302. EMPLOYMENT OF SUPERINTENDENT/ ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT

1. Purpose SC 1001

The Board places the primary responsibility and authority for the administration of this school district in the Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent(s). Therefore, selection of a Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent(s) is critical to the effective leadership and management of the district.

2. Authority SC 508, 1001 1071, 1073, 1075, 1076, 1077, 2107

When the position of Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent becomes vacant, the Board shall elect a district Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent by a majority vote of all members of the Board and shall fix the beginning salary and term of office. Such term may be three (3), four (4), or five (5) years, beginning with the effective date of the appointment to office.

SC 1073, 1077

During the final year of the term of office, the Board may notify the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent that it plans to seek applications for the position from other qualified candidates. Such notification shall be given by the Board at least 150 days prior to the end of the term if applicable.

The Board shall actively seek the best qualified and most capable candidate for the position of Superintendent. It may be aided in this task by:

- 1. a committee of Board members and/or community representatives, such as parents, professional employees, non-professional employees and community members and/or
- 2. the services of professional consultants and/or
- 3. the counsel of the retiring Superintendent.

The Board shall seek applicants for the position of Assistant Superintendent by nomination of the Superintendent and by the same process used to determine the selection of the Superintendent.

303. EMPLOYMENT OF ADMINISTRATORS

1. Purpose

The Board places substantial responsibility and authority for the effective management of the schools district with district administrators who are employed by the school district.

2. Authority SC 508, 1106, 1142 Title 22 Sec. 4.4

The Board shall, by a majority vote of all members, approve the employment, fix set the compensation and establish the term of employment for each administrator employed by this school-district.

3. Guidelines

Such approval shall normally be given to those candidates for employment recommended by the Superintendent. For purposes of the 300 section of Board policy, administrative positions shall be deemed to be: Business Manager, Assistant Business Manager, Directors, Assistant Directors, Principals, Assistant Principals and Supervisors.

Approval shall normally be given to the candidates for employment recommended by the Superintendent.

When any recommended candidate has been rejected by the Board, the Superintendent shall make a substitute recommendation.

Any employee's willful misstatement of fact material to qualifications for employment or the determination of salary shall be considered by the Board to constitute grounds for dismissal by the Board.

No candidate for employment as an administrator shall receive recommendation for such-employment without evidence of his/her certification, if such certification is required.

4. Delegation of Responsibility

The Superintendent or designee shall develop procedures for the recruitment, screening, and recommendation of candidates for employment as administrators.

It shall be the duty of the Superintendent to see that persons nominated for employment shall meet all qualifications established by law and by the Board for the type of positions for which nomination is made. The Superintendent or designee shall seek candidates of good moral character who possess the following attributes: successful educational training and experience, scholarship and intellectual prowess, appreciation of children, and emotional and mental maturity and stability.

The Superintendent or designee shall, in the conduct of recruiting activities, seek give special consideration to candidates from this district, or state or surrounding states.

Staff vacancies that represent opportunities for professional advancement or diversification shall be made known to district personnel so they may apply for such positions.

525. DRESS AND GROOMING

1. Purpose

Employees set an example in dress and grooming for students and the community at large. Compliance with reasonable standards for dress and grooming has a positive effect upon the district's operation and programs.

2. Authority SC 510

The Board has the authority to specify the minimum standards of appropriate dress and grooming and to specify reasonable dress and grooming guidelines for the purpose of maintaining the District's 1 operations and services in a professional manner and to avoid disruption or adverse impact upon those programs, operations or services.

3. Guidelines

During work hours, support employees shall be physically clean, neat, well-groomed, and dressed in a manner consistent with the needs of the job to be performed.

Employees shall be groomed so that hair style does not disrupt the educational process or operations, nor cause a health or safety hazard.

To the extent necessary and required by the District, all support personnel must wear designated work uniforms and utilize safety gear (e.g.., support belts, rubber gloves, chemical goggles) provided by the District. Employees must use and maintain required safety gear in appropriate and working condition and replace said gear when unduly worn or damaged.

Employees must wear a clean uniform daily. Eleven (11) uniforms and two (2) jackets will be issued to each custodian, maintenance and mechanic employee. New employees will receive uniforms and jackets upon completion of their probationary period. All custodian, maintenance and mechanic employees are required to wear the uniform to work at all times. Uniforms are not to be worn as street clothes during non-working hours.

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525. DRESS AND GROOMING - Pg 2.

In the event the employee <u>losses loses</u> or returns any District issued uniform in unreasonably damaged condition (e.g., cigarette burns, intentional destruction), the employee will be responsible for replacement costs.

Upon reassignment into a different classification or termination of employment, custodians, maintenance workers and mechanics are required to return the District issued uniforms (e.g.., eleven (11) uniforms and two (2) jackets). Failure to do so will result in a deduction of the employee's final pay eheck to cover replacement charges.

4. Delegation of Responsibility

If an employee feels that an exception to this policy would enable him/her to carry out assigned duties more effectively, a request should be made to the immediate supervisor and/or building principal.

The specific guidelines of this policy shall be promulgated by Administrative Regulations.

805. EMERGENCY EVACUATION OF SCHOOLS PREPAREDNESS

1. Purpose

The school district's system of emergency preparedness shall ensure that: Board recognizes its responsibility to safeguard the health and welfare of district students and employees. Therefore, the Board shall provide the facilities, equipment and training necessary to minimize the effects of all hazards and emergencies, including but not limited to natural disasters, hazardous chemicals, fires, weapons, bomb threats, terrorism, communicable diseases and pandemics. Advance planning and comprehensive implementation are key components in ensuring the protection of the school community.

- 1. Health and safety of students and staff are safeguarded.
- 2. Time necessary for instructional purposes is not unduly diverted.
- 3. Minimum disruption occurs to the educational program.

SC 1518

4. Students are taught to respond appropriately to emergency situations.

2. Authority 35 Pa. C.S.A. Sec. 7701

The Board directs that established policy shall be followed for emergency evacuations that affect the operation of district schools.district, in cooperation with the local Emergency Management Agency and the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency (PEMA), shall develop and implement a comprehensive disaster response and emergency preparedness plan, consistent with the guidelines developed by the Pennsylvania Emergency management Agency and other applicable state requirements.

The Board shall also utilize the resources of and comply with the requirements of the Pennsylvania Department of Health and the Pennsylvania Emergency management Agency and other applicable state requirements.

The Board shall ensure that emergency and evacuation drills are conducted at intervals required by state law.



3. <u>Delegation of</u> <u>Responsibility</u> <u>Guidelines</u>

All threats to the safety of the schools shall be identified by appropriate personnel and responded to promptly, in accordance with the plan for emergency preparedness as promulgated by the The Superintendent or designee shall collaborate with relevant stakeholders, including parents/guardians, staff, community agencies and first responders, during the development and implementation of the emergency preparedness plan.

The Superintendent or designee shall implement a communication system to notify parents/guardians of the evacuation of students and to alert the entire school community when necessary.-

4. Guidelines Delegation of Responsibility 35 Pa. C.S.A. SC 1517

The effectiveness of emergency planning in preparing the schools to cope with disaster shall be continually monitored by the Superintendent.emergency preparedness plan shall be reviewed at least annually and modified as necessary. A copy of the plan shall be provided to the county Emergency management Agency and communicated to students, parents/guardians, relevant stakeholders, and the community.

Continuity Of Student Learning/Core Operations

The Superintendent shall develop procedures for handling school emergencies which include:

1.A plan for prompt and safe evacuation of students from schools, which shall be practiced monthly in fire drills conducted in accordance with law. In the event of an emergency, local, country or state officials may require that schools be closed to serve as mass-care facilities or to mitigate the spread of infection or illness. Local, country or state officials may also utilize district-owned buses and other transportation vehicles.

The district shall make provisions in the emergency preparedness plan for the continuity of student learning during school closings or excessive absences. Such alternatives may include:

Web-based district instruction.

Telephone trees.

Mailed lessons and assignments.

<u>Instruction via local television or radio stations.</u>

The continuity of core operations such as payroll and ongoing communication with students and parents/guardians shall be an essential part of the emergency preparedness plan.

907. SCHOOL VISITORS

1. Authority

The Board welcomes and encourages visits to school by parents, adult residents and interested educators. To ensure order in the schools, it is necessary for the Board to establish policy governing school visits.

The Board recognizes that some school visits are planned and scheduled, while some are informal. Examples of informal visits may include, but are not be limited to: delivery of school materials or other items to students, visiting with the school nurse, meeting students for early release, or dropping off students for late arrival. Scheduled school visits may include, but are not be limited to: teacher conferences, discipline meetings, IEP team meetings or class observations.

The Board also recognizes that there will be visits to the school during special events such as American Education Week or other specifically designated programs.

To assure that the greatest benefit is derived from each visit and to ensure safe order in the schools and the protection of the rights of students and staff, the following guidelines shall govern all school visits.

Delegation of Responsibility The Superintendent and school principal have the authority to prohibit the entry of any individual to a district school, in accordance with Board guidelines. The School Code provides that the sole responsibility to make regular visits to the various schools of the district and to report to the Board concerning such visits is vested in the district Superintendent. Therefore, the district Superintendent has the authority and responsibility to implement these guidelines.

3. Guidelines

The following guidelines shall govern the presence of visitors in the schools of the district: Superintendent or building principal shall have the authority to permit or deny entry of any person to a school building of this district according to the following guidelines:

1. The Superintendent and/or the school principal has the authority to prohibit the entry of any person to a school of the school district.

1. Reporting To The Office

All visitors must report to the building's main office or to the designated school greeter to register before proceeding to their destination in the building, regardless of whether prior approval for the visit has been given. Picture identification may be requested. All

visitors will be escorted to their destination by a school employee.

2. All visitors must register at the office of the school principal or other authorized area upon arrival.

2. Scheduling Visits

All school visits shall be scheduled ahead of time. Parent-Teacher Organization meetings and building programs where parent/guardians receive written invitations from the building administration are considered scheduled appointments. Exceptions may be made in the case of emergencies at the discretion of an administrative team member, building principal or designee in matters that affect the safety of the students and staff.

3.If the visit is for a parent/guardian or teacher-initiated conference concerning the parent/guardian's child, it must be scheduled in advance with the teacher. Upon arrival at the school, the person(s) visiting the school for such a purpose must register at the office of the school principal or other authorized area, where instructions will be provided, prior to proceeding to the conference site. Upon leaving, visitors must inform a school representative in the office of the school principal or other authorized area, logging out in the same manner as registered. If the visit is for any other purpose, arrangements must be made in advance through the office of the school principal.

3. Interruptions

Visitors may not interrupt any staff member carrying out his/her professional duties. Visitors are not to interrupt a teacher during preparation times or other related instructional duties unless an appointment has been made or other advance notice given according to the guidelines provided herein.

4.Staff members shall be expected to require that a visitor has duly registered at the office of the school principal or other authorized area and received authorization to be present for the purpose of conducting business.

4. Conferences With Teachers

Conferences with teachers are encouraged. Such conferences may be requested by either the parent/guardian, teacher or administrator, as applicable, and should be scheduled during the teacher's preparation time or before or after school. Unscheduled conferences will be allowed at the discretion of the principal and teacher. Conferences shall only be granted to parents and/or legal guardians. During conferences, teachers should not discuss information about a student or his/her progress with visitors other than a parent or legal guardian unless the parent or legal guardian is present.

5.No visitor may confer with a student in school without the prior approval of the school principal or designee and knowledge of the parent/guardian unless the visitor is the student's parent/guardian.

5. Classroom Observations

<u>Classroom observations by parents/guardians, community members or interested</u> <u>educators can be valuable, even though they may disrupt the class. It is believed that parents/guardians, other community members and educators can gain a better sense of</u>

the instructional process by observing teaching and learning activities.

Observations will be considered when the parent or legal guardian submits a request in writing to the principal three (3) school days prior to the visit and receives approval from the principal either verbally or in writing.

The principal will consult with the teacher and subsequently notify the parent or legal guardian by phone to discuss the scope of the visit.

The principal will consider the following factors in the approval process:

- a. The purpose of the observation.
- b. The duration of the observation.
- c. The classroom activities planned during the observation.
- d. The number of previous observations for that particular class.
- e. The needs of the children in that class.

There may be circumstances when an administrator will observe the class with the parent/guardian, if permission to visit is granted.

6.No visitor shall be allowed to photograph or videotape any person or any part of the building or to tape record any conversation of any kind without prior approval by the Superintendent or designee.

6. Discussions of Students

School personnel should not discuss individual students or the performance of those students with any non-school persons except that student's parent/guardian, without the written permission of such parent/guardian. Exceptions to this policy may apply in connection with cooperation with Children and Youth, and law enforcement officials.

7.Parents/Guardians have no right to visit classrooms. Such a right shall only be conferred at the discretion of the Superintendent. The visit of classrooms by persons other than school employees while a class is in progress may lead to disruption of the learning process. Such visits must be specifically approved subject to the preceding and to the following additional guidelines:

7. Non-Parent Attendance At conferences

If a parent or legal guardian wishes to invite another individual to a school meeting regarding his/her child, the district requests that the parent/guardian provide the district with twenty-four (24) hours notice of who they intend to bring. Such notice, while not required, will assist the district in making arrangements for the meeting, such as the amount of space needed or additional information needed, and help ensure a productive, child-centered meeting. Failure to provide such notice may or may not result in the rescheduling of a meeting. School employees may not discuss confidential information

about a student with an advocate unless the student's parents/guardians are present.

If a parent or legal guardian intends to bring an attorney to any school meeting, it is required that they provide the district with at least forty eight (48) hours notice so that the district can consider the need for or arrange the presence of its legal counsel. Failure of a parent/guardian to provide notice of their attorney's presence may or may not result in postponement and rescheduling of a meeting for another time, when the district can arrange for appropriate representation, if needed. Whether to conduct the meeting or reschedule it shall be at the district's discretion and based on the circumstances of the case.

- a. Where the classroom teacher of a student requests that a parent/guardian be allowed to observe a class for a specified period and prior approval is obtained from the school principal.
- b. Where a specified period of observation by a parent/guardian of his/her child or by a recognized professional on behalf of the parent/guardian is approved by the Supervisor of Special Education in conjunction with the school principal as a necessary part of the evaluation of an exceptional or thought to be exceptional student. The purpose of such an observation shall be to observe the child within the specified educational environment, not to observe the educational environment itself.
- 8. Specific limitations for those visiting school buildings and grounds include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - a.Parents/Guardians: The school district realizes that only through contact with parent/guardians can the schools best insure the education of their students. However, parents/guardians, as other outsiders, do not have a right to be in the school any time they desire. Parents/Guardians are urged to contact the school principal and/or teacher, as outlined in this policy prior to visiting the school. A written request for approval must be submitted to the school principal or designee prior to any classroom visit. No such visit shall occur without the approval of the school principal or designee. Visits shall be limited in time at the discretion of the school principal or designee.
 - b.Expelled or Suspended Students: Expelled and/or suspended students have no right to enter upon any school premises in the school district nor to attend any school sponsored activities, including those to which the public has been invited unless prior authorization to do so has been requested of and granted by the Superintendent.
 - c.School-Age Non-District Students: As the function of the school is to educate its students and as non-district students can often be a disruptive influence upon the educational process, school-age non-district students will not be allowed to attend school in the school district.
 - c.Outsiders in General: An outsider can be defined as a non-district student or nonemployee of the school district. Since the school exists to educate children,

outsiders have no inherent right to enter upon school grounds. However, if a school holds an activity, such as a football game or a play to which the public is invited, all outsiders will be permitted to attend with the exception of students under disciplinary action and individuals whom the school, based on past experience, has determined may be disruptive at the school event.

Loitering/Causing Disturbance: Any person who is not a member of the school staff or student body and who loiters on or about any school building or grounds without permission or who causes disturbances may be guilty of loitering and may be prosecuted according to all applicable laws. A person is guilty of loitering when s/he loiters or remains in or about a school building or grounds; not having any reason or relationship involving custody of or responsibility for a student or any other specific, legitimate reason for being there; and not having written permission from anyone authorized to grant the same. Any school authority shall have the right to order all such loiterers or trespassers from any school grounds or building. If refusal occurs, such person will be bound over to the proper legal agency for proper adjudication.

8. Audio, Video Recording Or Photographs

No visitor shall be allowed to photograph, record, audiotape, or videotape any person or any part of any building or to tape record any conversation of any kind without prior approval by the building principal. In general, Special Education Individual Education Plan conferences may be taped with one (1) school day prior notification to the principal and the availability of an administrator to attend the conference. An exception to this policy shall apply in the case of public meetings or work sessions of the Board.

9. Students are not permitted to leave school property without prior permission from office of the school principal. The school principal or designee shall not permit a student to leave school in the custody of anyone other than the person or persons in position of loco parentis or with the written permission of the person or persons in position of loco parentis.

9. Loud, Abrasive And/Or Profane Language Or Behavior

It is the policy of the East Stroudsburg Area School District to prevent disruptions to district operations and the instructional process. All persons, including but not limited to, students, parents/guardians, employees, visitors and members of the general public are prohibited from the use of foul, profane and abusive language, whether spoken or written, or for a tirade in any manner in the school buildings or upon school grounds. If any visitor threatens, verbally abuses, or harasses a school employee, student, or another visitor, a building administrator will direct the visitor to leave the property.

All persons are therefore warned that if a visitor refuses to leave district property voluntarily, s/he will be subject to removal from district property by district security or local law enforcement and may be charged with trespassing for failure to promptly vacate the property upon notice or notification. In all cases, violators will be subject to appropriate laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

10. Students Leaving School Property

Students are not permitted to leave school property without prior permission from the office of the school principal. The school principal or designee shall not permit a student to leave school in the custody of anyone other than the parent/guardian or with the verified written or verbal permission of the parent /guardian.

11. Loitering/Causing Disturbance

Any person who is not a member of the school staff or student body and who loiters on or about any school building or grounds without permission or who causes a disturbance may be guilty of loitering and may be prosecuted according to all applicable laws. A person is guilty of loitering when s/he loiters or remains in or about a school building or grounds; not having any reason or relationship involving custody of or responsibility for a student or any other specific, legitimate reason for being there; and not having written permission from anyone authorized to grant the same. Any school authority shall have the right to order all such loiterers or trespassers from any school grounds or building. If refusal occurs, such person will be bound over to the proper legal agency for proper adjudication.

916. SCHOOL VOLUNTEERS

1. Purpose

The purpose of volunteers in the schools is to augment the educational and support resources available to students through the use of the diverse talents and skills of community members. The Board recognizes that community volunteers can make valuable contributions to the educational program. The use of community volunteers is endorsed by the Board, subject to legal requirements and administrative procedures.

2. Definitions

Volunteer – One who voluntarily offers and provides a service to the school district without receiving compensation. Volunteers can fall into one of three categories, those being single event, short-term or long-term.

Single-Event Volunteer – One who voluntarily provides service to the school district, without compensation, for a single event which will be completed in one (1) to three (3) school days.

Short-Term Volunteer – One who voluntarily provides a service to the school district, without compensation, on an occasional basis not exceeding two (2) weeks in the aggregate during a school term.

Long-Term Volunteer – One who voluntarily provides a service to the school district, without compensation, from time to time throughout the entire school year. Said service does not necessarily have to be performed on consecutive days. The intent, however, is to use a long-term volunteer over an aggregate period of time exceeding two (2) weeks throughout the school year.

3. Authority

The Board authorizes the selection and use of parents, community members, and others as volunteers to assist and supplement regular school district staff.

Under no circumstances shall a volunteer be considered an employee of the school district. A volunteer shall receive no wages or other consideration which has a monetary value for the performance of volunteer services. The volunteer position is not a right, but rather a privilege, which is conferred by the Board and the administration. As such, any volunteer position may be eliminated and/or the services of any volunteer may be terminated at any time at the sole discretion of the responsible school district administrator(s).

SC 111 23 Pa. C.S.A. 6301 et seq

The Board shall approve all long-term volunteers, advisors or any other person(s) who may be reasonably expected to be present with students without a school district employee present. Any such volunteer is required to have an Act 34 Criminal History report, and an Act 151 Clearance Statement and a FBI Federal Criminal History Record on file in the school district office and at the school building office in which s/he is volunteering.

4. Delegation of Responsibility

Single-event and short-term volunteers shall be approved by the school principal. A record of their names and a brief description of the service performed shall be maintained via the visitor logs at the building level for a period of two (2) years. All such services are to be performed under the direction of and in the presence of a school district employee. Volunteers do not assume the responsibilities of school district staff but may, under the direction of the school principal(s) and teachers, provide assistance in an approved and appropriate school level activity such as tutoring, demonstrating, chaperoning, monitoring, speaking, reading and similarly appropriate activities.

Volunteers will not stand in loco parentis status to students and are not legally empowered to regulate student behavior by performing or imposing disciplinary measures.

5. Guidelines

The basic desired qualifications or characteristics for a person offering of volunteer services shall be of interest in the educational program, enjoyment in helping children, and a sincere belief that, by volunteering, a contribution will be made to the learning process. Volunteers shall not be asked to assume the professional responsibilities of the school staff. Volunteers may provide assistance, which is supportive, under the direction of a staff member.

Any school volunteer program which will require additional financial support from the school district budget will require a formal recommendation from the Superintendent and approval by the Board prior to implementation.

Volunteers will not be paid for their volunteer services.

Volunteers are not to have access to or handle any materials of a personal or confidential nature.

As a means of gathering pertinent information, each volunteer will complete a standard application prior to approval. Such applications will be maintained in a school file.

At all times, volunteers are to perform only those duties and/or functions assigned to them by the school principal or, in appropriate cases, the teacher to which they have been temporarily assigned.

To assure the proper use of volunteers in the school district, the following minimal requirements shall apply:

- 1. The school principal shall assume general authority and responsibility over all volunteers serving at that school or site. The principal will also base his/her assignment of volunteers on teacher requests for such assistance. School staff who use(s) volunteers in any capacity shall be responsible for:
 - a. Supervising the dissemination and procurement of volunteer applications and clearances.
 - b. Reviewing volunteer applications and required clearances.
 - c. Maintaining a file of applications and clearances.
 - d. Insuring volunteer intakes are conducted, as appropriate.
 - e. Recruiting and selecting volunteers in accordance with the needs of the school as the principal and staff shall determine, including the number of volunteers providing service in any one area.
 - f. Developing a list of duties which would be performed by volunteers in accordance with the identified needs in his/her school. Such duties must be in accordance with School Laws of Pennsylvania and must not be in conflict with assigned duties of employees of the school district.
 - g. Assigning duties to the volunteers.
 - h. Ensuring any necessary training of said volunteers to perform the specific duties associated with their assignments.
 - i. Terminating the services of any volunteer:
 - 1) Who violates school district policy, school rules, or program guidelines.
 - 2) Whose presence and/or actions are deemed to constitute(s) a danger or threat to the school district, the school, the students, and/or the school's personnel.
 - j. Informing the Superintendent and the Board in a timely manner of the termination of a volunteer.
- 2. Each volunteer will exhibit those behaviors considered appropriate for interaction with school district students, staff, other volunteers and the public while performing school-related functions. These behaviors include, but are not limited to:
 - a. Maintaining a warm, caring, child-centered attitude.
 - b. Respecting the roles of school employees.
 - c. Maintaining confidentiality in all matters pertaining to staff and students arising from the performance of their duties as volunteers and from their presence in the school.
 - d. Following school district policy and school rules, including the directions of the school principal.
- 3. Volunteers shall meet any standards which may be established by federal, state or local government, or by the Board and/or administration. The volunteer must agree to be bound by all applicable privacy laws and regulations. In addition, the volunteer shall adhere to all rules and regulations and administrative guidelines

- 4. Because of their influence as role models, volunteers must refrain from using tobacco, alcohol or controlled substances, or being under the influence of alcohol or controlled substances, when they interact with students during school activities, including those that take place outside of the school building.
- 5. Volunteers will not be permitted to directly administer student discipline nor will they be permitted to administer first aid, except in the case of an emergency.
- 6. No volunteer will be requested or required to transport students in district and/or personal vehicles as part of his/her duties as a volunteer. Volunteers who transport students in personal vehicles are not covered by insurance provided by the school district. Any volunteer so doing assumes any and all liability and any insurance coverage in this situation shall be provided through the volunteer's own insurance carrier.
- 7. Long-term volunteers will undergo a tuberculosis examination, at no cost to the volunteer, administered by a district nurse in accordance with the regulations of the Pennsylvania Department of Health. This examination shall be performed upon a person being placed on the long-term volunteer list.
- 8. Long-term volunteers shall comply with the legally mandated employee requirements and procedures for a criminal history/child abuse report. If, under the pertinent laws or regulations, his/her criminal history/child abuse report would preclude him/her from being hired as an employee, that person may not serve as a volunteer.

Volunteer Coaches

When, in the opinion of the school principal and the Director of Athletics and Activities, the addition of a volunteer coach will enhance the support and training which the regular coaching staff is providing to students participating in the activity, a volunteer coach may be utilized.

The Board hereby sets forth the terms and conditions by which a volunteer coach may be utilized during a competitive extracurricular activity and any training and practices thereof:

- 1. The head coach must forward to the school principal and the Director of Athletics and Activities a request for permission to use a volunteer coach. This request must include the name of the volunteer, name of the extracurricular activity, a rational statement, and a statement of need.
- 2. The school principal and the Director of Athletics and Activities will jointly make a decision to recommend or deny the request. The recommendation will be

sent to the Superintendent for approval by the Board.

- 3. Permission, when granted, is for one (1) season only. The process for approval must be completed each year.
- 4. All volunteer coaches must make formal application through the completion of the *Volunteer Application*.
- 5. All volunteer coaches, prior to their assumption of duties as a volunteer coach, must be approved by the Board. To be approved, the name of the volunteer coach must appear as an agenda line item and be voted upon at a regularly scheduled Board meeting.

- 6. All volunteer coaches, prior to their assumption of the position and/or duties as a volunteer coach, must submit to the district an Act 34 State Police Background Check, and an Act 151 Child Abuse History Clearance, as well as the results of a tuberculin test, and the FBI Federal Criminal History Record.
- 7. A person may not assume the position of volunteer coach, render any services, or assume any responsibility of a volunteer coach until and unless the terms of this policy have been accomplished.
- 8. Permission to utilize a volunteer coach may be revoked at any time by the school principal and/or the Director of Athletics and Activities.
- 9. The head coach will assume responsibility for the actions and training of a volunteer coach.
- 10. A volunteer coach, with the exception of a volunteer who is a school district employee, may not solely direct or supervise a team, a group of students, or an individual student belonging to a team. A head coach and/or assistant coach and/or volunteer who is a school district employee shall be present during all training, practices and/or competitions.

To provide pertinent information regarding the academic performance of the school-district and its schools, the Board shall annually develop and publicly disseminate a school-district report card and report cards for the individual schools, in accordance with federal and state laws and regulations.

The Board, at its discretion, may include additional information not required by law on the school district report card.

- 2. Comparison of above student groups regarding achievement levels on state assessments.
- 3. Percentage of students not tested, disaggregated by student groups.
- 4. Most recent two-year trend data in achievement by subject area and grade level in areas where assessments are required.
- 5. Aggregate data on state indicators to determine Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP), such as attendance rates for elementary schools.
- 6. Graduation rates for high schools, disaggregated by student groups.
- 7. <u>Information on the total number of students to whom the PSSA test was</u> administered who were eligible to take the assessment on the day of the PSSA testing.
- 8. <u>Information on the number of students to whom the PSSA was administered</u> who were classified as Limited English Proficient as of the day the PSSA test was administered.
- 9. <u>Information on the number of students too whom the PSSA test was</u>

administered who were classified as students with a disability as of the day the PSSA test was administered.

- 10. Information on the school district's performance regarding Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) and the number, <u>performance</u> percentages and names of schools identified for improvement, including how long they have been so identified.
- 11. Professional qualifications of teachers and percentage of teachers with emergency or provisional credentials.
- 12. Comparison of school district students' achievements on state assessments to students in the state as a whole.

School Report Cards

School report cards shall contain the following information:

- 1. Same information contained on the school district report card.
- 2. Whether the individual school has been identified for improvement.
- 3. Information that compares the individual school's students' achievement on state assessments and indicators of Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) to students in the school district and the state as a whole.

3. Delegation of Responsibility

The Superintendent shall be responsible to ensure:

- 1. Required information is annually updated and posted.
- 2. School district report card and school report cards are provided to parents in an understandable and uniform format and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand. Where applicable, a translation may be requested by the parent/guardian.
- 3. School district and school report cards are made available to the public through posting on the Internet, and distribution to the media, and distribution to public agencies parents and community via the District newsletter.
- 4. Public access is provided to the state report card and the school profile maintained by the state.



603. BUDGET PREPARATION

1. Purpose SC 687

The Board considers preparation of an annual budget to be one of its most important responsibilities because the budget is the financial reflection of the school district's educational plan. The budget shall be designed to carry out that plan in a thorough comprehensive and efficient manner, to maintain district facilities, and to honor school district obligations.

2. Authority SC 687

The Board recognizes its obligation to the taxpayers to approve only those expenses reasonably required to provide an educational program suitable to the needs and goals of this school district and its students.

The budget should be studied by each Board member during its preparation; but once adopted it deserves the support of all members of the Board.

3. Delegation of Responsibility SC 433, 601, 687 53 P.S. 6926.301 et seq Pol. 604 In order to ensure adequate time for preparation and/or Budget and Finance Committee review of the proposed/preliminary budget, the Board directs the Superintendent and the Business Manager to present to the Board and/or Budget and Finance Committee all available information associated with the budget at least 110 days prior to the primary election.

In preparing the budget, the responsible administrator shall set general priorities for expenditures for:

- 1. Staff necessary to maintain current programs.
- 2. Technology, equipment and supplies necessary to maintain current programs.
- 3. Maintenance of existing facilities and equipment.
- 4. Additional staff necessary for improvement or expansion of current programs.
- 5. New technology, equipment and supplies necessary for improvement or expansion of current programs.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This Agreement is made for the temporary use of a facility designated by Owner for use as a public shelter during a declared or undeclared natural disaster or other condition or event requiring the activation of the disaster relief functions of The American National Red Cross (referred to as an "Emergency"). The parties desire to reach an understanding that will result in providing the facility owned by the Owner to the Red Cross to operate an emergency shelter for the benefit of Owner's community.

1. Owner's Responsibilities.

- (a) Owner has identified the facility, and Red Cross has determined that the facility may be suitable for use as a public shelter, or staging area, or for other purposes in connection with disaster relief operations. (The facility is referred to as the "Shelter"). Upon request by the Red Cross (which may be made orally or in writing) Owner will make the facility available to Red Cross for use as a Shelter.
- (b) Owner will appoint a person to coordinate the Owner's activities (This individual is referred to as the Owner's "Facility Coordinator"). The Facility Coordinator will coordinate the use of the Shelter with the Red Cross's designated official. (The Red Cross official is referred to as the "Shelter Manager"). The Facility Coordinator and the Shelter Manager will collaborate to resolve questions regarding Shelter operations. The Facility Coordinator and the Shelter Manager will jointly conduct a pre-inspection survey of the Shelter before it is turned over to the Red Cross. The pre-inspection survey, attached as Exhibit A, will be used to identify and record any existing damage or conditions. The Facility Coordinator will secure all equipment that is not supposed to be used by the Red Cross in the operation of the Shelter.
- (c) The Facility Coordinator will, on request and if feasible, designate a "Foodservice Manager" to establish a feeding schedule and determine foodservice inventory and supply needs. The Facility Coordinator also will, on request and if feasible, designate a Facility Custodian, to establish and direct the sanitation inventory and supply needs. The Shelter Manager and the Facility Coordinator will jointly coordinate a work schedule for any personnel who are not Red Cross employees, volunteers, or contractors. If it is not feasible for one or both of a Foodservice Manager or a Facility Custodian to be designated by the Facility Coordinator, the Facility Coordinator will inform the Shelter Manager, who may obtain such services by contract.
- (d) At the direction of and in cooperation with the Shelter Manager, the Foodservice Manager will provide the food and supplies needed for meals at the Shelter site. If, in the opinion of the Shelter Manager, additional food or supplies are needed, the Shelter Manager will coordinate the procurement of the additional food or supplies. Red Cross will pay or reimburse Owner for all food and supplies as approved by the Shelter Manager and used in the course of operating the Shelter.
- (e) The Facility Custodian will provide sanitation services and supplies for custodial care at the Shelter as directed by the Shelter Manager. The Facility Coordinator or Facility Custodian will order and provide all additional sanitation and custodial supplies and services as shall be determined by the Shelter Manager. Red Cross will pay or reimburse Owner for all sanitation supplies as approved by the Shelter Manager and used in the course of operating the Shelter.
- (f) Red Cross is not responsible for police or public safety at the Shelter. Any private security services that are to be the responsibility of Red Cross must be arranged under a separate agreement. Shelter population shall be exclusively the role of Red Cross. Owner shall not distribute or reveal any information concerning occupants of a Shelter without the express written consent of the Shelter Manager. No press releases or other information shall be disseminated without the express written consent of the Shelter Manager. Owner will refer all media questions related to the Shelter to the Shelter Manager.
- (g) Within thirty (30) days after the close of a Shelter, the Facilities Coordinator shall submit to the Red Cross all invoices to the address above. Invoice backup must include a list of the Shelter operations personnel and hours worked at the Shelter, and details on any materials or goods used or consumed.

2. Red Cross's Obligations.

(a) The Red Cross Shelter Manager has primary responsibility for the operation of the Shelter. Red Cross will provide additional Red Cross staff and volunteers to carry out the activities of the Shelter. Red Cross will post signs identifying the Shelter. Red Cross will remove all Red Cross signs when the Shelter is closed. Red Cross and all of its agents, and employees, and volunteers will exercise reasonable care in the operation of any Shelter.

- (b) Storm damage or other damage caused by the Emergency is not the responsibility of Red Cross. Red Cross reimburses personnel costs at actual current per hour straight time rate for instruction, custodial, maintenance, and food service. Red Cross will reimburse Owner for the reasonable actual out-of-pocket costs and expenses for operational expenses, including the replacement of food, supplies, equipment. Property damaged, lost or stolen due to the negligence of Red Cross will be compensated based on depreciated actual cash value. Reimbursement for any extraordinary or capital expenses (including without limitation painting, carpeting, wiring, and structural work) will be limited to replacement at actual cash value of the property. In such cases, Red Cross will select from among bids from at least three reputable contractors.
- (c) Red Cross will notify the Owner or Facilities Coordinator of the closing schedule for the Shelter. After the Shelter has been closed, the Facility Coordinator and the Shelter Manager will conduct a post-disaster facilities survey to ensure that the Shelter is returned to the Owner in the same condition as it was when it was opened, ordinary wear and tear excepted. Thank you for meeting with us today to discuss the possibility of creating more youth baseball/softball fields for the children of the school district. While the increased utilization of the existing fields on school and township property is creating a challenge, it is the type of challenge we are happy to face since it means more of our youth are involved in positive activities.

The East Stroudsburg Area School District and Lehman Township have enjoyed a mutually beneficial relationship throughout the years and we look forward to continuing that relationship well into the future. In the past the Township has contributed approximately \$6,000 for playground equipment for the elementary school. We have also waived various fees for land development plans that have taken place at the North Campus as well as the bus depot. The Township also makes an annual contribution to the DARE program at the Bushkill Elementary School and participates in the DARE graduation.

Going forward, we are looking to work with the School District to develop and maintain two baseball fields located behind the Bushkill Elementary School. The Township, with the support of the East Stroudsburg North Little League and the Bushkill Youth Association (BYA), would provide materials, equipment and manpower required to develop a field with 60 foot base paths suitable for younger players (up to twelve years of age) and a field with 90 foot base paths for older children. Skelly and Loy, Inc. appreciates your consideration of our professional consulting services and is pleased to respond to your request for a Technical and Bid Proposal to provide hydrogeologic services that can be used to evaluate potential water level impacts from testing an existing supply well at the East Stroudsburg Area School District's (ESASD) Middle Smithfield Elementary School. This proposal focuses on completing the tasks necessary to perform a pumping test to ensure that the existing well is adequate to meet the increased potable water demand that will result from the planned expansion of the school facility (exceeding 10,000 gallons per day [gpd]).

We understand that, although the existing well has been in continuous use since the 1920's, the Township requires a hydrogeologic study to address concerns related to potential adverse impacts to existing residential wells, surface water bodies, and wetlands within one-half mile of the school (well). We also understand that the hydrogeologic evaluation must include monitoring nearby residential wells and surface water bodies located within one-half mile of the school's well as required by Township Ordinance No. 200-366 (Middle Smithfield Code).

PURPOSE AND SCOPE

This letter proposal briefly describes the Scope of Work and costs to provide the requested hydrogeologic services for compliance with Ordinance No. 200-366. Based on our review of the copy of the Ordinance you provided, our Scope of Work will include the following elements.

Review of the school's metered water usage documentation for some period to be determined to establish daily, weekly, and monthly averages needed to verify the total average groundwater usage after build-out will exceed 10,000 gpd over a 30-day period. This information will be tabulated and provided to the Township to confirm or deny the true

need for completing the remaining work items (i.e., the Hydrogeologic Evaluation) outlined in this Scope of Work. We understand that, in the event that the total usage is less than 10,000 gpd, the remaining elements of the Hydrogeologic Evaluation will not be required and payment will be made to Skelly and Loy for only those costs incurred to prepare and submit the above water usage documentation.

- Providing all equipment and supplies necessary to monitor the water levels in designated wetlands, streams, and the pumping (supply) well.
- Collection, tabulation, and graphing of water level data collected from each monitoring point to determine the potential for negative impacts (e.g., excessive drawdown) due to pumping the school's supply well (Herbert, Rowland, and Grubic [HRG] will designate the pumping rate of the pumping well during the testing period).
- Mapping suitable for identifying the site location in relation to nearby waterways, lakes, surface water bodies, wetlands, and major roads.
- Analysis of the pumping test and groundwater withdrawal on other groundwater users, waterways, lakes, surface water bodies, and wetlands within a one-half mile radius of the project.
- Evaluation of any observed water level impacts in consideration of below-normal recharge or drought conditions.
- Construction and installation of two shallow wetland piezometers and two in-stream stilling well gauges that will be used for installing electronic data loggers to identify any water level impact to these surface water features.
- Completion of one constant-rate pumping test at a rate to be designated by HRG for a maximum period of 48 hours to determine the extent of any impacts to residential wells or other surface water body features.
- Continuous precipitation monitoring will be completed during the testing period using an electronic recording gauge installed on-site for use in recording local rainfall data specific to the project area during the background (pre-test) monitoring period, during active pumping, and for a short time after active testing to assess the impact of rainfall events on water level recovery in the monitoring points.
- Installation of 12 electronic data loggers will be necessary to monitor the potential for water level impacts in nearby Pond Creek: 1 north and across Route 209, 1 at the pumping well, 2 at nearby wetlands, 1 at a nearby unnamed lake, and 7 at residential supply wells. Available mapping indicates that a minimum of 12 features/wells will need to be monitored

in order to evaluate potential impacts within 2,500 feet (one-half mile) of the Middle Smithfield School project area.

All data generated during the background monitoring and active aquifer testing phases of the work will be compiled into a report that will briefly summarize all project activities. This report will be prepared in a format suitable for submission to HRG, ESASD, and Middle Smithfield Township (as required by the Middle Smithfield Code). Documentation of all water level data, pumping rate, dates and times of measurements, and weather conditions will be provided as part of the final report. Individual plots of the water level data collected from each monitoring location will be provided along with a table of the recorded water level changes (e.g., drawdown or recharge) during the pumping test. While Skelly and Loy would prefer to provide a comprehensive plot of all data collected, this service requires additional manipulation of the data collected and cannot be offered as part of our response to this bid opportunity. Should HRG, ESASD, or the Township prefer to have the data presented using a comprehensive graphical format as an aid in their review of specific data anomalies that may be of concern, Skelly and Loy would be happy to provide a Change Order Request to provide this service at an additional cost.

ASSUMPTIONS

- All field efforts and preparation of a final report will be performed under the direct supervision of a Pennsylvania-licensed Professional Geologist (PG).
- Any required water quality sample testing and analysis will be the responsibility of HRG unless provisions are made for Skelly and Loy to perform the field sampling and laboratory analysis prior to initiating the pumping test. Skelly and Loy will be happy to provide a cost estimate to complete sample collection and testing based on requirements developed by HRG, ESASD, and/or the Middle Smithfield School.
- All pumping equipment, electric power/wiring, flow control/valving devices, and required water storage or handling appurtenances will be provided by HRG and/or the Middle Smithfield School (ESASD).
- Permitting services to prepare a withdrawal, wetland construction, or potable water supply permit that may ultimately be required by various regulatory authorities such as the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PA DEP) or Delaware River Basin Commission (DRBC) are not included with this bid proposal. Skelly and Loy can provide such services, if required, for an additional cost.
- The names and contact information for the owners of all accessible residential wells within one-half mile of the project will be provided to Skelly and Loy to facilitate coordination, scheduling, and installation of the electronic data loggers. Any additional out-of-scope

project management or field labor required to gain necessary approvals for access to residential well locations can be completed for an additional cost.

- Where residential wells are found to be inaccessible due to problems gaining required approval from the owner or physical access limitations, reasonable efforts will be made to utilize nearby alternate residential well locations as deemed appropriate by Skelly and Loy. Project delays resulting in additional field or project management labor to resolve these issues can be completed by Skelly and Loy at an additional cost not included with this bid proposal.
- Skelly and Loy will provide notification to the Township and the PA DEP that pumping test discharge will be routed directly to a nearby drainage swale where it will drain to a stormwater basin or stream via discharge piping not to exceed a total length of 500 feet. Should Township or state regulators require additional handling of the pump discharge beyond the 500-foot length or should additional discharge piping be needed to reach a suitable discharge location in addition to or beyond the 500-foot discharge line (provided by Skelly and Loy), Skelly and Loy will submit a Change Order Request to include additional labor or equipment costs required to comply with such directives.
- Additional or unanticipated equipment, expenses, documentation, regulatory requirements, or environmental conditions beyond the above-outlined Scope of Work that could not have been reasonably foreseen will require submission of a Change Order Request and approval of the request by HRG prior to completion of any additional out-of-scope services.

COSTS AND SCHEDULING

Upon our receipt of your notification to proceed and signed copies of Skelly and Loy's "Standard Terms and Conditions," we will begin the work based on a review of our workload at that time and availability of key staff who will be assigned to the project. We anticipate that we will be able to begin the pumping test phase of the project within two weeks of HRG's award of the contract. Approximately 1½ weeks will be needed to install the necessary instrumentation, run the 48-hour pumping test, download the collected data, and remove all field instrumentation. After retrieval of the collected field data, we anticipate that the report documenting these field activities and providing an analysis and interpretation of the data can be prepared for submission to the Township within four to six weeks. A four-week timeframe will likely be required to prepare the data in the event that impact is negligible. A six-week reporting timeframe assumes that more time is needed to interpret a more complex data set resulting from numerous observations of water level impacts.

At your request, the cost included with this bid proposal is provided on a *lump sum* basis and in accordance with the enclosed "Standard Terms and Conditions" which will govern our efforts on your behalf. The total *lump sum* cost to perform this work as outlined above is \$25,700.00 and will not exceed this amount without prior approval from HRG. This bid proposal is inclusive of all



Arch acknowledges receipt of your letter of August 8, 2007 on behalf of East Stroudsburg Area School District.

I have been in contact with Jim Lagana and will be meeting with him in Hazleton on Monday, August 13, 2007 to discuss the issues you raised in your letter. Arch has received the original Affidavit of Claim from Attorney John Prevoznik counsel for K & E Fire Protection, Inc. (K & E) and has begun its investigation into the claim. Our understanding is that K & E failed to submit certain required drawings to Lagana on a timely basis causing delays to Lagana. In addition the drawings were not correct and had to be resubmitted by K & E. Lagana eventually terminated the contract of K & E. The claim by K & E is the only claim of alleged non-payment by Lagana of which Arch is aware. Your letter refers to numerous complaints from subcontractors (of Lagana?) about work and payment delays. To assist us in our investigation we would appreciate if you would let us know when and with whom you or the representatives of East Stroudsburg Area School District spoke - the source of the complaints. At the job meetings which I attended on behalf of Arch I indicated to Reynolds that if they were contacted by someone alleging that they had not been paid by Lagana that they should refer the party to Lagana or to Arch. To date Arch has not been contacted by anyone on an issue of alleged non-payment by Lagana other than K & E.

You also indicated that it is your understanding that Lagana has not paid union benefits and that this alleged non-payment by Lagana has resulted in the recent loss of men on the job. To assist us in our investigation we would appreciate if you would let us know with whom you spoke - the source of such information. It is our understanding that Lagana is current with Local 524 and we will be speaking to the Business Agent for that Local on Monday to confirm that. To date Arch has not received any notice from the Local indicating that Lagana is delinquent.

Once we meet with Lagana on Monday we will be in contact with you.

This correspondence and all prior or subsequent communications and/or investigative efforts are made with the express reservation of all rights and defenses which Arch Insurance Company or our principal has or may have at law, equity or under the terms and provisions of the bond and contract documents. ATTORNEY-CLIENT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, dated as of August 14, 2007, is made between Rhoads & Sinon LLP ("R&S") and the East Stroudsburg Area School District ("Client") to set forth the terms of the engagement of R&S to provide legal services to Client.

- 1. <u>Scope of Services</u>. Client is engaging R&S to serve as special construction counsel with respect to issues arising out of the District's Senior High School Project. In the absence of a mutual written agreement to the contrary, this Agreement automatically will govern any other or future services R&S may render on behalf of Client.
- R&S's Duties. R&S will provide such legal services as reasonably may be required to represent Client in connection with the matters for which R&S is specifically engaged, including those identified above. With respect to those matters, R&S will endeavor to represent Client in a professional manner and to respond to Client's inquiries. Lawyers, law clerks and legal assistants may participate in rendering services for Client as R&S considers appropriate. R&S is not agreeing to represent Client on any matter other than the matter specifically identified herein. R&S's acceptance of representation of Client on any other matter shall be within the sole discretion of R&S.
- 3. <u>Client's Duties</u>. Client agrees to keep R&S informed regarding all matters which are the subject of this Agreement. Client agrees to cooperate fully and timely with R&S and to participate as requested in all proceedings related to representation by R&S of Client. Client also agrees to ensure that R&S is provided with any information, documents or other materials within Client's possession or control that may bear on the matters for which R&S is retained. Client further agrees to pay R&S's bills as provided below and comply with the other provisions of this Agreement.
- 4. Fees. R&S's base fees shall be based primarily on the time spent by attorneys, legal assistants and other personnel on behalf of Client at R&S's then current billing rates, and includes travel time. With respect to R&S's base fees, Client agrees to pay R&S at R&S's then current hourly rates. These rates currently range generally from \$220 to \$300 per hour for partners, from \$150 to \$220 per hour for associate attorneys, \$100 for law clerks, and \$110 to \$150 for legal assistants. The hourly rate for the undersigned on this matter is currently set at \$260. Individual rates of R&S's attorneys are based on their years of professional experience, specialization, and level of professional attainment and accordingly receive automatic annual adjustments. R&S's overall billing rate structure is reviewed by the Firm's Executive Committee on an annual basis. From time to time, it may be adjusted to take into account increased experience, costs and other factors. Upon request R&S will provide Client at any time with specific information concerning any individual's billing rate or R&S's current rate structure. R&S may, under this Agreement, change or adjust the individual or overall billing rates at which it provides services to Client. However, should R&S's overall billing rate structure be materially changed, R&S will provide Client with written notice of the new structure and its effective date.

5. <u>Costs and Other Charges.</u>

- In General. R&S will incur various costs and expenses in performing legal services under this Agreement. Client agrees to pay those costs and expenses in addition to billed fees. Costs and expenses commonly include filing fees, court reporters' fees, long-distance and local toll calls, telephone charges, outgoing facsimile charges, messenger and delivery charges, postage, travel expenses, printing and reproduction costs, secretarial overtime charges, charges for online computer research and other similar vendor charges. The amount charged by any outside vendor is determined by the vendor of those services. Internally-generated charges are determined by R&S in its discretion. R&S may advance money to pay invoices of outside vendors if it would be cumbersome or impractical to forward the invoice to Client for direct payment or the amount is small. Any such advances will be included in R&S's bill to Client and shall be reimbursed by Client. On matters requiring sizable disbursements to vendors, typically involving \$200 or more, R&S generally forwards the bill directly to Client for payment. Client agrees to pay any such bills promptly.
- b. Out of Town Travel. Client agrees to pay transportation, meals, lodging and other necessary costs of any out of town travel by R&S's personnel resulting from R&S's representation of Client.
- c. Experts, Consultants and Investigators. Should it become necessary for R&S, in representing Client, to retain consultants, experts or investigators, Client agrees to pay all fees and charges of such persons on a timely basis. No expert, consultant or investigator shall be retained without Client's advance approval.
- 6. <u>Billing Statements</u>. R&S will send Client periodic statements for fees and costs incurred, usually on a monthly basis. <u>Each statement is due on receipt of our invoice</u>. Client agrees to pay a late charge of 1% per month on amounts not paid within thirty days from the statement date. This rate may be changed upon 30 days prior written notice from R&S to Client. If any bill remains unpaid after thirty days without our written consent or if any advance is not paid as required by this Agreement, the approval of R&S's Executive Committee may be required before further work will be performed, and Client agrees that under such circumstances R&S may cease work on Client's behalf. Client agrees promptly to notify R&S in writing if Client has any questions or comments regarding any statement, or if Client disputes any aspect of any statement. Client and R&S agree to endeavor in good faith to resolve the matter expeditiously.
- 7. Method of Communication. We will endeavor to keep you informed of significant developments and to consult with you about our work on an ongoing basis. If there are particular limitations on how you would like us to communicate with you, please advise us in advance about your preferences. For example, some modes of communication, such as faxes or emails, may not be convenient for some clients or present greater risks of interception or misdelivery than other modes.

8. <u>Discharge and Withdrawal</u>.

- a. <u>Discharge by Client</u>. Any client may discharge R&S at any time by written notice to R&S.
- b. Withdrawal by R&S. R&S may withdraw at any time except to the extent it is explicitly precluded from doing so by the Pennsylvania Rules of Professional Conduct or by a tribunal before which a matter is pending. Client acknowledges that under the Rules of Professional Conduct, R&S may withdraw without a client's consent under a variety of circumstances, including without limitation, breach of a client's obligation to pay fees, costs and expenses. When R&S's services are concluded, regardless of the reason therefor, all unpaid charges will immediately become due and payable.
- c. <u>Client Files</u>. R&S will, on Client's request, deliver Client's file (excluding attorney work product material) to Client or as otherwise directed by Client, along with any of Client's funds or property in R&S's possession. Unless returned, R&S will retain each of Client's files for a minimum of two years after a matter is completed and its file is closed. Client agrees that if it desires any of its files, or the contents thereof, to be retained for longer than two years or delivered to it, it will make that request in writing to R&S within such two-year period.
- 9. Opinions as to Outcome. The outcome of legal representation is typically uncertain. Accordingly, nothing in this Agreement, and nothing in any other written or oral statement now or hereafter made by any R&S representative to Client, shall constitute a promise or guarantee about the outcome of any matter or about possible adverse consequences arising from claims, counterclaims or appeals, whether initiated by the Client or an adverse party.
- 10. Estimates of Fees, Costs and Expenses. R&S recognizes that from time to time in connection with a client's financial planning it may be helpful to a client to obtain R&S's guidance in estimating the anticipated cost of future legal services. 


