nonprofit organization has arranged for a private, for-profit entity to deliver services, and whereby such entity makes a profit. Unless waived by the Board, a fee representing 20% of the projected use of the facility (based upon rental fees listed under the section of this policy entitled *Fee Structure*, or 20% of the gross amount received for admission/tuition, whichever is greater, shall be charged.

Class 3 -

Profit-making organizations located within the school district shall be charged rental and custodial fees as identified in the approved fee schedule. Use of facilities will not be granted to groups located outside of the school district unless granted special permission from the Board. This includes:

- 1. Events held by commercial organizations where no admission is charged.
- 2. Individual private use.

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Events held by commercial enterprises where admission is charged shall be billed at two (2) times the amount of all rental fees.

Requests for exceptions to Board policy or administrative regulations, or for uses not covered in this policy or administrative regulations, shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Board in time to be considered at a regular meeting of the Board at least one (1) month prior to the event.

Fee Structure

SC 775

The Board shall establish a schedule of fees for the use of school district facilities by approved individuals or groups.

Rental charges shall be made to groups and/or organizations, including supervisory, security and/or custodial service, in accordance with the following schedule. The fee listed directly across from the facility is for the first three (3) hours of use unless otherwise noted. The hourly rate listed below the basic rate is for each hour following the first three (3) hours. Where a fee is charged, a deposit of twenty-five percent (25%) will be required at least ten (10) days prior to the first day of use. Any groups owing fees from a previous use, or which did not promptly remit payment for a previous use, may be denied use of facilities.

Care of Property and Facilities

The use of a building or fields shall be restricted to the purposes and areas for which the application was submitted and approved. The Board reserves the right to restrict and supervise the use of the property in accordance with the intent of these rules and regulations.

Where large audiences are anticipated, the applicant shall be responsible for proper parking of cars on the paved parking area and to provide the additional services needed to direct and control parking. If it is anticipated that the paved parking areas will not be adequate for parking all the cars, the applicant must make arrangements with the building administrator before parking on any grass area.

Any school equipment that is to be used in conjunction with requested facilities shall be identified at the time that the request for use of facilities is made. The users of school equipment must accept liability for any damage or loss to such equipment that occurs while it is in their use. Where rules so specify, no item of equipment may be used except by a qualified operator.

Waiver of Policy

The Board reserves the right to amend and/or waive certain provisions of this policy in the best interest of the school and community when such action is warranted.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING - SENIORITY

The East Stroudsburg Area School District (hereinafter referred to as "District") and the East Stroudsburg Area Education Support Professional Association (hereinafter referred to as "Association"), agree to the following clarifications and modifications to the July 1, 2006 – June 30, 2011 Collective Bargaining Agreement (hereinafter referred to as "CBA"):

- 1. Pursuant to Article XXX of the CBA, for purposes of layoff and recall, a seniority list will include the names of all full-time bargaining unit employees listing their most recent date of hire into a bargaining unit position. It is understood and agreed that an employee who leaves the bargaining unit and returns is credited on this list with seniority starting from the date of return into the bargaining unit.
- 2. Pursuant to Article XXX of the CBA, for purposes of layoff and recall, a separate seniority list will include the names of all part-time bargaining unit employees. Seniority for the part-time employees on this list will be calculated by pro-rating the time worked based upon a full-time 10 month work year.
- 3. When a part-time employee becomes a full-time employee, the employee will be placed on the full-time seniority list described in paragraph 1 above, with their time spent as part time pro-rated based on a 10 month full-time work year basis.
- 4. Pursuant to Article XX(I) of the CBA, for purposes of overtime, the District will maintain and provide to the Association a seniority list for each classification in the bargaining unit. This list will identify employees within the classification by date hired into a position in that classification. This list will include subdivision positions or job titles within the particular classification. It is understood and agreed that employees who are promoted to another position within the classification will retain his/her original date of hire into the classification.
- 5. It is understood and agreed by the parties that the seniority list described above in paragraph 4 does not abridge or waive the District's right to select an employee for overtime purposes from the appropriate job title within the classification listing. It is further understood that the seniority list does not supersede language in the contract regarding overtime in classifications that do not have multiple job titles.
- 6. Any secretary working 5 hours or greater will be placed on the full-time seniority list described in paragraph 1. All secretaries working less than 5 hours will be

placed on the part-time seniority list as described in paragraph 2. Those secretaries who moved from part-time to full-time will be placed on the full-time seniority list with their part-time work pro-rated based on a 10 month full-time work year.

7. Nothing contained in this Memorandum of Understanding alters or infringes upon the seniority rights addressed in other Articles of the Collective Bargaining Agreement which are not specifically detailed in this MOU.

LICENSE AGREEMENT

This License Agreement (this "Agreement") is made as of this _____ day of April, 2009 (the "Effective Date"), by and between Mountain Laurel Development Group, LP, a Delaware limited partnership, with offices for notice purposes at c/o The Wolfington Companies, 920 Matsonford Road, West Conshohocken, PA 19428 ("Licensor") and the East Stroudsburg Area School District, a Pennsylvania public school district of the second class with a mailing address for notice purposes at 321 North Courtland Street, PO Box 298 East Stroudsburg, PA 18301 ("Licensee").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Licensor is the fee simple owner of that certain building commonly known as the Mountain Laurel Center for the Performing Arts (the "Center") situated on certain real property located in Lehman Township, Pike County, Pennsylvania identified as Pike County Tax parcel Number 06-0-193.00-01-01 (collectively, with the Center, "Licensor's Property"), and

WHEREAS, Licensee and Licensor have agreed in principal to permit Licensee to hold it's 2009 high school graduation/commencement ceremony and related activities in the Center (all such activities, collectively, the "Graduation"), subject to the parties formal execution of this Agreement and the timely compliance by Licensee of all of the terms and conditions hereof.

AGREEMENT

NOW THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration as set forth below, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, and intending to be legally bound hereby, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Recitals. The Recitals set forth above are hereby incorporated into this Agreement by reference as if the same had been repeated herein in full.

2.. Right of Entry and License.

Licensor's Property and into the Center specifically, solely for the purpose of holding the Graduation, including setting up for and cleaning up after in accordance with the schedule set forth in the following paragraph, it being clearly understood that Licensee shall be solely responsible for leaving the Center and all of Licensee's Property in at least the same condition it was in prior to Licensee's entry onto Licensor's Property for the purposes set forth herein. Licensee shall remove all trash and garbage from the Center at Licensee's sole cost and expense. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as granting to the Licensee any property or ownership rights in the Licensor's Property, or to create a partnership, joint venture or an agency relationship between Licensor and Licensee. Licensor, in its sole discretion, may designate certain areas of Licensor's Property which shall be specifically excluded from the applicability of this Agreement and any such areas shall be described in sufficient detail in a writing to Licensee, which such writing shall automatically become a part of this Agreement by reference.

Schedule: Graduation set-up will be on Wednesday, June 17, 2009 between the hours of 9.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. The Graduation ceremony will be on Thursday, June 18, 2009 and Licensee shall have the Center available to them on that day from 7.30 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. to

allow time for practice, rehearsal, guest and participant arrival/departure, and to allow Licensee time to clean up. In the event Licensee desires to change the dates set forth above based on an extension of the 2008-2009 school year due to presently unforeseen snow days or other weather conditions, Licensor agrees to cooperate with Licensee in determining alternate dates, in which event the parties agree to amend this Agreement to set forth such newly agreed upon dates (and times, if applicable).

- 3. License Fee. Upon the execution of this Agreement by all parties, and in full consideration of Licensor's agreement to enter into this Agreement, Licensee agrees to pay Fee Owner the sum of Seven Thousand One Hundred Four Dollars and No Cents (\$7,104.00).
- 4. Insurance Requirements. Within five (5) days of the Effective Date of this Agreement, Licensee shall deliver to Fee Owner evidence that Licensee, Licensee's invitees, guests, contractors, agents and other third parties, and/or the particular party who intends to enter upon Licensor's Property for the purposes set forth herein, has in effect a fully paid policy of insurance that insures Licensor, the general partner of Licensor (Mountain Laurel Development Acquisition Group, LLC), Licensee and CapitalSource Finance LLC against any liability normally covered by a general public liability policy with limits of at least Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) per occurrence of death of, or injury to, any one person or as otherwise reasonably requested by Licensor. The policy(ies) maintained, or caused to be maintained, pursuant to this Section 4 shall insure the contractual liability of Licensee covering the indemnities herein set forth and shall (i) name Licensor and CapitalSource Finance LLC as additional insured parties, and (ii) contain a provision that the insurance provided thereunder shall be primary and noncontributing with any other insurance available to Licensor.
- 5. Licensee's Covenants. Licensee hereby covenants and agrees not to damage, deface or otherwise injure Licensor's Property or any part thereof, to comply with all applicable federal, state and municipal laws, orders, rules and regulations while on or about Licensor's Property; and not to disrupt, affect or interfere with the use of Licensor's Property by others entitled to use same. This covenant by Licensee includes, but is not limited to, Licensee's obligation to obtain any and all permits or other governmental or quasi-governmental approvals which may be required in connection with the Graduation, at its sole cost and expense.
- 6. Personal Property. Any personal property belonging to Licensee, its invitees, guests, contractors, agents or other third parties, situate upon Licensor's Property shall be there at the sole risk of Licensee, and Licensor shall not be liable for damage thereto or theft, misappropriation or loss thereof, except to the extent such damages, theft, misappropriation or theft is attributable to Licensor's gross negligence or willful misconduct.
- 7. Indemnification. Licensee shall indemnify, defend and hold Licensor, its agents, subcontractors, officers, employees, lenders, partners, assigns and successors harmless from and against any and all loss, cost, damage and expense directly arising from Licensee's negligence or misconduct at Licensor's Property and any breach of this Agreement, including but not limited to, reasonable attorney's fees, professional fees and court costs. The indemnification provided in this Section 7 shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement.
- 8. Governing Law; Status and Authority; Entire Agreement; Counterparts; Amendments; Waivers; Assignment. This Agreement shall be governed by the substantive laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The parties hereto each represent and warrant to the other that they are duly organized, validly existing and subsisting under the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and under the laws of the State of Delaware, as applicable, and

that they have all requisite power and authority to execute and deliver this Agreement and to perform under this Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties relating to the Graduation, there being no other terms or conditions, oral or written, except as herein expressed. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts and each counterpart constitutes an original document. This Agreement may be amended, changed or modified only by written amendment executed by the parties hereto. No waiver of any provision of this Agreement shall be valid unless in writing signed by both parties. 



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<u>Interpretive Nature Trail</u> East Stroudsburg North Campus

Goal:

To develop an interpretive nature trail on the East Stroudsburg North Schools campus. The trail would be comprised of 5 sections dedicated to coordinate with the curriculums of the various schools located at the East Stroudsburg North site.

The trail will be an extension of the curriculum already in place in the schools. The students of the East Stroudsburg School District will have the opportunity to experience science in a hands-on environment, which will greatly enhance their science learning and inspire a life-long appreciation of nature.

Background:

Lehman Intermediate has been offered a unique partnership opportunity to join forces with the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources through the Forestry Bureau.

The DCNR will offer assistance and guidance to implement the creation of an interpretive nature trail. A representative of the DCNR has already identified an area that would be best suited for the location of the trail.

The section of woods found behind the football stadium has the most educational value for this project, i.e. more variety of trees, greater diversity of plants, larger ecological arena to study the environmental effects, etc. This section is also easily accessible to students in all three buildings at the North site.

The DCNR representative has already done some preliminary footwork and has determined that several local organizations will be available to aid in the creation of this project. Scope and Purpose

Conduct an on-site assessment to determine proposed routes and assess the feasibility of an educational trail at the ESASD North School Site. Make recommendations on potential and alternative routes, tread surfaces, and permitting to construct a trail for the purpose of exposing students to various ecosystems surrounding the school.

The trail is proposed to connect students with the natural world and provide real life experience related to course studies in biology, ecology, and geology, including wetland flora and fauna, forest types, forestry ecology and management practices, entomology, mammology, ornithology, soil types and characteristics, and archeology.

Process

An on-site inspection was conducted on May 4, 2006. Input was gathered from the science teachers and existing site conditions were reviewed, along with plans dated 1997 and 1998 from F.X. Browne. Not all the plan sheets were available for the area under review. Subsequent to the site inspection, plans were obtained from F.X. Browne. Potential control points were identified, and potential trail routes were explored.

Follow up interviews were conducted with various regulatory agencies and partners, including some of the faculty members interested in the project. Those contacted include:

The Pike County Conservation District (PCCD)-regarding potential environmental permitting, The Pennsylvania Museum and Historical Commission (PMHC) –they have previously reviewed the school site.

The Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) via the District Forester for Delaware State Forest, who has had previous discussions with the School District regarding trail development,

The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP)- regarding potential permitting requirements for a trail through wetlands,

The Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE)- regarding wetland permitting, and The Township of Lehman- regarding trail and deck permitting.

On Site Inspection

The site visit entailed scoping out the forested areas south, west and north of the athletic fields and stormwater facilities to the west of the North High School buildings. Slope measurements were taken in critical areas and wetland presence, as well as control points were observed and discussed. There are several points of interest including large boulders where high water tables can be observed, hummocked wetland areas, hardwood forest upland areas, a small headwater stream, and rock outcrops.

The site slopes generally from east to west, away from the fields, toward the swamp area. The F.X. Browne plans depict a wetland boundary at or near the toe of the fill slopes for the fields and basins. As discussed with the group during the site inspection, it is more desirable to locate the trail away from the toe of slope in the forested areas, connecting points of interest than along the embankment. The wetland areas appeared to be seasor ably dry nearer the fields, with swampy areas further westward.

There are three potential access points, one to the south near the water tower, one between the athletic fields near the center of the school site, and one to the north. All three present challenges for sustainable trail development, primarily existing slopes and dra nageways. All three contain discharges from the existing site development. The high point of the site is on the northerly end of the site, upslope of the softball field.

The site plans revealed an area of archeological significance near the northerly corner of the site. This are is likely to extend off-site onto the adjacent state forest land.

A rough estimate of 10,000 users per year is expected based on number of classes, students per class, and number of visits expected per class. The trail may also be used by the cross country team for training.

Follow-Up Information

The township does not have a design standard for trails. The township zoning officer stated "Go ahead and build it. Sounds like a great idea." Additionally, decks not connected to a

structure have no permit requirements as of June 2006. This affords the opportunity to provide elevated gathering areas for teachers to talk with students in the wetland areas.

A trail through a wetland over 200 feet in length will require a permit from the state DEP and possibly federal authorization (joint permit for water obstruction and encroacliment). These permits take some time to obtain, and application should be made as soon as possible.

The District Forester Gerald Kelly was contacted regarding the trail proposal. Because of the existing topography at the site, in order to maintain a sustainable tread grade and surface at the northerly access point, the trail will need to be routed northward onto the State Forest Land (DCNR). While agreements would have to be reached and signed, the District Forester saw no problem with routing the trail across the State Forest land. This agreement process should also be initiated immediately.

An area of archeological significance in the northerly corner of the site, which quite possibly extends onto the adjacent State owned Forest Lands, needs to be protected from surface disturbance. According to discussion with the PA Museum and Historical Commission this can be resolved through appropriate trail design.

The Proposed Nature Trail

A sustainable, low-impact trail could be constructed on the site, including through the wetland areas. While the wetlands could be avoided by only providing trails at the north and south ends of the site, this would not provide students the opportunity to experience the wetlands achievable by entering into the swamp, nor would the trail be connectable due to the wetland proximity to the fill slopes.

The accompanying maps show potential routes for the trail and boardwalk. At proximately 4000 lineal feet of trail could form the northern loop, including approximately 1200 feet of trail on state forest land. This section of trail would provide access from the north end of the high school building around to the ramp entering the soccer fields south of the tennis courts (central access point). Another 3600-4200 lineal feet of trail could travel from the soccer

fields southwest around the field hockey area toward the water tower at the southerly end of the site. In all, approximately a mile and a quarter of trail could be provided.

Because of the archeological area, a trail of geotextile underlayment surfaced with crushed stone or other suitable surfacing is recommended. Any excavation will require additional clearance from PMHC. This method would also reduce the amount of effort required to install the new trail. Through the wetland area, a low impact boardwak is ideal both for minimizing impact to the wetland surface and plants, and keeping trail user's feet dry.

Conclusions


With proper design and planning, a trail at the north site can provide students with access to unique areas for study and exploration, with little impact to the natural resources. Depending on the extent of trail the District decides to provide, the project could be completed inside of a one year period, including planning, permitting and installation. Small stages could be implemented earlier where permits are not required, with final connections made as permits are obtained.

The next step is to develop a trail plan, sometimes called a master plan for trail development. This involves doing a hard layout of the proposed trail alignment, in coordinat on school district representatives and the District Forester. Following layout, a survey may be needed for obtaining the wetland encroachment permit. Then permit applications and the agreement with the DCNR can be developed. In the meantime, support for the project can be rallied and funding sources explored. Once the plans are finalized and permits obtained, the trail can be installed.

Dear Ms. Portnoff and Dr. Heath:

I represented Wakwan Lee and Fei Chan, husband and wife, who purchased the above property on February 13, 2008 from Jaggernauth & Rita Mohabir. At the time of closing, knowing there were outstanding real estate taxes, among other liens, my settlement company requested a payoff for school taxes from Portnoff Associates. We paid a \$35.00 fee for this service and received the enclosed payoff, Exhibit "A". The "quote" was good through February 14, 2008, as clearly marked thereon.

Closing was held February 13, 2008, at which time the total taxes on the Portnoff payoff were collected, together with the \$35.00 administrative fee. A copy of the closing statement is enclosed as Exhibit "B". The tax payments were made immediately after closing to Monroe County Tax Claim Bureau as directed in the payoff. The payments were made specifically for delinquent 2006 and 2007 school taxes in the full amount of the payoff given.

In or about February, 2009, my clients, Mr. Lee and Ms. Chan, received a bill for delinquent 2006 school taxes of \$747.55. We immediately investigated this with the Monroe County Tax Claim Bureau, and were provided with the enclosed statement on March 4, 2009, Exhibit "C". Upon further discussion with the Tax Claim Bureau, this amount of \$747.55 was for costs that Portnoff reported to the Tax Claim Bureau in June, 2008, four months after my client's closing and payment. These were for attorney "costs" of the 2006 delinquency. The Tax Claim Bureau does not have the authority or ability to do anything about this. Only the School District and Portnoff can remedy this problem. I also understand this is not the only instance of this problem occurring.

A payoff was requested; funds were collected in that amount and paid by the "good through" date; there is no ability to go back to the original owner who was delinquent. I question the authority and right of Portnoff to even report this to the Tax Claim Bureau after taxes have been paid, and without the filing or amendment of a municipal lien. More importantly, this was reported and added as a lien after a payoff was requested and obtained at a cost of \$35.00. The addition of "non-guaranteed" in the definition or disclaimer does not insulate either the District or Portnoff in this matter. Both have a duty to give correct payoffs, if they are going to be a collector of public taxes or employ an outside collector.

On March 16, 2009, I researched the Monroe County Prothonotary's Office for municipal liens levied by the School District on this property. A lien at File No. 2007 Civil 7227 for \$11,092.00 was marked satisfied. A lien at No. 2007 Civil 7585 for \$1,143.46 has not yet been marked satisfied, despite full payment for the school taxes.

I am requesting that this matter be reviewed and the delinquent tax be removed immediately from the Monroe County Tax Claim records, and at the Monroe County Prothonotary's Office. My clients' property is now subject to a possible tax sale. Otherwise, I will need to take action in Court to remove the levied amount.



Supplement to Application for use of School Facilities

Background - Stroudsburg Men's USTA 4.0 Tennis Team:

The Stroudsburg United States Tennis Association (USTA) Men's 4.0 Tennis team consists of 12 men from the Stroudsburg area competing in the Middle States Division of the USTA Adult League. The 2009 Men's Team includes several players who also competed for the Stroudsburg and East Stroudsburg High School tennis teams. Team Members include professionals in the Stroudsburg area: business owners, physicians, university professors, teachers and musicians (even an opera singer!).

Day Matches consist of two (2) singles matches and three (3) doubles matches, all of which have the same start time. Thus there are a total of 8 team members that participate for each day match. "The USTA is a not-for-profit organization with more than 700,000 members, which invests 100% of its proceeds to promote and develop the growth of tennis, from the grass-roots to the professional levels."* USTA Adult League tennis takes place at the grass roots level. The season winner in the Middle States Division goes on to compete at "Sectionals" in Princeton, NJ. In turn, the winning team at Sectionals then competes at "Nationals."

Purpose of Application:

For the last several years the Team has played matches and practices at Stroudsburg High School. These courts are heavily used and therefore scheduling conflicts with other tennis players' use of the courts often occur. In previous years Stroudsburg has had two USTA Men's teams, in both the 4.0 and 3.5 USTA Adult Leagues. This spring (2009), a 3.0 USTA League team will be added, thus further increasing the court demand at Stroudsburg HS. See article related to the growth of Tennis as printed in the Publication, *Racquet Sports Industry*.

Reasons for requested no-fee approval:

The USTA is a non-profit group.

Only 4 match dates are needed. The match schedule on the Application lists all the dates that 4.0 League matches will be played. There are 4 other teams in our division:

Birchwood Racquet Club, Clarks Summit West End Racquet Club, Allentown Saucon Valley Country Club, Saucon Valley Northwood Racquet Club, Easton One team each week will have a bye. We will be scheduled to play each team twice, once Home and once Away. While we are currently requesting 10 match dates, we will only need to play 4 Home matches. We will confirm the league schedule as soon as it is completed, no later than mid-April. At which point we will confirm the 4 specific match dates needed. All 4 matches are scheduled for Sundays, and the season runs from April 26 through July 26. Typically we will schedule the match start for Sunday 2:00pm but may have to adjust start time depending on the weather forecast.

In addition to the 4 match days, we would like to practice on the courts once each week during the season. In part, our success comes from practicing and playing on the same courts. We would, of course, request a practice day and time that would not conflict with other activities on the courts. We suggest Saturday morning would work best for us and should not present a scheduling conflict.

We do not require any special equipment from the district. We will not require custodial staff, and we will care for and leave the courts in the same condition as we found them.

The closest classification for our group would be Class Two. However, we would not need to utilize the facilities to the full extent outlined under this Class. We do not invite the general public nor do we charge a fee for participation. If we are lucky we may have some family members as spectators, but often our matches are only viewed by the players themselves. Of course, we would welcome spectators and would welcome the Board to come to watch our matches.

The purpose of the league is to provide friendly spirited competition. It is customary for the Home team to provide snacks for the opposing team, to be shared after the matches are over, typically submarine sandwiches, chips and soda outside the courts. We clean up after ourselves and we will leave no trace.

Tennis Continues Strong Participation Growth

The latest USTA/TIA Tennis Participation Survey shows that 1.8 million players joined the game in 2008, which boosted total U.S. participation to nearly 26.9 million players, the highest level since 1992.

Nearly 6 million new players tried tennis for the first time in 2008. And frequent players, those who play at least 21 times a year, increased by 7% to 5.62 million in 2008. The annual survey was conducted for the TIA and USTA by the Taylor Research Group.

The jump in total participation is a 7% rise over the previous year's 25.1 million players, and a 12% increase over the five-year period beginning in 2003 through year-end 2007, when total participation was at 24 million.

Related to the rise in tennis participation, data also shows that shipments of tennis racquets and balls over that same five-year period have followed this same trend. Since 2003, adult racquet shipments were up 30%, and youth racquets increased a remarkable 80%. Tennis ball shipments were up 15% over that same time period. However, total 2008 shipments are projected to be down slightly from 2007.

There are many contributing factors for tennis's growth, including:

- The combined efforts of the USTA, TIA and other groups bringing tennis
 to more and more kids through school programs and other curriculum,
 helping to make possible the growth in youth racquet shipments.
- Our front-line of dedicated teaching professionals and facilities who attract and keep players engaged in our sport.
- Positive role models with tennis's professional players and increased tournament attendance.
- The sport has developed, and continues to improve, a strong infrastructure that provides more places to play, programs to learn the game, and partners to play with.
- Tennis is relatively inexpensive to play and promotes a healthy, active lifestyle with great social benefits. And an hour of competitive tennis burns more calories than most other sports.

Consumer queries to the "postcards" on the GrowingTennis System to find local tennis programs doubled from second quarter 2008 to third quarter, from 13 million to 26 million. And, the number of facilities using the GrowingTennis System increased by a remarkable 67% in that same period.

Graduates of The Jersey Surf are music and performing arts educators, special education teachers, primary and secondary school educators, professional performers, business professionals, entrepreneurs; leaders in their chosen fields and in their communities.

Quick Facts About the Drum and Bugle Corps Activity & The Jersey Surf

- The 2009 Season marks the corps' 19th Anniversary, and its first season in the elite "World Class."
- The organization was founded as an extra-curricular activity by several members of the marching band staff at the former Edgewood Regional High School, now Winslow Township High School.
- Drum and Bugle Corps is an activity which takes place from November through August. During the winter and spring, the corps meets for one weekend each month. During the summer, the rehearsal & performance schedule expands to every weekend, culminating in a two week tour to the site of the World Championships. In 2009, we will travel throughout the eastern and southern US, completing our tour in Indianapolis, IN at the Drum Corps International World Championships.
- The competitive rules of Drum Corps International set a maximum performing membership limit at 150. The Jersey Surf enjoys an annual membership which averages between 130 and 150 members. Our 2009 projections are at the high end of the average.
- Members must be between the ages of 14 and 21 years of age. The average age of Jersey Surf members is 17.8 years.
- The corps is instructed by an team of 40 professional music and performing arts educatiors, with combined experience in excess of 300 years of instruction.
- The corps' management and operations staff are all-volunteer, encompassing professions from the world of business and administration, health occupations, science, engineering, food service, and many other areas of specialization. These volunteers handle chores including: transportation, fundraising, logistics, housing, financial management, food service, uniform and equipment maintenance and construction, and many other tasks as needed in a given season.
- The corps travels with its own fleet of four motor coaches, two tractor-trailer rigs (one for equipment and one for food service) several support vehicles, and a mobile souvenir store.


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


